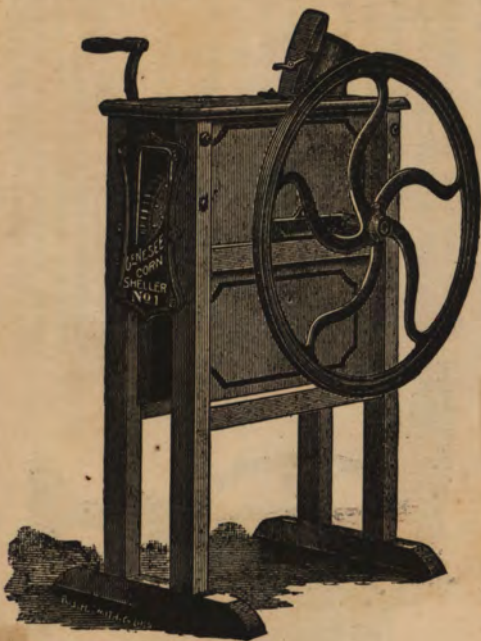

No. 1, Single Spout.

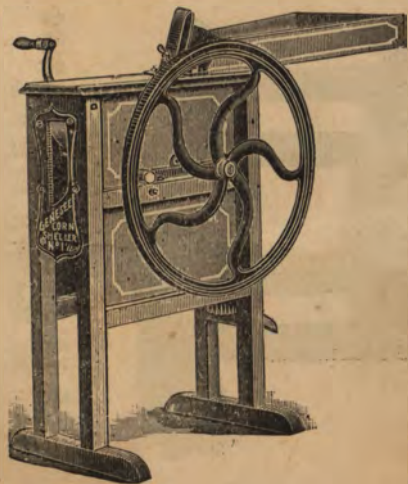

THE GENESEE CORN SHELLER.

THIS machine has no superior, and has taken first premium at all fairs where exhibited. Is so adjusted by springs as to adapt itself to large or small ears of corn. Runs very easily. Built of best material. Gearing so constructed that you cannot get your hands injured. Boxes are solid, avoiding the loosening of bolts in frame, or allowing the gearing to get out of line, or cogs to slip. When preparing to shell, loosen springs by means of thumb nut as much as they will bear and shell clean.

No. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ has single spout, sieve and tray; cleans for market.

No. 2 has castors so that when tilted back one person can move it to any part of the building. Has *double spout*, with shaker and tray, and cleans ready for market. Can be worked by hand or power. Shaker in front so that the delivery of the corn and cobs are in sight of the operator.
