WHAT THE SIGNALS MEAN



Holding. (Penalty—by offense, 15 yards; by defense, 5 yards.)



Offside or violation of kick-off formation. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Illegal forward pass. (Penalty 5 yards.)



Crawling, 5 yards; helping ball carrier, 15 yds.



Score—touchdown, field goal, or conversion.



Unnecessary roughness, clipping, or roughing the kicker. (Penalty, 15 yards and possible disqualification.) Running into kicker. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Player illegally in motion from shift or huddle. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Penalty refused, incomplete pass, missed field goal or conversion, both sides offside, etc.



Interference with forward pass. (If penalty on offense, 15 yards and loss of down. Interference by defense, ball to offense on spot of foul as first down.)



Safety.

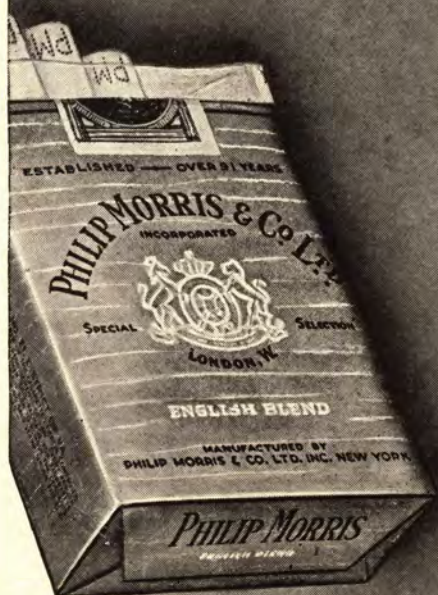

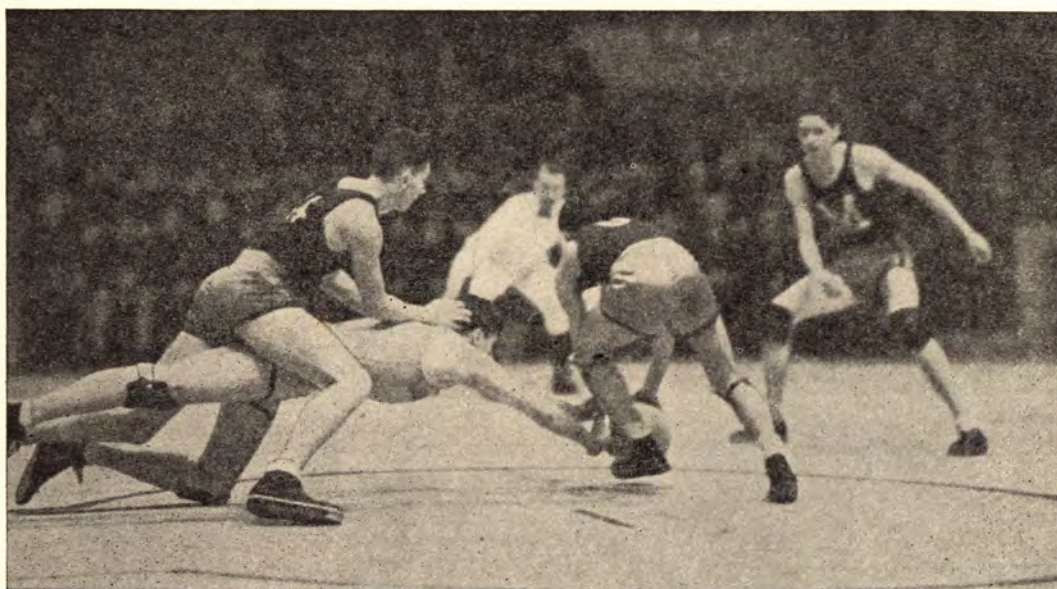
HOMECOMING SHOW

The Iowa State Marching Band has arranged a fine show for us today. The band will form at the

south end of the field with half the band forming a "V" outside of a block formed by the remainder of the band. After the fanfare, the band will march down the field and form "U of O" in honor of the visiting team. This formation is floated to the north end of the field where the band reforms into "ISC" and comes down the field playing the "Fight Song".

The band will then divide and form two grand pianos and play "Chopsticks" and a concert arrangement of "My Hero" by Oscar Strauss. A surprise formation is also promised along about this time.

The men behind this show are Alvin R. Edgar, and Harry E. Holmberg, of the Music department. Prof. Edgar is starting his twelfth season as director of band and orchestra at Iowa State College.

TIMM, HAUSS, SUTHERLAND, KERR, MICHALSKE

It is a new Iowa State Staff which is handling Cyclone football this year despite the fact that each of the men have served here prior to this season.

It just happens that this is the first year Mike Michalske has had his full staff available since 1942.

With Headman Mike bossing the job, the rest of the varsity duties are assigned as follows: backfield coach, L. C. (Cap.) Timm, for 12 years a member of the department; Doug Kerr, end coach who was on the staff in 1941; Jim Hauss, line coach, who was on the staff in 1943 and part of 1944 while serving with the Iowa State Naval unit; and Clayton (Chick) Sutherland, another 1941 addition to the staff who is the "B" squad coach.

Mike Michalske, nor any of his staff for that matter, need much in the way of introduction to Iowa State football fans. But for the few who may not know enough here are a few facts about the staff.

Michalske is a graduate of Penn State, vintage of 1926. His home was Cleveland, Ohio. Played his first professional football with Red Grange and his touring Yankees. After two years he went to the Green Bay Packers to make grid history as the greatest guard of all time. Previous coaching experience gained at LaFayette, St. Norbet's and

Green Bay Packers after a broken back ended his playing career. Came here in 1942 as line coach and became head coach when Ray Donels resigned.

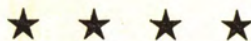
Cap Timm, Minnesota football and baseball letterman. Served as baseball coach and backfield coach here before entering the Navy in 1943. Back on the job this spring he devoted his entire time to football and will resume his diamond duties in 1947.

Doug Kerr played his football at Michigan and DePauw, coached Tom Harmon as a high school star, and came to Iowa State in 1941. By the time the 1942 season had rolled around he was fighting in the Pacific in the Navy. Later he was commissioned and served as end coach at Iowa Pre-flight.

Jim Hauss was a Butler star and served as assistant football coach and golf coach there before entering the Navy. While on duty with the V-12 program here he offered his services as line coach. Made such a hit with Mike he was asked to return as soon as he was discharged.

Chick Sutherland, a Coe all-around star shortly after the first World War, came to Iowa State in 1941 as freshman coach. During the war years he demonstrated his versatility by assisting in basketball, coaching baseball, and serving as backfield coach.

Honor Past Captains Today

Prominent among the 15,000 spectators here for the thirty-fifth annual Homecoming contest are more than a score of the 51 men who have captained Iowa State College football teams.

Most of us will be watching the outcome of today's contest between Iowa State and Oklahoma. But for many of these honored guests other teams will be playing out there. The ghosts of other seasons will again score upset wins, will again go down to still bitter defeat.

Oldest of the captains—from the point of service—is I. C. Brownlie now in dental radiology. He

resides in Denver, Colorado. Brownlie was the first captain back in 1892. He was also the first coach.

Youngest of the captains to attend today—again from the point of service—is Meridith Warner, formerly of Des Moines and now living in Sioux City.

One former captain will not be sitting with the main body of one-time Cyclone leaders, although he'll be at the game. He is Chuck Wright who'll be at left guard some time during the course of the game. Wright was captain of the 1943 squad.
