● CYCLONE SCOUTING REPORT

As tough a team as you will meet — that is the quick summary on Oklahoma State.

The Cowboys run from a variety of formations but they do just about the same things from each. Looking at the Cowboys the Iowa State fans will see many similarities in both attack and defense.

The leader of the Oklahoma State offense is Bobby Cole. Cole was the big factor in the Oklahoma State victory at Stillwater last year. He ran for nearly 240 yards. He barely missed the school record in that game. Cleveland Vann, big full-back, gets the tough yards and is an outstanding blocker for Cole.

The quarterbacking of Tony Pounds has been a help, too. When Brent Blackman, brilliant sophomore signal caller, was hurt it was Pounds who stepped back into the breach and guided the Cowboys.

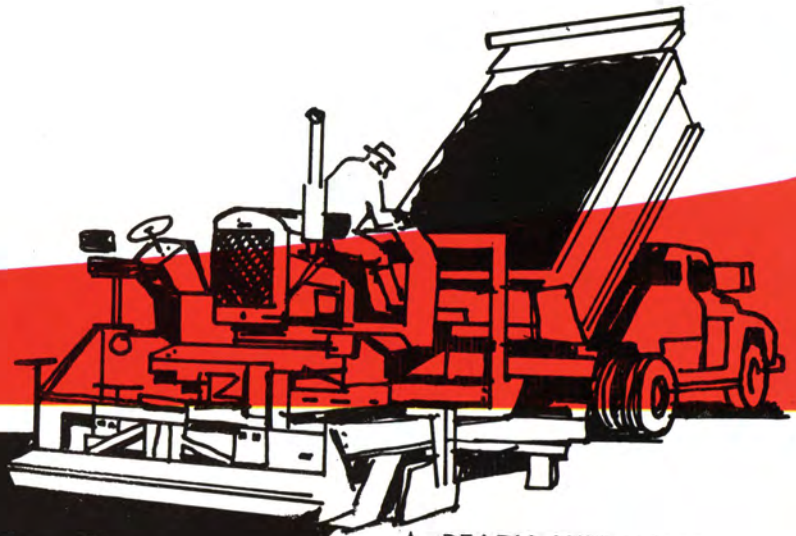
Defensively the Oklahoma State

team uses a 40 formation and a free safety who works a great deal like Matt Blair of the Cyclones. Much of the time, though, the free safety is used to give the Cowboys solid umbrella coverage against the pass. The Cowboys are aggressive and hustle. They have outstanding quickness and great ability to chase the ball.

Jim Williams and Barry Price are the top interior linemen. These two men have a combined total of 22 tackles behind the line for 88 yards of loss.

Oklahoma State will miss Bubba Bain, its fine middle linebacker. Bain was hurt at Colorado last week and is not figured on for any action today.

Basically the Cowboys like to play man for man on pass defense, but often in definite passing situations go to the zone.



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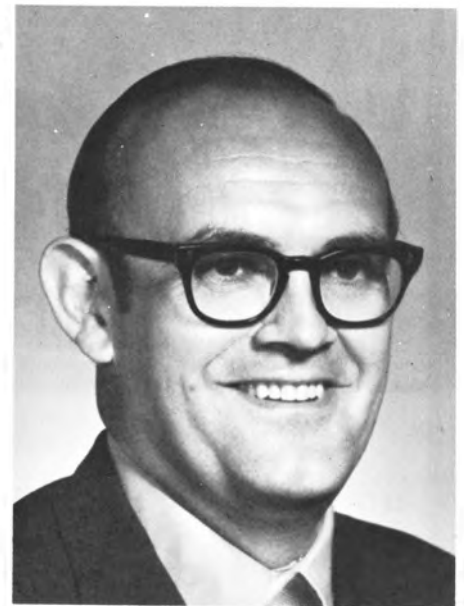

Eager, enthusiastic, dedicated, determined, knowledgeable—are all words that fit every man on Johnny Majors' coaching staff.

Majors is one of the most enthusiastic football coaches in the nation, determined to give Iowa State outstanding teams. A great player from a great football family, Majors ranks as an all-time great at Tennessee, both in the college and high school ranks. He has helped produce winners at Tennessee, Mississippi State, and Arkansas—and is ready to repeat that goal at Iowa State.

Joe Avezzano has done a fine job in molding the offensive line for the Cyclones. He is a fine student of the game, bringing fine high school, college and professional playing experience to his present job. His Alma Mater is Florida State.

