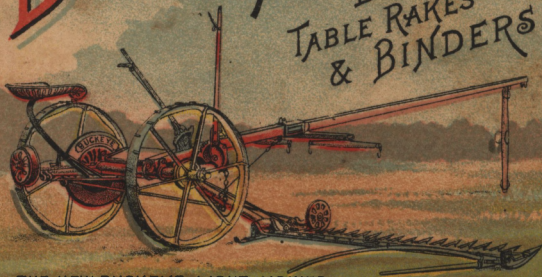

Buckeye Light Mower.



THE BUCKEYE MOWER has been a standard article of farm machinery for thirty years. During that time Mowers have been built with nearly every conceivable form of gearing. Competing manufacturers have radically changed the construction of their machines from year to year, because they were forced to get something different from their last year's machine. The Buckeye alone has remained for thirty years unchanged in the essential features of its mechanism, for the reason that, being based on correct mechanical principles, it has required no change. And it is safe to say, that so long as grass grows, and is cut for hay, so long Buckeye Mowers will be built in substantially their present form.

Beware of cheaply built machines. They will prove in the end to be worth even less than the ridiculously low prices at which they are offered. We have just passed through a period of low prices. The bottom was reached in 1886, and prices of material have already advanced from 15 to 30 per cent. This must result in higher prices of machinery. Machines built with material at present prices and sold at the extraordinary prices of last year will be sold at a loss, unless the maker takes the "Cheap John" order and worth even less than the cost of the material in them.
