IMPROVED SINGLE MILL WITH EXTRA GRINDING RINGS.

In calling your attention to the "IMPROVED SINGLE MILL," we will enumerate some of the advantages it possesses over all other similar Mills, viz.: the Cones are cast in ring sections, with three strong flanges encircling the entire cone, thus increasing its strength very materially. This arrangement not only renders the Mill less liable to break, but makes it less expensive to repair in case any part should break or wear out, as no one piece in the entire Mill weighs over forty pounds. A new set of fine grinding rings can be had for \$3.00, making it equal to a new mill. The rings can be put on by any common hand; another is that the inner or revolving cone has a centre bearing both top and bottom, it resting on a stationary bridgetree at bottom, which serves to keep the cones equidistant apart under all circumstances, thus enabling it to grind fine meal from shelled corn, or corn and cob, or corn and oats for stock feed, with a degree of ease and uniformity never before attained.

The improved Single Mill will grind from 8 to 12 bushels per hour, with one horse, and are warranted to give satisfaction.
