Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter 14th inst just received, please give us the style of your Hoosier One Row Corn Drill, Hoe, Shoe or Disk as per cuts enclosed.

We can supply any repair parts wanted for this machine. Price of the chain is 20¢ per foot. Price of a seed plate is \$1.00. The parts can be sent by parcel post for about 25¢.

You understand the seed or dial plate on this machine revolves all the time, and must nicely chamber one grain of seed, therefore in supplying special dial plates for small seed we should know what size hole to put in the plate. Possibly you refer to the small casting known as Cane or Sorghum Seed Attachment which turns in the discharge opening to cut off the flow of seed. If you mean a regular seed or dial plate for sowing small seeds to take the place of the corn plate, you had better tell us just what kind of seeds and how you want to plant same, so we will know how many holes, and what size to put in the special plate.
