Dear Mr. Ink:

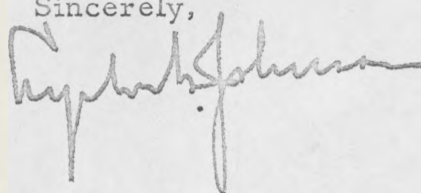
I have your recent letter advising me of your intention to return to your duties at the Atomic Energy Commission.
