

Eleventh Annual Report to the
American Association of Avian Pathologists
Year Ending April 30, 1968

Records at completion of the first year of the second decade of the organization show a continually growing membership, expanding activities, satisfactory net income and substantial financial reserves - a base highly favorable to future improvement, development and growth.

Membership numbers have increased from 384 to 409, including 31 associate members and two honorary members. Fifteen members were lost by death, resignation or non-payment of dues.

Circulation gains continue to be shown chiefly in foreign sales with issues now mailed to approximately 64 foreign nations. The attached financial report shows a very satisfactory net gain although the increase in disbursements has not been matched by a comparable increase in income. It is suggested that an assistant to the business manager of Avian Diseases be appointed by the Board to act as advertising manager and as future successor to the office of business manager - secretary-treasurer.

The diligent efforts of many members, but particularly of the committees, editors and officers as well as the AAAP appointed Poultry Section officers have resulted in another highly productive year which should be most pleasing to all members.