King Block is experiencing, this year, one of those rare moments when a former star faces his own school. Block was a great Idaho prep star and repeated at Idaho. Block has brought a fine all-around coaching background to his duties as offensive backfield coach.

Bill Cox is a young veteran on the Cyclone staff. Like Avezzano, a Florida State graduate, he is in his third year of coaching as he directs the Iowa State freshman program. He played on three bowl teams at Florida State, then coached there two years before coming to Iowa State.

Jim Dyar was a fine guard at Houston and played a lot of football for the Atlanta Falcon farm team. He was a student assistant at both Houston and Iowa State before joining the staff full time a year ago. A fine recruiter and coach who directs the defensive line.

Jerry Fiat was a fine player for the Cyclones, an outstanding linebacker despite lack of size. He is a student assistant, working with the defense, primarily.

Ray Greene combines outstanding playing experience,

varied coaching background, with a keen knowledge of football. He has handled the scout squad, coached the freshmen and is now directing the play of an outstanding corps of Cyclone Receivers. He played at Akron university.

George Haffner is the offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for Majors. He played two years at Notre Dame and finished at McNeese State following his military service. Played for the Colts. High school coach in Louisiana before coming to Iowa State.

Keith Kephart played at Dubuque University and coached in Illinois before getting into the student coach pattern at Iowa State. Now a member of the Majors' staff, directing scouting and recruiting activities for the football department.

Joe Madden is a Maryland graduate who coached with Majors at Mississippi State and was one of the first men that Majors contacted when he started organizing his staff at Iowa State. Madden has done an outstanding job as the coach of the Cyclone defensive secondary.

Jackie Sherrill was a great high school player who played outstanding football for Alabama. He coached at his alma mater and at Arkansas. It was there that he joined forces with Majors. Sherrill is the defensive coordinator and coaches the fine linebacking crew for the Cyclones.

Arch Steel was a multi-sport star in high school and at Bowling Green. He coached in Michigan high school and college circles, also in California before joining the Cyclones in 1954. He works with the kickers and heads the academic counseling program for the Cyclones.

Frank Randall is the head trainer for Iowa State. He was a baseball star at New Mexico State and became the head trainer there following graduation. He coached and served as trainer at New Mexico Military Institute and Idaho before coming to Iowa State in 1970.

Finale for 16 Seniors

It's "Auld Lang Syne" for 16 Iowa State seniors today.

Johnny Majors is going to miss a great gang of veterans when the 1972 season rolls around. They are the men who have led the Cyclones to the best season in years, regardless of what happens today or next Saturday at San Diego.

These are the men who started with Majors when he became the Cyclone head coach. Nearly all of them came to Iowa State through the efforts of Majors and his staff. They have taken their lumps in other years.

But this has been the season when they gave more lumps than they took.

Here are the men who have played a big part in the building program at Iowa State who will not be on hand next year:

Harold Bassett, defensive left end. A cat-like player who has thrown opponents for more than 100-yards of loss this year. He'll be a two-year letterman.

Bob Belluz, offensive tackle or guard. A real Cyclone who has been a stopper in the Cyclone line at both tackle and guard — and a top team man in either spot.

Dean Carlson, quarterback. In a two year period he has almost reached all the three year marks set by such great Cyclone passers as Tim Van Galder and Bill Weeks. A top flight leader, tri-captain.

Sam Davis, tailback. Sammy has been a kick returner, a split end, and anything else that the Cyclones needed.

Mike Fontanini, quarterback. A

fine back up man and a great team player.

Ray Harm, offensive guard. A sound, solid player who rarely misses an assignment. Tri-captain.

John Kelly, linebacker or end. Another letterman who has been a valuable spot performer.

Joe Marconi, offensive tackle. One of the finest, a player who always grades high and plays far better than most tackles.

Bob Matey, defensive tackle. He's the big play man. Quick and a deadly tackler.

Dennis McDonald, fullback. A fullback is supposed to get the tough yardage and be a bruising blocker — which is a perfect description of MacDonald.

Tom Potter, defensive end. He's a mighty good one, too. And when he's needed as a linebacker he's good there, too.

Bob Richardson, tight end. He has overcome early injuries to be a most important member of the offense.

Keith Schroeder, linebacker. As good as there is in the nation. A great leader and what a fighter. Tri-captain.

