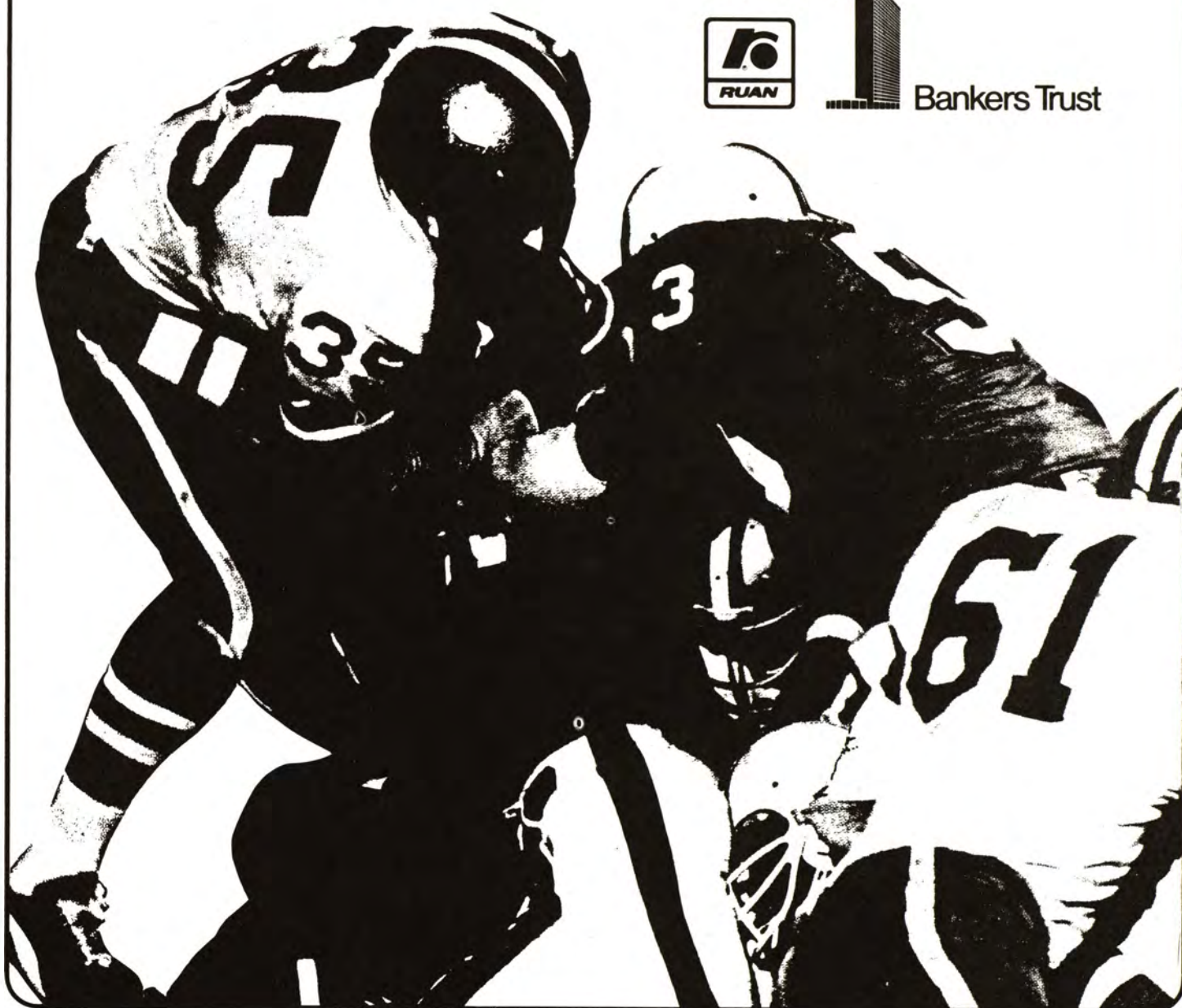

A New Stadium Becomes a Reality

October 26, 1973 -- less than two years ago -- saw the beginning of a new era for Cyclone football. On that date, on the hillside along Beach Avenue, ground was broken for one of the finest football arenas in the country, the new Cyclone Stadium.

Over the intervening months, heavy earthmoving equipment shaped the embankments that would soon be lined with 42,000 seats; a monstrous crane hoisted the steel support beams and pre-formed concrete sections skyward; and a huge movable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of yards of cement.

The field was notched with ditches for an intricate underground drainage system; then ribbons of asphalt were laid, providing a solid floor for the synthetic playing surface.

Cardinal and gold fiberglass seats were installed this past spring, and wide ribbons of AstroTurf were stretched from wall-to-wall, adding even more color to an already colorful scene.

As the beehive of men and machines sculpted this exciting facility out of a 30-acre cornfield, thousands of Cyclone fans waited, watching every construction phase to see what would happen next. Few construction projects in this state have ever attracted more attention!

Those same Cyclone fans who have waited and



watched -- you, here in the stands today -- are the *real* reason for this new stadium's existence. As in the case of the Iowa State Center, thousands of persons have contributed generously to the fund drive which has brought this spectacular arena from a dream to reality -- all without use of any tax dollars.

The Iowa State University Foundation, has sponsored the ISU Center and Stadium projects -- but it has *not* built these beautiful facilities...*people* have. To date, approximately 15,000 persons and business firms have contributed to the fund drives which have provided perhaps the finest cultural and athletic complex anywhere in the country.

Thanks to the wise planning and dedication of the Foundation Board of Governors, and the generosity of alumni, students, faculty, and "friends" of Iowa State University, this entire "South Campus" success story has unfolded in just 10 years time!





The construction of this new stadium typifies the bold leadership provided by the Foundation Board and the loyal support of Iowa State Alumni and friends over the years. Construction began through a dramatic Board decision to move ahead even though the fund drive had just begun; Cyclone fans rallied in support of a priority seating plan that has raised millions of dollars; and several persons, including Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Olsen of Ellsworth, Iowa, have stepped forward with major contributions.

It's been an exciting story, and everyone who has shared a part can be justly proud of this new home for Cyclone football!

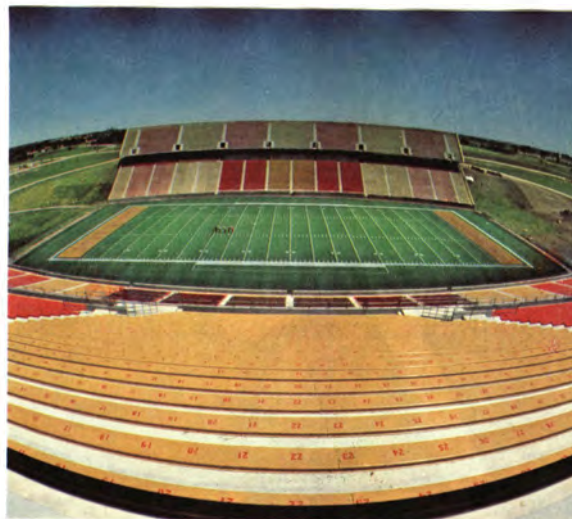

FOURTH IOWA STATE CENTER BUILDING DEDICATED TODAY

Perhaps the single greatest milestone in the history of Iowa State University was marked this morning in ceremonies dedicating the Carl H. Scheman Continuing Education Building and the completion of the Iowa State Center.

Now, more than 20 years after Dr. James Hilton envisioned a cultural center, one of the nation's finest facilities for education, the performing arts, and intercollegiate athletics has become reality. Since the first spade of earth was turned over in October, 1966, breaking ground for the C.Y. Stephens Auditorium, four beautiful and functional buildings costing \$19.5 million have risen out of a former 76-acre cornfield.

Taking their positions following the opening of the C.Y. Stephens Auditorium in September, 1969, were the James H. Hilton Coliseum (dedicated December, 1971), the J.W. Fisher Theater (dedicated January, 1974), and the Scheman Building, which will be one of this country's finest conference facilities.

The Scheman Building, containing 18 meeting rooms, a 400-seat

The four Center buildings, and the new Cyclone stadium, are projects of the Iowa State University Foundation. Established in 1958, the Foundation was organized and dedicated to planning and fundraising for these facilities, and other major capital projects to be determined in the future by the organization's Board of Governors.

Even more inspiring than the Center and stadium complex is the fact that thousands of generous alumni, students, business firms and corporations, and other friends of ISU have brought the "dream" of reality through their support. Costing a total of \$27 million, all five projects have been completed without a cent of federal or state tax funds. Fundraising work will continue, however, as several million dollars are needed to meet total construction costs.

C.Y. Stephens Auditorium



auditorium, food service facilities, and the spacious Henry J. Brunner Gallery will be the site of the 1976 World Food Conference.

The Scheman will be the home of the University's Extension programs, which presently attract more than 30,000 persons to campus annually. It will also house the ISU Center offices and the Center ticket office.

The popularity of the Iowa State Center buildings and their programs has been overwhelming. In only a half-dozen years the facilities have accommodated nearly 2½ million persons, including paid attendance, free events and tour groups.

