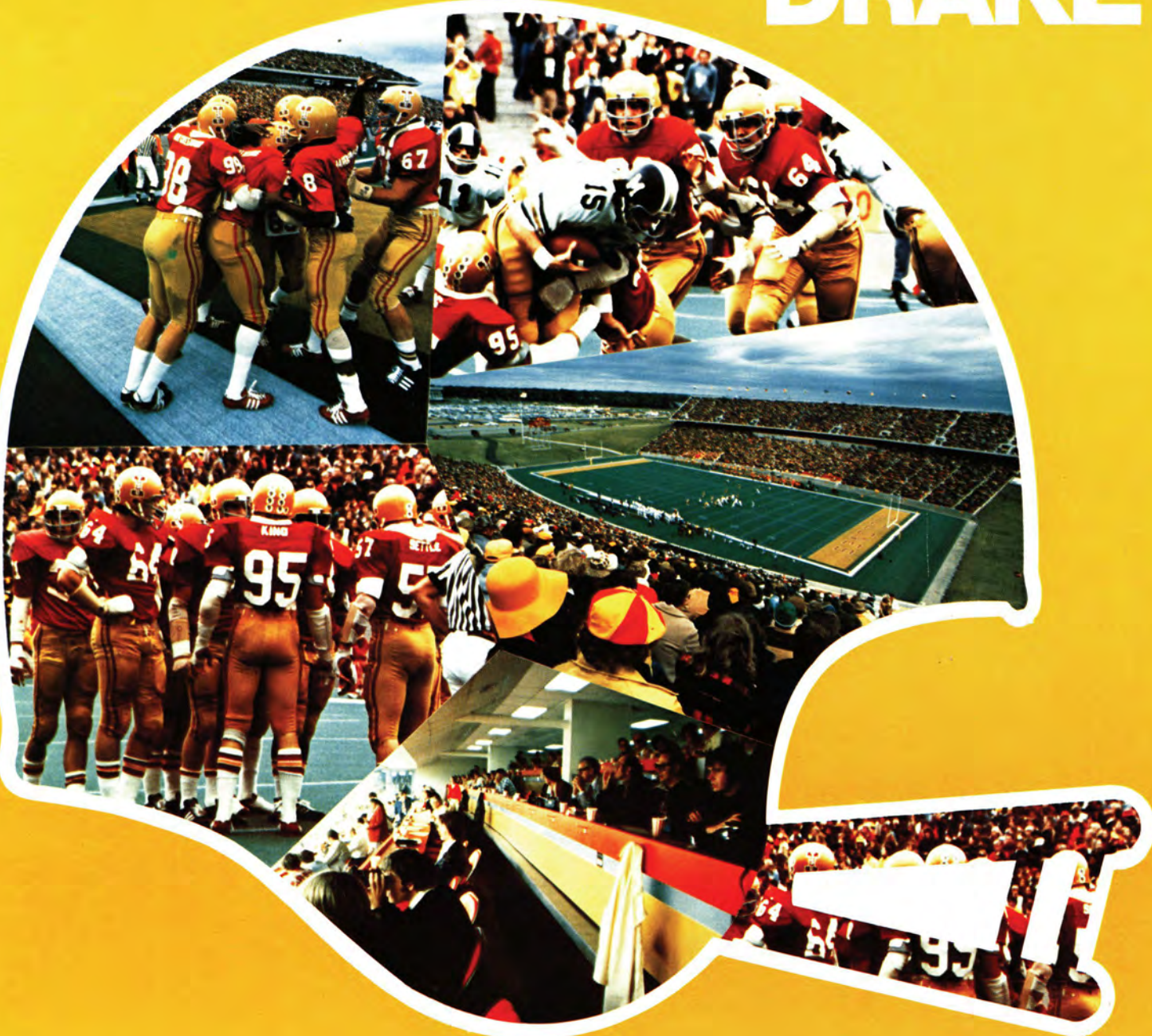

Head Coach Earle Bruce is in his fourth year at Iowa State and after over 20 years of coaching on the high school and collegiate levels is recognized as one of the finest coaches in the business.

Bruce, who last January coached the East team to a 16-0 win in the Hulu Bowl for the first shut-out in 30 years, was three times the Ohio prep "Coach of the Year" before becoming an assistant at Ohio State. He became head coach at Tampa in 1972 and led the Spartans to a 10-2 record and bowl victory.

Pete Rodriguez is in his first year as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He came to ISU from Florida State, where he had the same responsibilities. Rodriguez has a top coaching background, working at Arizona and going to the Sun Bowl and spending five years at Western Illinois and going 39-13. He is a graduate of Western State in Colorado and coached two years in the Colorado prep ranks.

Tom Lichtenberg coaches the Cyclone quarterbacks and wide receivers. He is in his third year on the staff after coaching at Morehead (Ky.) State and spending 13 years in the Ohio prep ranks. He is a 1962 graduate of Louisville.

