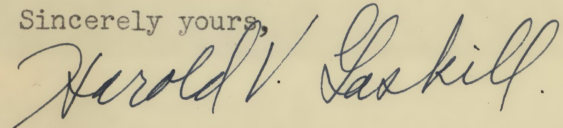
Dear Doctor Atanasoff:
