FOR

THE MONITOR RAKE.

1st. Its compact construction—making it the strongest rake built.

2d. All hangers, hinges and important parts made from the best refined wrought-iron, using no cast-iron in the construction of these parts.

3d. The peculiar adjustment of the teeth (which no other rake has), thus enabling the operator to raise or lower them within a limit of $9\frac{1}{4}$ inches, and also enabling the rake to be used for gleaning.

4th. The teeth are all tempered in oil, and tested to 20 inches.

5th. The dogs are made from the best cast-steel.

6th. The axle is made from the best wrought-iron, double-rolled, and is formed like a carriage axle, thus making it run very easily.

N. B.—Be particular, in setting up the rake, to see that the bent part of axle is down—not up.

7th. The wheel is the strongest ever used in a rake; spokes, $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches, and all tested.

8th. Can be thrown in gear with less power than any self-dump rake in the market; two-ounce pressure on the foot-lever will dump it.

Do not fail to examine it. The seasons of 1880 and '81 proved in the field that it has no equal in cleanliness of work, durability and simplicity. It is constructed from the best white ash and oak, each piece being well tested. It is finished on the native wood, neatly striped and ornamented.
