Dear Ms. Wild:

In a letter of April 11, 1979, to Governor Matheson, Vice Admiral Monroe indicated I would be forwarding an initial bibliography of documents in Department of Defense (DoD) files. The bibliography, which is enclosed, is an initial sorting of documents we think may be pertinent to your studies of possible radiation effects to Utah residents from Nevada nuclear weapons tests.

The bibliography has been assembled from two primary sources: the library of the Defense Nuclear Agency (DNA) headquarters in Alexandria, Virginia, and documents immediately available to the DoD Nuclear Information and Analysis Center (DASIAC), Santa Barbara, California. Both listings are separated according to classified and unclassified documents, and both are further subdivided by originating organization; i.e., DoD, the Atomic Energy Commission (Department of Energy), joint, and other. In this initial sorting, we have attempted to identify documents pertaining to fallout, radiation effects on life forms, and methods to protect life forms--as specified in Governor Matheson's original letter to Secretary Brown--and these categories are appropriately labeled in the bibliography.

As you review the listings and as questions arise, please feel free to call me at any time, phone (202) 325-7064/0459/7744. Additionally, I am available to meet with you in Salt Lake City--at your request--to help develop a more precise definition of future action.