Randy Hart directs the ISU defensive tackles and middle guards, his third year with those duties after coaching the freshman team for one season. He had previously coached at Tampa for one year. He is a 1970 graduate of Ohio State and has played in the Rose Bowl.

Bob Tucker coaches the defensive ends at Iowa State and is one of the original members of Bruce's ISU staff, coming in 1973 after four years at Wichita State. He is a 1965 graduate of Wooster College and coaches Ohio high school football before moving to Wichita.

Jim Williams begins his first year on the Iowa State staff after becoming the most successful coach in Iowa high school history. In 12 years at Des Moines Dowling High, Williams led the Maroons to a 105-9-1 record and earned numerous coaching honors. His overall prep record, including stays at Audubon and East Dubuque, Ill., is 181-21-3. Dowling never lost a Metro-Conference game under Williams (56-0) and once had a 47-game winning streak.

Tom Vaughn, a former All-America at Iowa State in 1964, is in his second year as coach of

the ISU running backs. Vaughn spent seven years in the NFL with the Detroit Lions before joining the coaching ranks with Wayne State University and the Detroit Wheels of the WFL. Also an academic All-America during his playing days, Vaughn is considered by many to be the best all-around back in school history.

Charlie Lyle coaches the Cyclone secondary, his fifth year on Bruce's staff and fourth year at Iowa State. A 1962 graduate of Tampa, Lyle coached in the Florida high school ranks before moving to Tampa as the secondary coach. His Spartan unit ranked nationally.

Glen Mason is in his second year at Iowa State as the offensive tackle and tight end coach. Mason came to ISU from Ball State and has also coached at Allegheny College. He is a 1971 graduate of Ohio State, playing on Big Ten title teams.

Keith Kephart has been on the ISU staff since 1968 and is in his third year of the junior varsity head coach. The 1966 graduate of Dubuque has also played a major role in the Cyclones' recruiting efforts since his arrival and was the recruiting coordinator for several years.

Old Rivalry Renews Today

An old rivalry, which dates back to 1898, renews this afternoon when football players from Iowa State and Drake bump heads on the artificial turf.

Iowa State and Drake have not played a football game since 1965 when the Cyclones spoiled first-game head coach Jack Wallace's debut, 21-0. There have been 64 games, though, in the past and I-State has won 44 of them with four ending in a draw.

Those facts are history and what's important is today. Iowa State is kicking off its 1976 season while Drake enters with last week's 30-29 defeat to New Mexico State as its log.

The air should be filled with footballs. Cyclone Head Coach Earle Bruce, beginning his fourth year, has indicated that his team will take to the airways more frequently this fall with the likes of Luther Blue, Ray Hardee, John Solomon, and Dexter Green as receivers. Wayne Stanley, the team's best passer, is expected to open at quarter-back although Buddy Hardeman will see lots of action.

Drake has already tipped its offensive hand. In last week's bitter defeat, the Bulldogs losing a 29-14 fourth quarter lead, Drake threw for an impressive 318 yards and three touchdowns.

Quarterback Jeff Martin is noted for his throwing skills and he'll do it from anyplace on the field. Last week he was backed up on his own two-yard line and hit Mark Flaker for a 98-yard score.

Don't forget the running game. Iowa State will rely on its fleet of small, quick backs led by Dexter Green and fullback Frank Cooper, who is re-

placing injured star Mike Williams-- out for the year with a knee injury. The Bulldogs rushers are paced by Frank Gilliam, who picked up 53 yards last week.

Count on it that the ISU offensive line will be out to eliminate the tag "questionable" that has followed it through spring and fall practice. Veteran guards Dave Greenwood and Rob Stoffel provide the leadership along with junior Kevin Cunningham while Al Grissinger at left tackle and three young centers see the trench wars for the first time.

