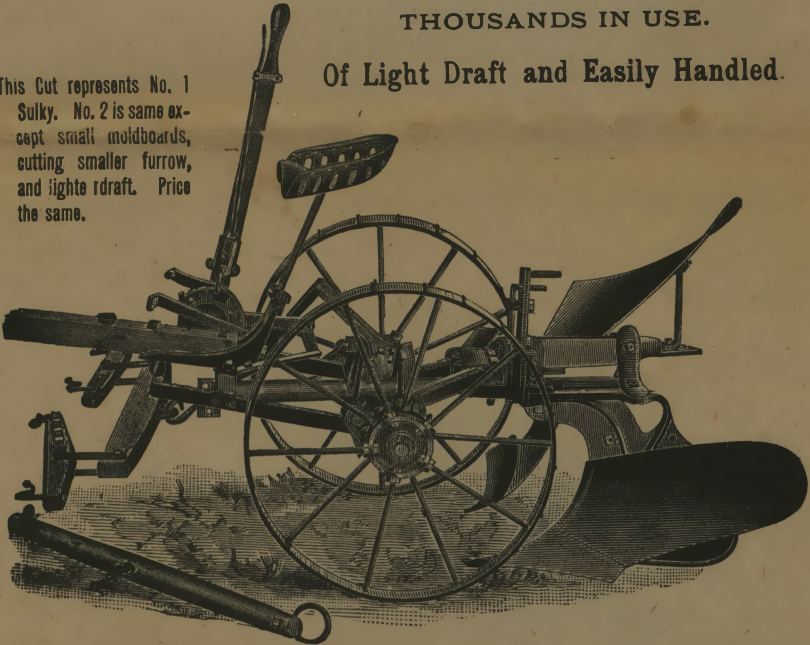

National Reversible Sulky Plow.

This plow is not an experiment, having been placed upon the market several years since, in which time there have been several thousand sold. Unlike all other makes of Riding Plows, the National has been especially designed to meet the wants of all farmers, and succeeds not only upon level farms, leaving them without tracks or dead furrows, but is equally adapted to stony, rough sidehill farms, turning the land with the slope, and not up the hill as is the case with all one-way Sulky Plows.

We believe the National to be the *only Sulky Plow* in the world that can justly lay claim to being a success for all kinds of work and in all varieties of soil.

CONSTRUCTION.

As shown in the cut a Right and Left Steel Flat-land Plow is mounted upon a Steel Beam, one being at right angles with the other, and easily revolved by unlocking a Hand Lever at the rear of the driver, the weight of the upper plow causing the lower to rise. In this way a furrow may be turned either to the right or left, so that the lands are left level without dead furrows. Each plow has an easy adjustment to make it cut a wide or narrow furrow, and is raised out of the ground by a perfect working *Power Lift*, and set in again by a Foot Lever, so that the operator has both hands with which to manage his team. This operation is so easy that *any boy or girl* that can manage a team can use the plow. With the Adjustable Seat the operator always sits in a level position, and on the uppermost side in plowing steep sidehill land, preventing the plow from tipping.

With the Hand Lever that is turned backward the Power Lift can be operated by the driver when walking.

Either Plow can be detached from the Sulky, and fitted with beam and handles, thus making *two perfect flat-land Plows*. We furnish Beam, Wheel, Clevis, and Handles for \$5.00.

DRAFT.

The National Sulky Plow having a perfectly independent motion either up or down or laterally, when rightly attached to the team and adjusted, *the sulky always carries the plow*, not the plow the sulky, except in case of very hard land when it is desired the weight should be thrown upon the plow to hold the same more firmly to the ground. This, of course, helps greatly to solve to parties unacquainted with the National, the vexed question of whether a sulky can be made to draw lighter than a hand plow, as it will readily be seen that if the weight of the plow is carried by the sulky in place of being dragged through the ground, the friction on the base must necessarily be decreased and the draft much lessened. So that we confidently claim that in doing the same amount of work *the National will draw lighter than a hand plow*.

The new pattern wheel is made with the ends of the spokes upset, shaped and fitted to the inside of the rim and held with countersunk head bolts through the rim. This construction prevents the rim from springing in and breaking the spokes when doing heavy work, and is *fully warranted*. The new spokes can be used in repairing old wheels.

STRENGTH AND DURABILITY.

Several years of careful attention to the working of this plow in the field, and the immediate alteration of any faults in its construction, together with the use of none but the best of material, has enabled us to offer the farmer a perfect plow, and well adapted to the rough farms in New England. Our success in the past, and notably the last season, shows us that our labor has not been in vain, and it is a pleasure to state that of the numbers of plows sent out as now improved we have failed to receive any but the most satisfactory reports.

So that not only we claim that we have in the National *the only perfect Sulky Plow* adapted for use on sidehill or level lands, but that its simplicity of construction, and ease of handling, will enable any boy or girl capable of managing a team to plow hard sidehill or level lands with better results than the same fields can be plowed with walking plows in the hands of an expert operator.

Gentlemen:—Having received a wound in my back from a bullet in the Civil War, I was rendered unable to do hard work, but being without a hired man in the spring of 1897, I started plowing one of my rough stony fields with a hand plow, but I could not plow more than three furrows around it before I gave out, and I was laid up for over a week with my back. Then I went and bought one of your National Sulky Plows and went to plowing, and I have done, since then, all the plowing on my farm, which carries 25 head of stock.

We use our plow anywhere and everywhere, in wet, boggy meadows and on the dry, stony hillsides, turning a perfect furrow 17 in. wide in greensward with a pair of horses weighing about twenty-five hundred. We have only broken two points while we have used the plow, and then in both cases it was when we were backing over round cobble stones.

Also it is useful in our potato field for furrowing out, and then by putting the right hand plow on the left side and the left hand plow on the right side, so that the two moldboards come together, and letting them hang from the center, it makes a perfect potato coverer which adjusts itself to the different conditions of the land.

Altogether, I am more than pleased with my plow, and now I am independent of hired men.