Reggie Shoemaker, kicker. He holds all the Cyclone point-scoring marks. If there are any that do not belong to him he'll get them in the last two games!

Bradd Steckmesser, linebacker or tight end. Bradd can play it either way for the Cyclones.

Mike Terrizzi, offensive guard. If there is a better one in the Big Eight it has to be teammate Ray Harm.

About Oklahoma State University

Entering the 81st year since its first class of 45 students met in Stillwater's Congregational church 16 years before Oklahoma became a state, Oklahoma State University this autumn goes into the sixth year of the administration of President Robert B. Kamm.

Resident enrollment last year was 18,447 with a normal increase expected this autumn when perhaps 19,000 will be seeking degrees in OSU's College of Agriculture, Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Business Administration, Education, Home Economics, Veterinary Medicine and the Graduate College.

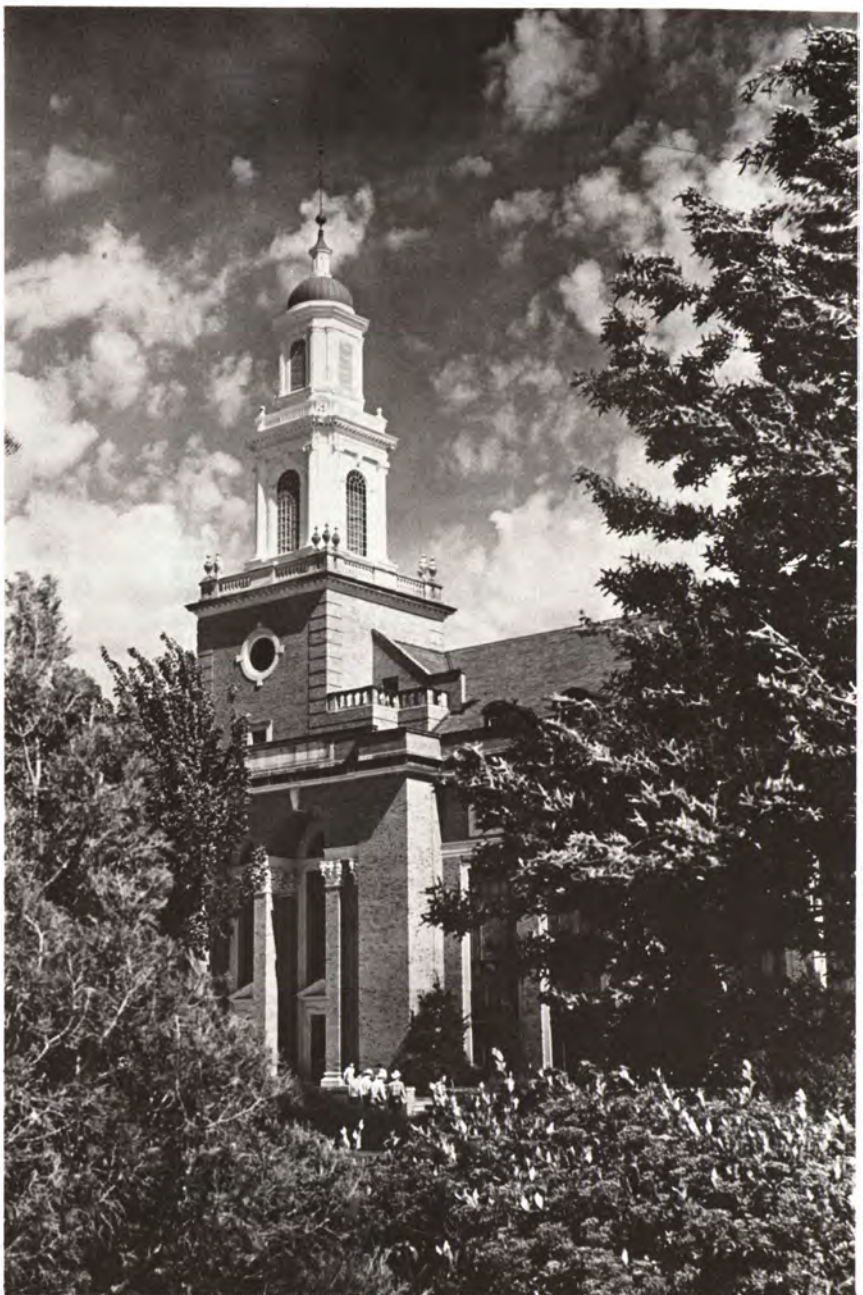
Salient facts about the great land-grant university at Stillwater include:

The faculty numbers approximately 1,000 and there are some 4,500 non-academic employees working at OSU. In graduate study the university grants the Ph.D. and Ed.D. degree in more than 40 fields, the MS and MA in 70 areas of study. There are some 3,200 graduates annually.