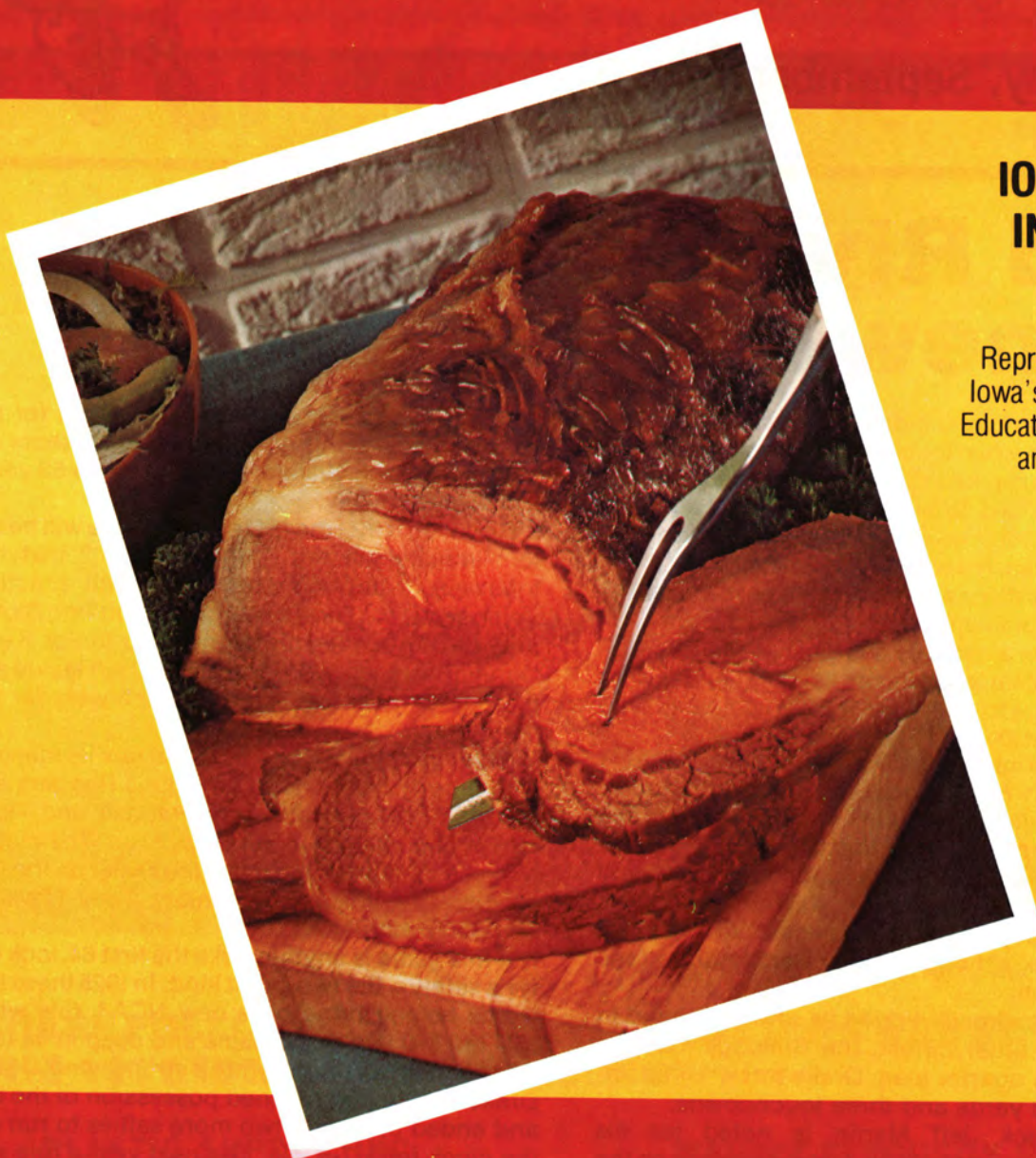
Defenses? Iowa State hopes to flex its muscles with a burly front line of ends Otis Rodgers and Lenzy Perine, tackles Tom Randall and Ron McFarland and guard Mike Stensrud. Their job is to pressure Martin and make life easier on the ISU secondary-- headed by seniors Tony Hawkins and Jerry Jaksich.

If this game is anything like the first 64, look out for a safety-- the two-point kind. In 1925 these two teams helped bring on a new NCAA rule when ISU led 7-0 late in the game and deep in its territory. Instead of punting into a strong wind, it gave Drake a safety and retained possession of the ball and ended up giving two more safeties to run out the clock for a 7-6 win. The next year a rule was passed forcing the yielding team of a safety to kick it away and not retain possession.

And in 1945 I-State prevailed 8-6 on the power of a safety and in 1948-- you guessed it -- the Cyclones won a 2-0 decision.

A Cyclone Preview....

ISU Runners Young, Track and Field Team Promising

Iowa State's Bill Bergan is a busy man these days, having been named head track and field coach over the summer in addition to his cross country coaching assignment. Cyclone fans are hoping that the same "magic" Bergan used during the past few years to bolster the cross country program will rub off during the winter and spring track campaigns.

The Cyclone runners began their 1976 season this morning with the annual ISU Invitational. As the season gets underway, there is a definite feeling that several freshmen must come through if the team is to continue its recent Big Eight success -- a league championship in 1974 and strong third place finish in 1975.

Iowa State has just four cross country lettermen, headed by junior Jeff Myers of Davenport West High School. Myers, expected to become the first Cyclone to break the four-minute mile when track season rolls around, is one of the top individuals in the conference.

