We have all the different movements and changes that can be made on the ordinary hand Plow, perfected on this machine, and *we claim to do better work than can possibly be done by hand, without increasing the draft or making any harder work for the team.*

We claim to do *one-third* more work in the same length of time, and that successfully in stony, rough or uneven ground, (cradle knolls not excepted) with *any Plow*, wood or iron beam.

In addition to the above working qualities of the Ithaca Plow Sulky, it is so arranged that *any boy* who is large enough to drive a team, or an *aged man* not able to do a full or even half a day's work at ordinary farm labor, *can plow more in a day, and do better work* than the best man on the farm can do with a good team and any hand plow made.

After the Plow is attached to the Sulky and properly set to cut the right width and depth, one can do a full day's work without bothering with levers or lifting and tugging to raise the Plow out of the ground in turning. A slight pressure with the foot applies the *Tortion Clutch* to the wheel and the forward movement of same does all the work, leaving the hands entirely free to manage the team, *a vital point* in favor of plowing with a Sulky that *no other* Plow Sulky or Sulky Plow has, and readily appreciated by any one familiar with Sulkies.

It is more economical for the farmer to buy the Ithaca Plow Sulky than to buy a Sulky Plow, from the fact that there is hardly a farm but what has a variety of soils and needs Plows especially adapted for the different fields. In the Sulky Plow they are especially adapted for same and can use no other.
