

Additional Records of Starlings in Central Iowa. —

The following records of the Starling in Iowa constitute extensions of range or probable first reports in Jasper, Marshall, and Hamilton counties.

Mr. and Mrs. Harold A. Brunner of Des Moines reported a flock of twelve Starlings seen June 12, 1933, east of Newton in Jasper County.

Two specimens of Starlings in the study collection of the Department of Biology, Iowa State College, were killed by Mr. Harlow B. Mills at Legrand, Marshall County, December 25, 1931.

On October 23, 1933, the writer observed a flock of seven Starlings, two adults and five juveniles, in Hamilton County, about twelve miles northeast of Boone.

Besides the Hamilton County record the writer observed Starlings during October, 1933 in Boone, Polk, Mahaska, and Henry counties, localities from which there are already a few reports.

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