Classmate Steve Manley should be Myer's capable sidekick, having set the school record in the steeplechase last spring. Sophomore Joe Burke is tabbed as the No. 3 man and the ex-Waterloo Columbus star also plays an important role in ISU's fortunes. Senior Steve Martinez is the fourth letterman but may miss the season with an injury.

Although the track and field season is still a ways away, one can't help but feel the excitement of things to come.

Last year's squad combined some outstanding individual efforts with solid team showings and nearly everyone returns. Myers, of course, should be a headliner but there are others.

Sophomore stars Steve Kuehl and David Korir (pronounced career) are capable of big things. Last year Kuehl, a Clinton native, set a school record with a 7-2 high jump and is the defending Big Eight champ indoors. He qualified for the Olympic try-out camp with his jump, which placed him second in the prestigious Texas Relays.

Korir, from Kenya by way of Cedar Rapids Washington High School, had a banner year with school records in the 880 (1:50.5) and 800 meters (1:48.3) and ran with Myers, Joe Burke and Gary Presuhn on the winning Drake Relays distance medley team.

Walk-ons Find Success at ISU

The walk-on performer in collegiate football is a valuable commodity in these days of reduced scholarships that can be issued by NCAA member institutions.

In recent years, Big Eight teams could issue 45 full scholarship pacts and that often meant that a coaching staff could take a chance with what they felt was a marginal prospect. But now the limit by the NCAA is 30 full grants and coaches are less likely to gamble.

A close look at the 1976 Iowa State roster clearly shows that there is a place for the man who comes to campus without a tender and simply wants to prove that he can play football.

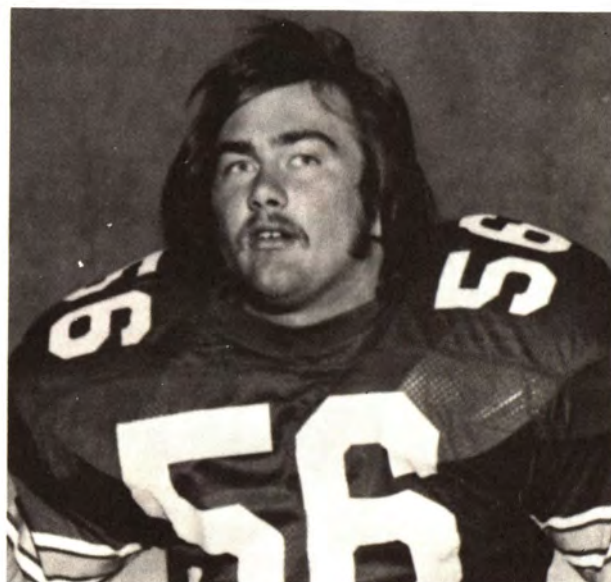
The current Cyclone roster includes seven players who arrived as walk-ons and now are on full scholarship, 14 upper class walk-ons and about 20 freshmen hopefuls looking for playing time.

The recent-times trail blazer of the Cyclone walk-on trend was Rick Howe, who came from tiny Clemons, Ia., and became a three year starter, played on a bowl team and served as a team captain.

Walk-ons enjoyed a banner year at ISU in 1975. Mark Benda, a native of Red Oak, Ia., earned his tender three days prior to the opening game with UCLA and proceeded to start all 11 games at linebacker. Mark Settle of nearby Nevada, Ia., earned his scholarship as a freshman and lettered as a sophomore linebacker. Cornerback Rich Mark of Collinsville, Ill., also was rewarded with a tender for his play.

This spring saw three others earn their varsity wings. Sophomore offensive tackle Al Grissinger of Felton, Pa., has an excellent opportunity to become a regular this year while classmates Mickey Leafblad, a tight end from Gurney, Ill., and Ron Bockhaus, a center from Cedar Falls, Ia., will provide solid relief help.

This summer saw Burlington sophomore Rick White join the scholarship list.

"There is definitely an opportunity for a walk-on player at Iowa State," White says. "Everybody gets a chance to prove himself in practice."

Like most of the walk-ons, White could have taken a "safer" route and attended another university out of high school.

"The biggest reason I walked-on here," he says "was that I thought I was good enough to play *Big Eight* football and that if I didn't come and test myself I might always feel as though I cheated myself by not finding out. And the fact that I was interested in engineering and Iowa State has the best engineering college also played an important role in my decision."

Five Cyclones have put in at least one year with walk-on status. They include Jeff Coatta of Mankato, Minn., Gregg Manske and Larry McCaulley of Lake City, Ia., Jim Wilson of Iowa City, Ia., and Mike Nunley of Solon, Ia.

"We are very proud of our walk-on program," Head Coach Earle Bruce says. "In the last few years we have purposely left some scholarships open for walk-ons to fill and we have had great success. Sometimes it's a little tougher coming to practice when you are not on scholarship and we admire the determination these people show every day. They have made a major contribution to Iowa State's football program."

