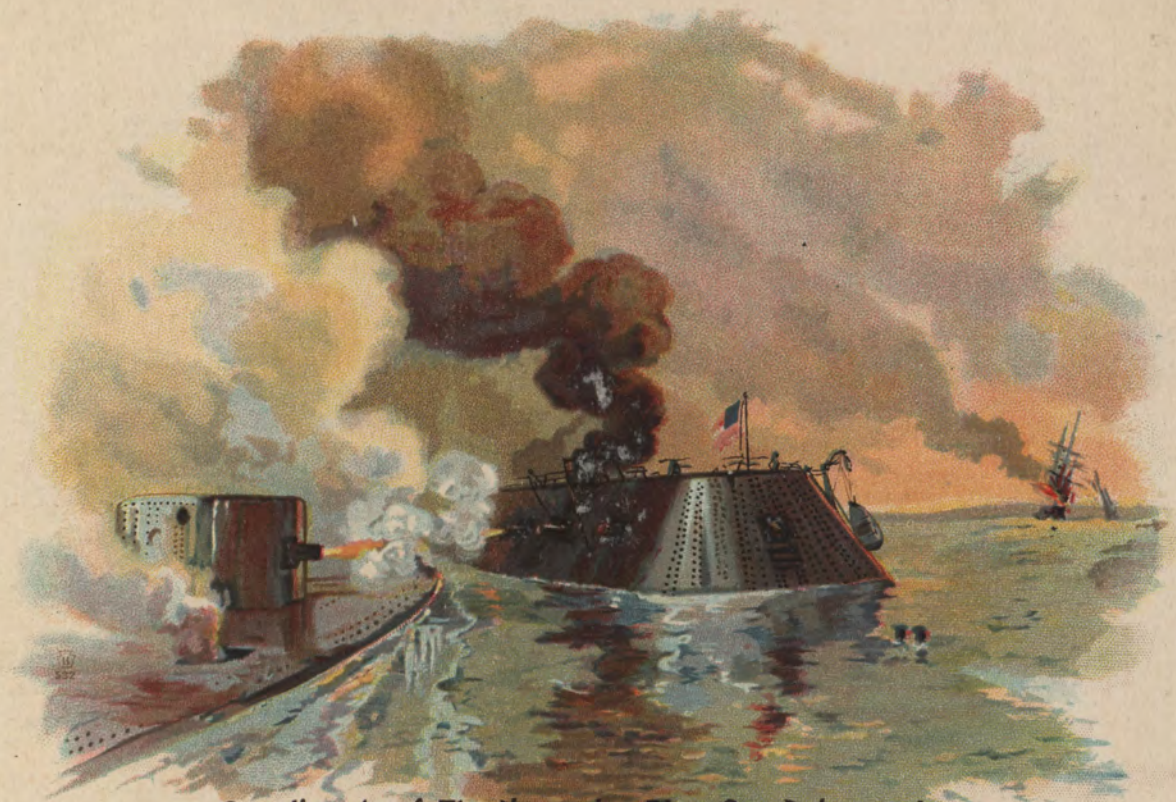

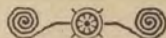


NORWEGIAN PARALLEL BAR CULTIVATOR.

THE MONITOR AND MERRIMAC—MARCH 9, 1862.

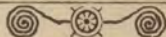

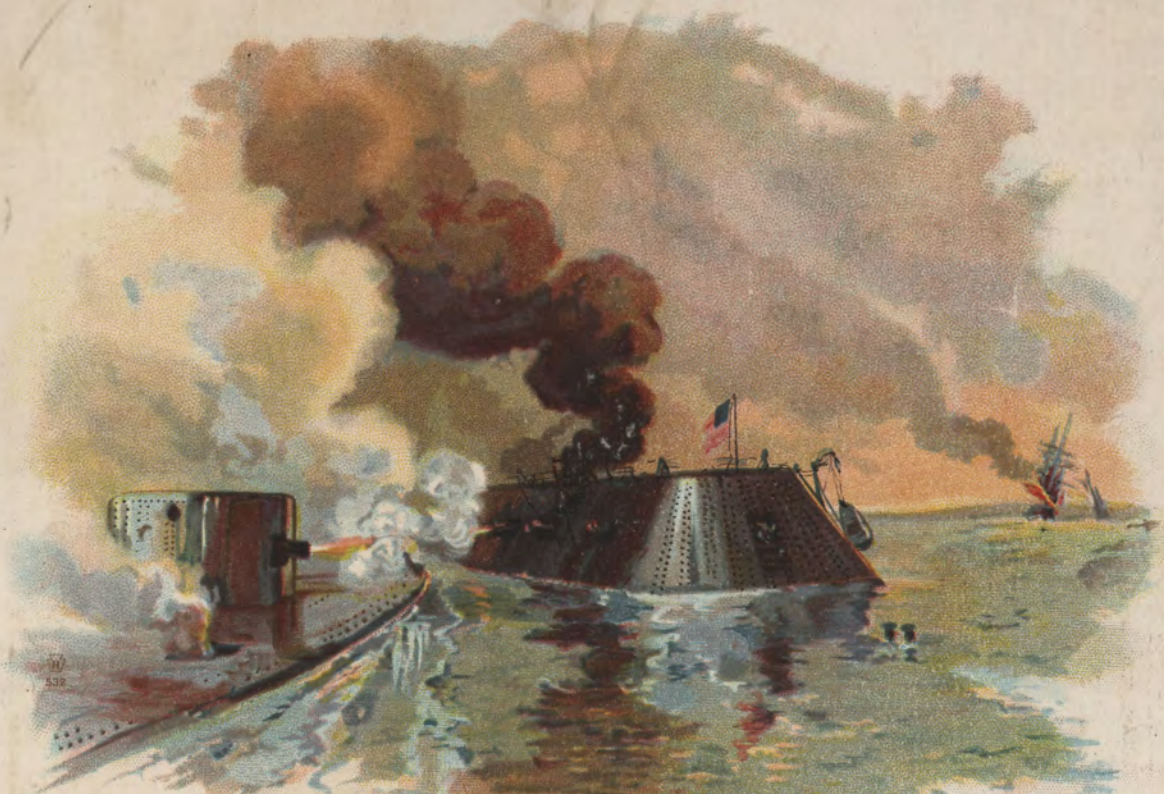
