All of our machines are supplied with the only successful Duster ever invented; the draught from the cylinder carries all the dust from the front of the machine through the Duster and out into the straw, thus enabling the feeder to feed his machine without suffering any inconvenience on account of the dust. By the use of four revolving rakes in connection with the usual shaking motion, is thereby secured a perfect separation and saving of grain. By our patent sieves, and the manner of their arrangement, we are enabled to clean all kinds of grain fit for market. The durability of a machine also constitutes an important item for consideration, and it is impossible to construct a durable machine unless the separate parts are selected with great care. The cylinder shaft is steel, running in self-setting brass boxes, thus overcoming all liability of heating. The teeth are made of the best Norway iron, and are securely fastened. The concave is arranged so as to be adjustable while the machine is in motion. The teeth pass through an iron bed, and are held by nuts which screw against a wooden cap, which prevents them from jarring loose. It has been our constant endeavor to improve the Peerless in every part wherever the slightest fault could be found; and by our increased sales, and the many unsolicited testimonials which we have received, place our machines among the best and most reliable now offered to the trade.

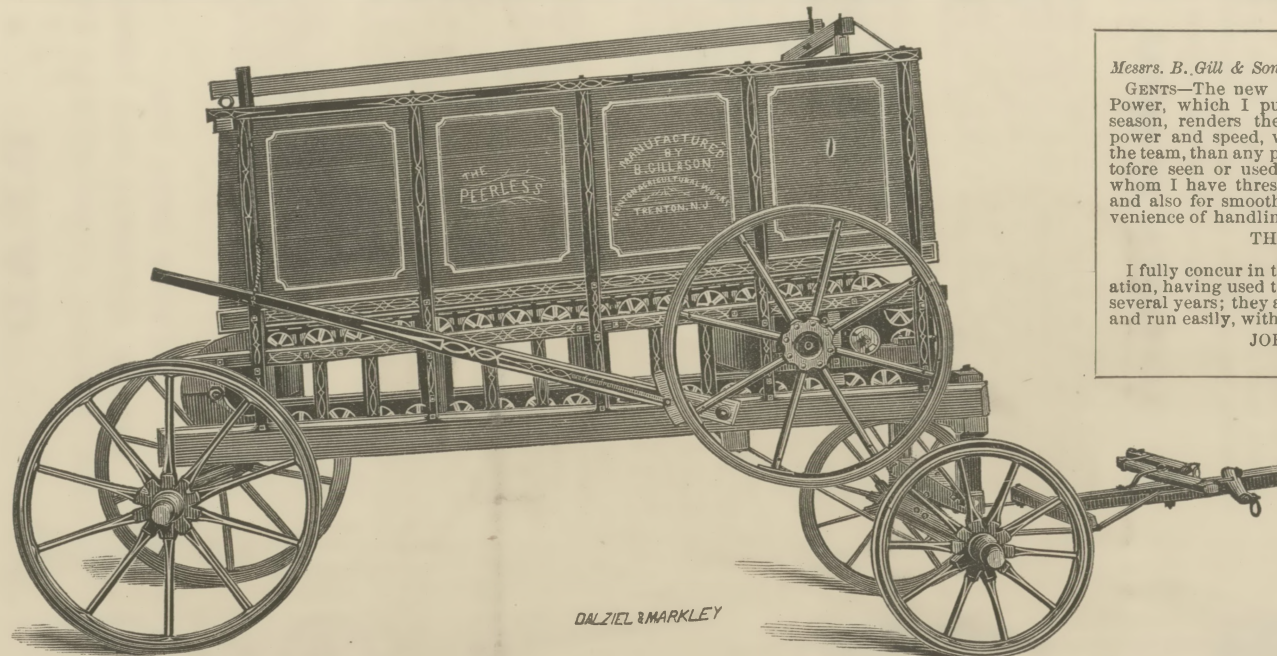
The above cut affords a perfect description of our improved Peerless. All the pulleys and belts required for working the machine are distinctly shown, (there being none on the opposite side,) also the elevator, and spout for conveying the clean grain into bag or measure; all of which will fit and work as well on the other side, or, if preferred, the elevator may remain and the pulleys and grain spout be removed to opposite side.

The No. 1, or six to eight-horse Separator, has a capacity of 40 to 60 bushels of wheat per hour, and about double that quantity in oats.

The No. 3 Separator can be driven equally well by a four-horse lever power or a two-horse railway power, threshing from 20 to 30 bushels of wheat per hour, and twice that amount in oats.

The No. 2, or four to six-horse Separator, has a capacity of from 30 to 40 bushels of wheat per hour, and twice that quantity in oats.