Campus Chest

A TIME TO SHARE

"A Time to Share" -- that's Campus Chest 1976, Sept. 27-Oct. 4. Through its theme, this fall's Campus Chest will be sharing not only time and money with charity, but also fun and excitement with the Iowa State campus.

Many Campus Chest events will be new and different this year. The traditional Blast will be held Oct. 1 from 7-12 P.M. in the Great Hall, but it will be revamped. Small booths and different types of displays will be a part of this year's Blast.

The Campus Chest auction, which will be held Oct. 3 at 1 P.M. south of the Campanile, is another traditional event in which local merchants donate articles for auction.

A "Do it to Des Moines" marathon is one of the most unusual events during the week of Campus Chest. Participants will "do it" on Sept. 26 by jump roping, rolling a keg, or doing whatever they choose in relay fashion to Des Moines.

Two concerts will be featured that night as part of the Campus Chest festivities. The I.S.U. Dance Company, a division of Orchesis, Iowa State's modern dance club, will present one concert. The other will be given by a Science and Humanities jazz group.

Tentative plans to have the World's Largest Monopoly Game on the campus from Oct. 1-3 have been made. The board, made by Parker Brothers, measures 96 feet square. Each square, such as Boardwalk or Park Place, will be rented to a local merchant.

Hot air balloon rides after the Oklahoma football game are also tentatively scheduled.

Other events for the Campus Chest week include an arts and crafts show, Sept. 27-29; canoe races on Lake LaVerne, Oct. 3; chariot races on central campus, Oct. 3; and a volleyball tournament Sept. 28-30.

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FESTIVAL HAS FOUR CLEVELAND CONCERTS

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Next attraction in the Bicentennial Season of the Ames International Orchestra Festival is the Cleveland Orchestra which will present four concerts in Stephens Auditorium Sept. 16-19. In addition, for the first time there will be a concert by the Ames International Orchestra Festival Youth Symphony, consisting of Iowa's top high school musicians, Sept. 18.

Conducted by Lorin Maazel, one of the outstanding young conductors in the nation, the Cleveland Orchestra is making its second festival appearance, having given three concerts in 1974.

Andre Watts will be the soloist for the opening concert Thursday, performing the Brahms Concerto No. 2 in B flat for Piano. Also on the program is Beethoven's Symphony No. 3 in E flat ("Eroica").

Daniel Majeske, concertmaster for the Cleveland Orchestra, will be featured as soloist Friday in Barber's Concerto for Violin and Orchestra. The program will include "Three Places in New England" by Ives and Dvorak's Symphony No. 9 in E minor ("New World").

Saturday the orchestra will do the Brahms Symphony No. 2 in D and "The Planets" by Holst.

Verdi's "Requiem," will conclude the festival in a Sunday matinee with the Iowa State Singers and Oratorio Chorus, guest singers from the Ames community and four soloists from the Metropolitan Opera joining the orchestra for the performance. The guest artists are Teresa Zylis-Gara, soprano; Florence Quivar, alto; John Alexander, tenor, and Ezio Flagello, bass.

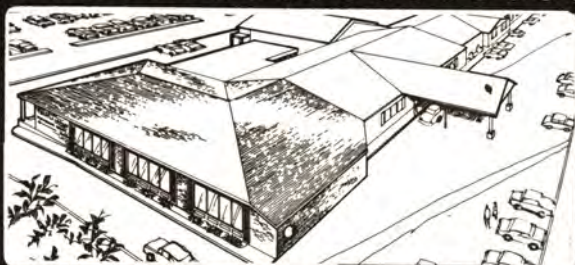
Tickets are \$12.50, \$11, \$9.50, \$7 and \$5, but for the Sunday performance there will be no \$5 seats. Students receive a \$1 discount and persons ordering tickets for three or more performances receive a \$1 discount per ticket.

The Festival Youth Symphony will make its debut in a Saturday afternoon concert. The students, nominated by their music instructors, will rehearse with Laurence Burkhalter of the ISU music faculty and will be conducted by Matthias Bamert, assistant conductor of the Cleveland Orchestra. Tickets for the Youth Symphony concert are \$2.50, with a \$1.50 discount offered to students.

