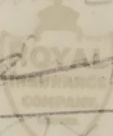

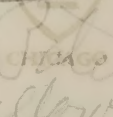

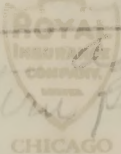

Domestic Postage

Domestic rates of postage apply to all parts of the United States, which includes Hawaii, Porto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, and to its possessions, which embrace the Philippines, Guam, Tutuila and the Canal Zone; also to mail for officers and crew of vessels of war of the United States, the U. S. Naval Hospital at Yokohama and to other places where the United States mail may be in operation, and with certain exceptions to matter for Canada, Cuba, Mexico, Newfoundland and Panama.

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FIRST CLASS MATTER. Letters and Written Matter, also other matter if sealed against postal inspection, 2c. per ounce or fraction.

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Drop Letters should be mailed at rate of 2c. per ounce or fraction for delivery at letter-carrier offices, and 1c. per ounce at non-carrier offices, provided addresses are not served by rural-carriers.

Post Cards or Private Mailing Cards. All cards conforming to the requirements for Post Cards or which bear the words "Post Card" or "Private Mailing Card", whether entirely in print or bearing written or typewritten messages, will be subject to 2c. postage.

Postal Cards. Issued by the Government and sold by the Post Office Department, 1 cent.

SECOND CLASS MATTER. (Unsealed) Newspapers and periodicals, which are "Entered as Second Class Matter". To the general public the rate is 2c. for 2 ounces or fraction thereof, for weights not exceeding 8 ounces. See fourth class zone rates for weights exceeding 8 ounces.

THIRD CLASS MATTER (limit, 8 ounce). Circulars and miscellaneous printed matter, also merchandise, 1½ cents for each 2 ounces.

Books (including catalogues) of 24 pages or more, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions and plants, 1 cent for each 2 ounces.

POSTAL INFORMATION (Continued)

FOURTH CLASS MATTER. (Parcel Post) merchandise, farm products, books, printed matter, all matter formerly included in the third and fourth classes, weighing more than 8 ounces, and all other mailable matter not included in the first, second and third classes.

POSTAGE. For fourth class matter see parcel post pound and zone rates.

SPECIAL HANDLING. Parcels to be given special handling will be chargeable with the regular fourth-class rates and 25 cents additional postage on each parcel. Mark "Special Handling" on package.

Size and Weight. A Parcel Post package may not exceed 84 inches in length and girth combined. The limit of weight is 70 lbs. for the local, first, second and third zones, 50 lbs. for other zones.

INSURANCE. Third and fourth class matter may be insured against injury, loss or rifling in an amount equivalent to its actual value, on payment of the following fees, in addition to postage.

Value \$5.00 or less 5c., \$5.01 to \$25.00, 8c., \$25.01 to \$50.00, 10c., \$50.01 to \$100.00, 25c.

Return receipt 3 cents extra.

C. O. D. SERVICE. Third and Fourth Class Matter may be sent C. O. D., and price of article and all charges thereon will be collected from the person addressed, upon delivery. The fee is 12 cents, in addition to postage, when amount to be remitted does not exceed \$10.00; 15 cents, when amount does not exceed \$50.00; and 25 cents, when amount to be remitted does not exceed \$100.00. These fees are paid by postage stamps affixed to parcel which is automatically insured against non-receipt of returns, or loss, rifling or damage.

Examination of contents is not permitted before delivery and payment of charges.

REGISTRY SERVICE. First class and sealed fourth class mail prepaid with first class postage, indemnifiable for \$0.01 to \$50.00, 15c., \$50.01 to \$100.00, 20c.

Second class, and any class of mail without intrinsic value, not indemnifiable, 15c.

Third class mail indemnifiable for \$0.01 to \$25.00, 15c.

Return receipt 3 cents extra.

MONEY ORDER RATES

Antigua, Anguilla, Argentina, Aruba, Bahamas, Barbados, Barbuda, Bermuda, Bolivia, Bonaire, Brazil, British Guiana, British Honduras, Caicos Island, Canada, Cayman Islands, Chile, Colombia, Cook Islands, Costa Rica, Cuba, Curacao, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Dutch West Indies, Ecuador, England, Grenada, Grenadines, Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Irish Free State, Jamaica, Labrador, Leeward Islands, Mexico, Montserrat, Newfoundland, Netherlands West Indies, New Zealand, Nevis, Nicaragua, Northern Ireland, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Redonda, Saba, St. Christopher, St. Eustatius, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, Dutch part of St. Martin, St. Vincent, El Salvador, British Western Samoa, Scotland, Spain and Colonies: Balearic Islands, Canary Islands and Morocco (Alcazarquivir, Alhucemas Island, Arcila, Ceuta, Chaferinas or Zafarani Islands, Melilla, Monte Arruit, Nador, Penon de la Gomera or Velez, Rincon de Medik, Rio Martin, Segangan, Tangier and Zeluán), Tobago, Trinidad, Turks Islands, Uruguay, British Virgin Islands, Wales, Western Samoa, Windward Islands.

Rate of postage on post cards and postal cards to the places in the above list is 2 cents each single card and 4 cents each reply-paid card.

To foreign countries not named above the postage rate for letters is 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof and 3 cent for each additional ounce or fraction thereof; postal cards or post cards, 3 cents each single card and 6 cents each reply-paid card.

FOREIGN PARCEL POST

Postage. Parcels weighing up to 15 lbs. may be sent to Canada and Newfoundland, up to 22 lbs. to Mexico, and up to 50 lbs. to Panama. The limit of weight for all other countries is 11 lbs. except as noted in "Postal Guide."