State's central campus now includes 415 acres, with 173 permanent buildings, the evaluation now being approximately \$125 million. Adjoining experimental farms cover 2,352 acres and the university's Lake Carl Blackwell area to the west covers 19,364 acres, including the 3,380-acre lake. OSU has 17 agricultural experiment stations around the state.

Campus housing in the 16 major dormitories has a capacity of 7,400 single students in addition to married student housing. Additional housing is provided just off campus by 26 fraternities and 12 sororities.

Following its earliest athletic endeavors, OSU became a charter member of the Southwest conference in 1914, resigned to join the Missouri Valley conference in 1925, then became affiliated with the Big Eight Conference in May, 1957—a conference composed of state universities only—Iowa State, Nebraska, Missouri, Kansas, Kansas State, Colorado, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State, former associates of OSU in the old Valley league.



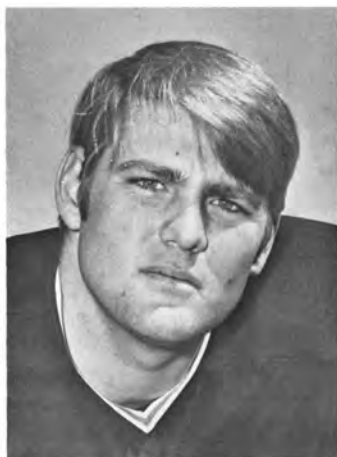

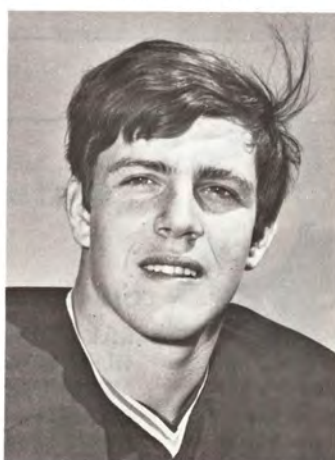
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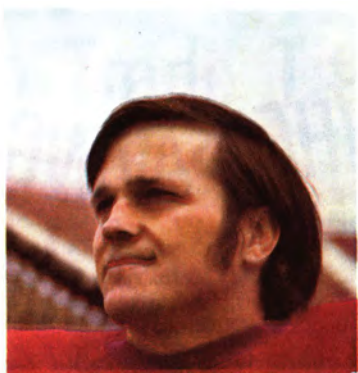
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Shirley To Trade Titles

Next spring one of Iowa State's prettiest coeds will trade her well-deserved beauty title for another she has dreamed of since she was a youngster—doctor of veterinary medicine.

Shirley Kittleson, who aspires to be a good animal surgeon, is the reigning Miss Minnesota Universe and represented her home state in the Miss USA beauty pageant in Miami, Fla., last June.

The tall sparkly-eyed senior didn't capture the Miss USA Crown but she and Cynthia Ann Helmers, another Iowa State coed who was Miss Iowa in the same competition, "had a lot of fun trying."

Shirley undoubtedly is the first vet med student ever to make it that far in a national beauty contest, and she and Miss Helmers were the only two young women from the same university campus in the Miami pageant.

But while the tall (5'8", 130-pounds) blue-eyed lass from a Sherburn, Minn., farm is an attractive, personable beauty queen, she also is an above-average (3.1 grade point) student with some definitely established goals. The fact that she is a woman in a predominantly male curriculum hasn't bothered her a bit. In fact she has more feminine company now than when she entered the College of Veterinary Medicine: there were five coeds in her class and there are 13 in the 1971 first-year class.

"We have generally been very well accepted," Shirley reports, "and I've found that the women in vet med are determined and have the ambition to succeed, and most of them really do go into a practice."

Upon graduation Shirley will practice her profession, with the ultimate goal of her own private practice. So far two "exciting" professional possibilities have surfaced—an internship in a government veterinary hospital in South Africa, or a veterinarian assignment for a large stable in Rhodesia which would also permit time for private practice.