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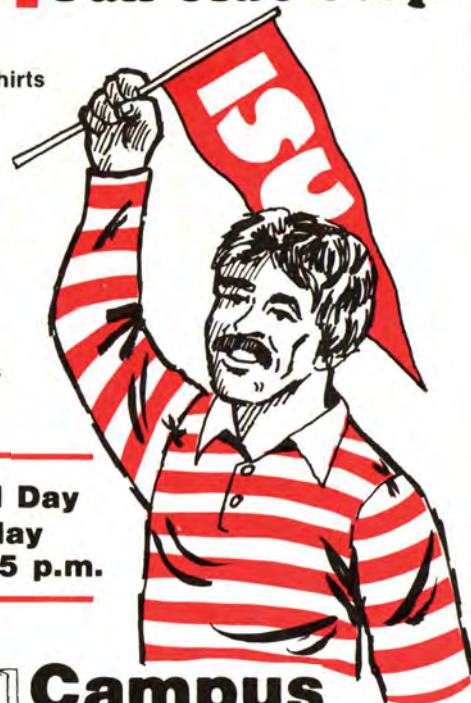
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CYCLONE SCOUTING REPORT

Drake has earned a reputation through the years for a wide open offense and Coach Jack Wallace has just that in 1976. The Bulldogs have returned to the pro-set formation that has treated them kindly in the past and in quarterback Jeff Martin they have the nation's No. 1 returning passer from 1975 based upon completions per game.

Last week Martin riddled New Mexico State for 318 yards and three touchdowns, hitting on 18 of 24 passes. In 1975 Martin threw for 1,150 yards and has over 3,000 yards already in his career. Drake has a number of fine receivers, too, and Wallace has said they are the best group he's had in 12 years. They include Paul Proffitt, Frank Gilliam, Pat Tuttle, Mark Flaker and Robert Forbes.

As an example of their explosiveness, last week Martin hit Flaker on a 98-yard scoring pass in the 30-29 Bulldog setback. Gilliam and Forbes are charged with the main rushing chores to complement the air attack. Gilliam ran for 53 yards last week while Forbes, a 219 pounder, bulled for 39.

The Bulldog defense is much better than New Mexico State's 30 points might indicate. Leaders here include co-captains Gary Melchior, a 6-4, 224 pound tackle, and linebacker Dan Zarazan.

One more consideration -- count on the fact that Drake will enter the game sky-high, bent on the idea of gaining national recognition by upsetting the prestigious Big Eight Conference.



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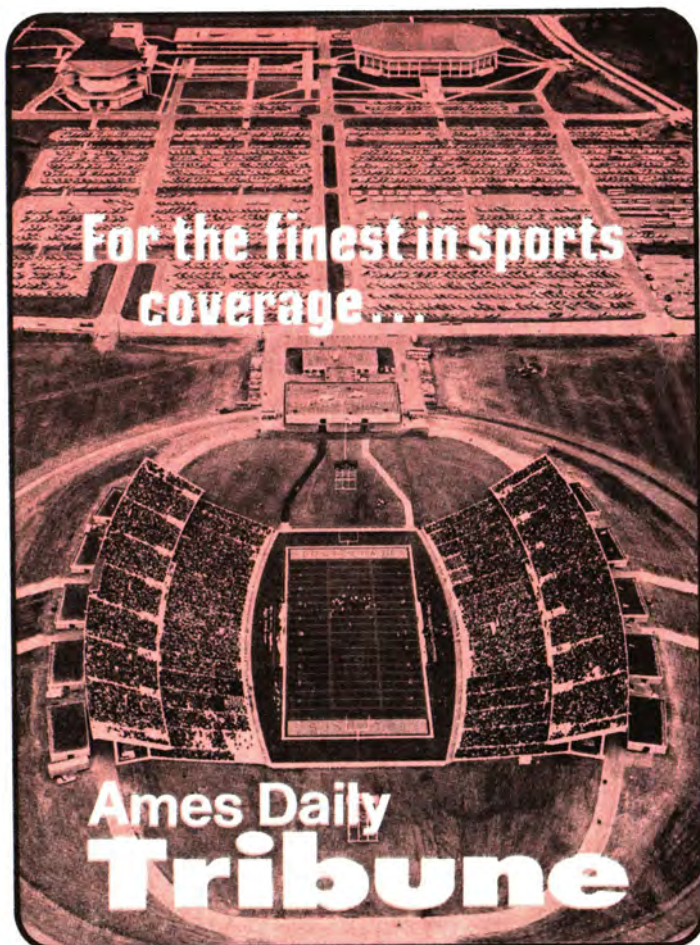
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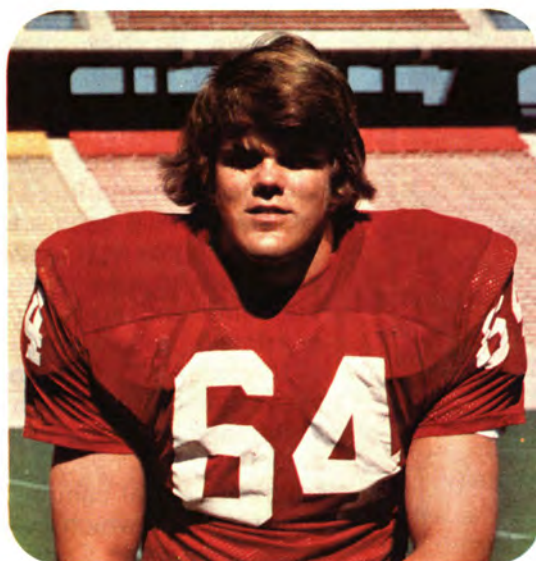
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Expect Increased Enrollment at ISU

Assuming the availability of housing for some 60 men who are still on the "waiting list," a record enrollment approaching 22,000 students is anticipated at Iowa State University when classes begin Thursday, Sept. 9. Last year's enrollment was 21,205, also a record.

