I take pleasure in stating that for lightness of draft and ease in handling, it exceeds any plow that I have ever seen. With this plow a land can be completely finished, better even than with a walking plow. The plow being guided by two inclined wheels, one in front and one in the rear of the plow, causes it to run straight, no matter if the team sway from side to side. The entire weight of the furrow appears to be carried on the wheels, and the bottom of the furrow does not look as though there was any friction. I had tested the plow in very tough sod, and it appears all right.