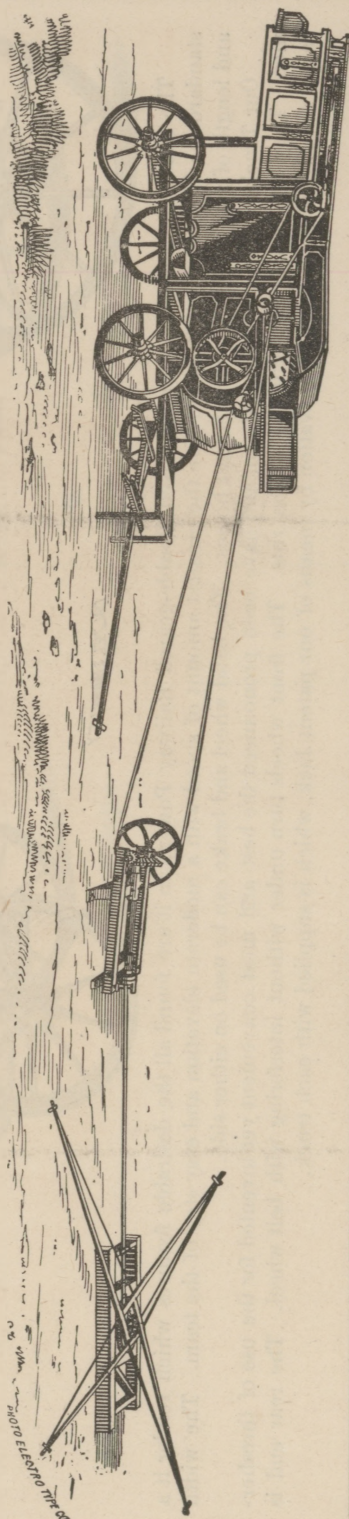

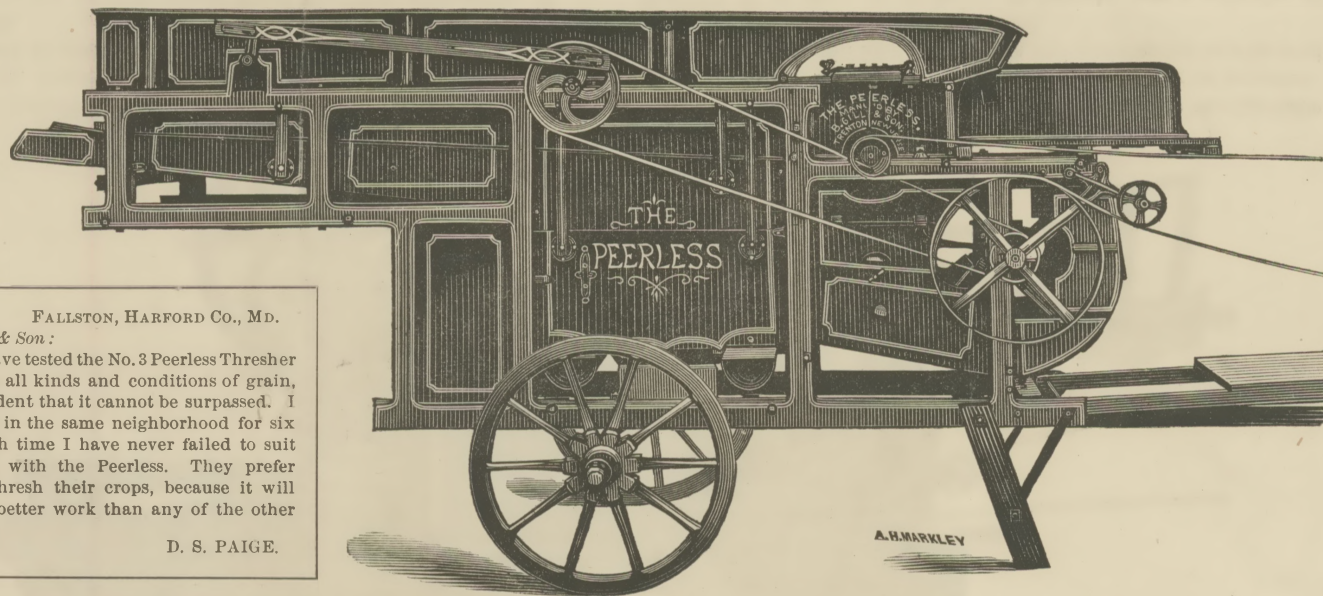
TERMS OF WARRANTY.

If, on trial, they do not work satisfactorily, we or our agents must be immediately notified, and sufficient time allowed for putting them in order. If then the machine fails to perform its work, it must be returned to the manufactory—a condition of this warranty being binding upon us in case our Threshers are to be operated by other powers than our own is, that such be geared to give the threshing cylinder a motion of 1,200 to 1,300 revolutions per minute.