All earlier projections, plus the fact that some 18,000 students have registered by mail, indicate that an enrollment increase of 800 students might take place this fall. However, university officials suggest some attrition may have occurred as a result of the tight housing situation.

Housing of the additional students has been a concern to university administrators since last year. Throughout the past summer homeowners in Ames and surrounding communities have been urged to offer rental rooms and apartments to students, a program supported by the Ames Chamber of Commerce and the university.

The university residence department is using all available space in an effort to accommodate students. Even though ISU residence space has been developed for 338 more students than last

year, the room supply is short of the demand.

There is one bright spot in the housing picture, however. Charles Frederiksen, director of residence, reports "We have placed all the women who were on our waiting list for housing and we do have some space available in temporary housing for women."

George C. Christensen, vice president for academic affairs at Iowa State, said that "To accommodate the increased enrollment in the fall quarter, nontenured instructors and teaching assistants have been added to the faculty. After the students are registered we may find it necessary to add some additional teachers at that time and again in the winter and spring quarters."

This year 120 new students, the largest class ever, is being admitted to the new College of Veterinary Medicine which is open for the first time this fall. The college is located two miles south of central campus in the university's new south campus which includes the four buildings in the Iowa State Center complex, the Ralph A. Olsen Building for athletic offices, and the new football stadium.

