MEMORANDUM To The General Manager

As you probably know, the Chairman plans to make an introductory statement at the beginning of our hearings before the JCAE about the middle of January. This statement would cover in general terms the whole program, both Military and peaceful, and would outline the progress we have made and the problems with which we are confronted. Although this has not come to the attention of the JCAE as a whole, Hollingsworth has cleared with Senator Anderson through Ramey.

As a general guide, the Chairman would like to proceed in the normal sequence of our program, beginning with the Raw Materials Program, moving into the Production area, and then on to the peaceful and Military uses of these materials. Although our power program probably will not be completely crystalized at that point, the Chairman believes it is important that he include the subject in his statement even though some of the specific of our proposals in the power program will not be ready.

The Chairman would like very much to meet with you, and possibly also Foster and Hollingsworth, as soon as possible to discuss the preparation of this statement. I would suggest your secretary work out with Mrs. Crosby of this office, a time that is mutually convenient, to you and the Chairman.