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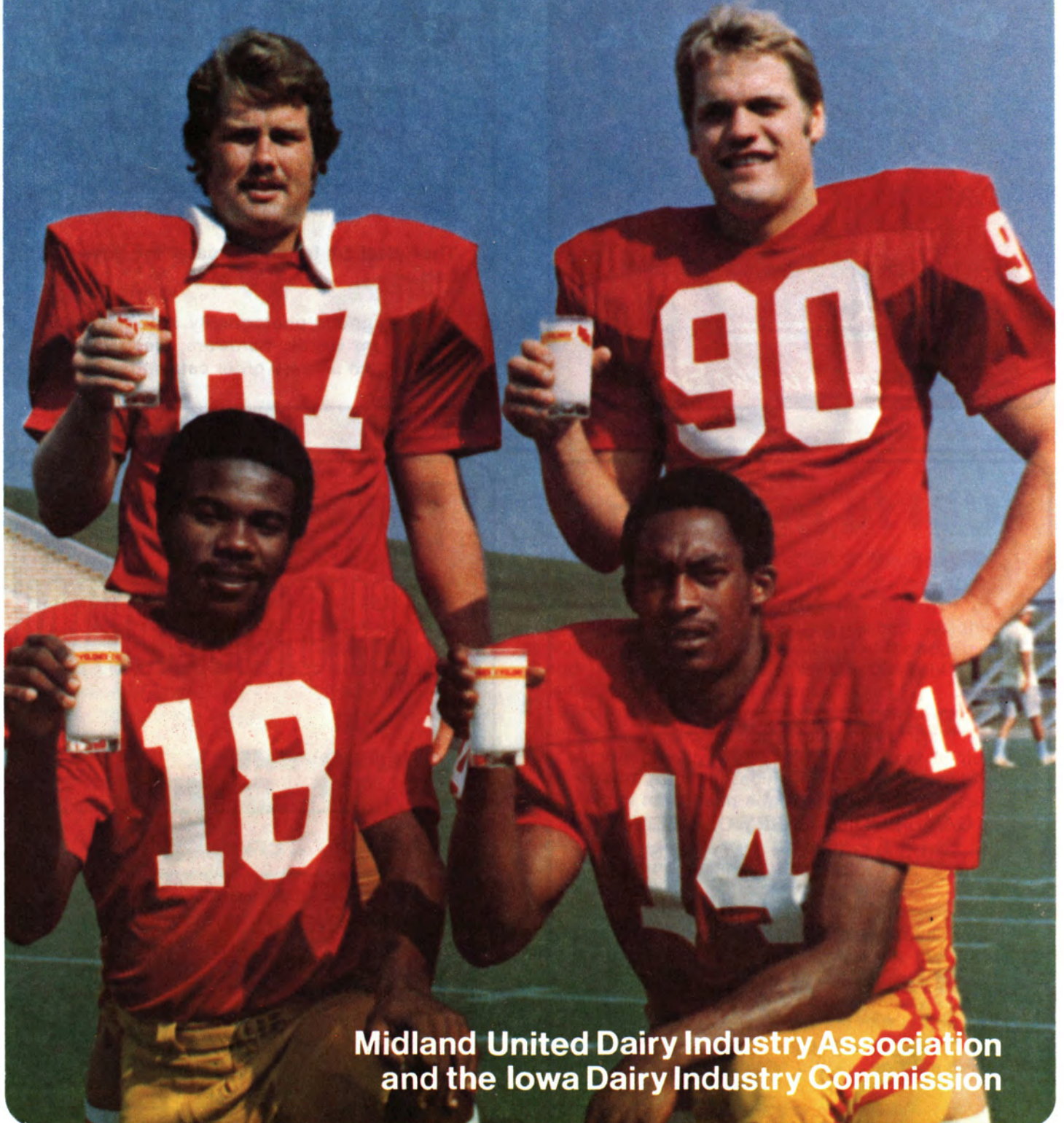
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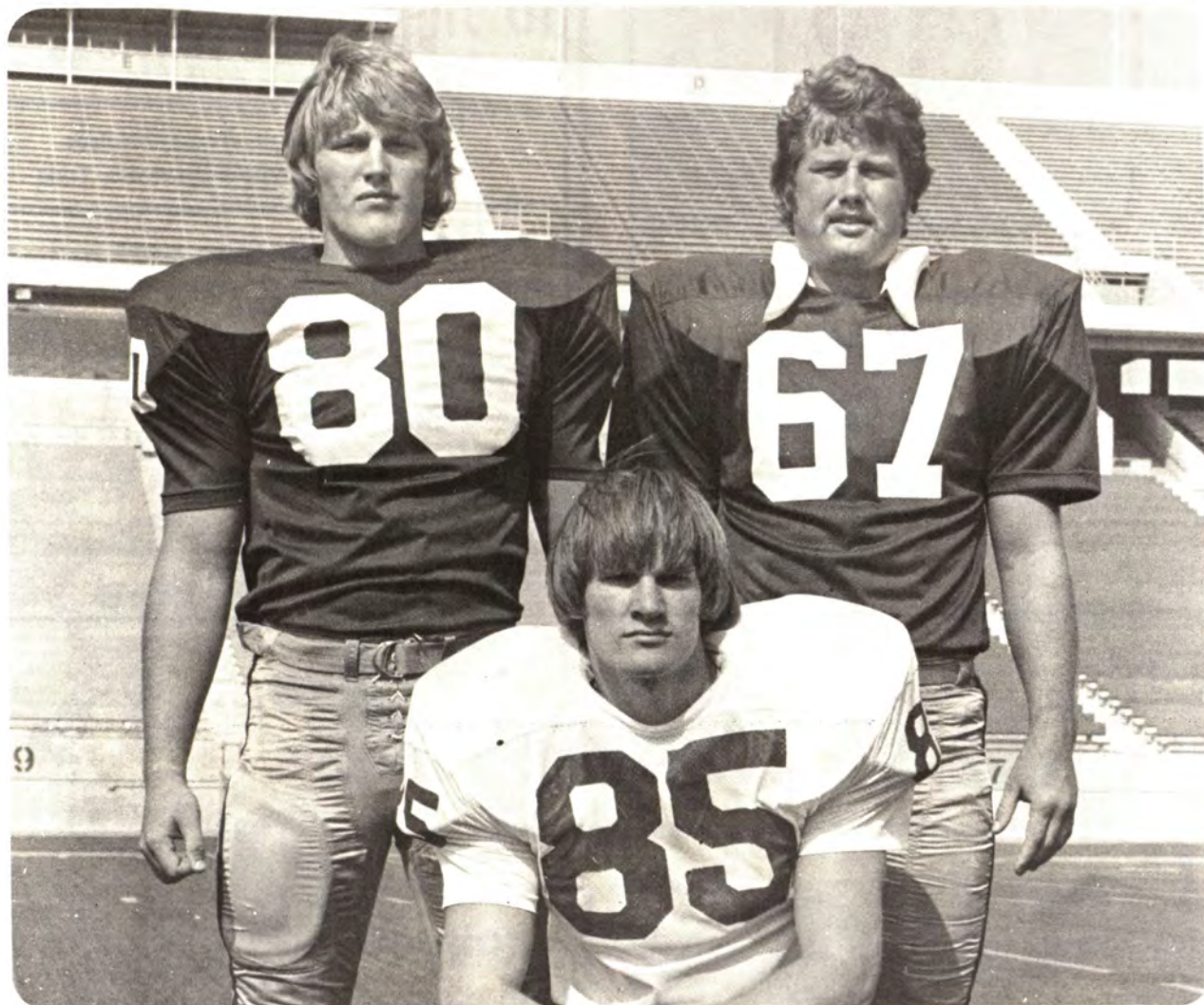