The Center and stadium, along with the new \$25 million College College of Veterinary Medicine to the south, comprise what has become known as the ISU South Campus. Together they are moving Iowa State University in a new direction geographically, educationally, and culturally.

THIS MAN'S VISION NOW A REALITY

On September 15, 1954, Dr. James H. Hilton, then President of Iowa State College, first mentioned his aspiration for an Iowa State Center during remarks at the fall faculty-staff convocation.

Commenting on the much-needed facility, Dr. Hilton at that time said, "It probably will take years to complete. You may think I am unrealistic, a dreamer, a visionary or just plain crazy; but may I say to you that I have already been called all those things and some other things, too, about this project. If any of you feel that I should be discouraged in this venture, you should think up some other terms—because I am quite determined about this Center."

Today, 21 years later, Dr. Hilton has seen his dream fulfilled. "I didn't think it could all be done in my lifetime," he says. "The support of our alumni, businesses, and other 'friends' of Iowa State was just fantastic. I knew they'd give generously, but even I was surprised at their response. They can all take great pride in what they have accomplished—perhaps the finest cultural center in the world."

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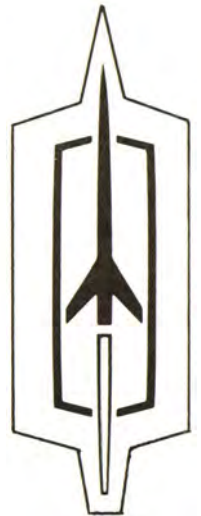

Stadium Dedication Marks New ISU Era

It's been a long time coming, often discussed and often dreamed. Many people have worked long and hard but today it all becomes reality. Iowa State's beautiful, new stadium is being dedicated.

Gone are the days of Clyde Williams Field, home of the Cyclones for 60 years. Everyone is eager for today's game, which will go down in Iowa State's athletic history as the beginning of a new era of Cyclone football.

One bit of the record book has already been rewritten. The school's all-time home attendance record has been broken with today's massive throng. The old attendance mark was 36,690 set in 1972 during the Nebraska game.

The souvenir programs, the brief dedication ceremonies prior to the kickoff and the colorful halftime festivities will all be memorable but the unveiling of the 1975 Cyclone football team to the home crowd will be the main attraction.

Both Iowa State and Air Force are coming off opening road losses to nationally rated opponents. The Cyclones bowed to UCLA, 37-21, in Los Angeles last week while the Falcons were shutout at powerful Arkansas, 35-0.

Iowa State showed many signs of being vastly improved this year in its opening game while the Air Force is also optimistic after last year's unlucky record (seven losses by less than seven points).

Both teams have already suffered one key injury to a member of the defensive unit. Iowa State's sophomore tackle, Mike Stensrud,

injured an ankle at UCLA and will be out indefinitely while the Falcons' end standout, Randy Spetman of Council Bluffs, Ia., broke an arm in pre-season drills. He made the trip as a co-captain but will not play.

Air Force is led offensively by tailback Ken Wood, who rushed for 78 yards against Arkansas, fullback Chris Milodragovich and southpaw quarterback Mike Worden, a solid run-pass threat.

Defensive leaders are T. G. Parker at cornerback and noseguard Dave Lawson, best known for his placekicking achievements. Lawson is nearing a national record for field goals (he has 38 and the NCAA record is 42) and points by a kicker (he has 177 and the mark is 212).

Iowa State got solid offensive efforts from several players last week. Split end Forry Smith, the team's offensive player of the game, caught five passes for 67 yards and a touchdown; fullback Jim Wingender rushed for 96 yards in just 14 carries; tailback Mike Williams scored twice and gained 67 yards and quarterback Buddy Hardeman rushed for 52 yards and was three for three in the passing department.

Defensively, middle guard Maynard Stensrud was the standout and was the team's nominee to the Big Eight Conference for player of the week consideration.

The Cyclones travel to Florida State and Utah before opening their league season Oct. 11 at Kansas State. The next home game will be Oct. 18 against Kansas.

Head Coach Earle Bruce is in his third year at Iowa State and after 20 years of coaching on the high school and collegiate levels is recognized as one of the finest coaches in the business.

Bruce, who won his 100th career victory last year, was three times named the Ohio prep "Coach of the Year" before becoming an assistant at Ohio State. He became head coach at the University of Tampa in 1972 and led the Spartans to a 10-2 record and bowl victory.

Keith Kephart has been on the ISU staff since 1968 and for the past two years has been the junior varsity head coach. The 1966 graduate of Dubuque has also played a major role in the Cyclones' recruiting efforts since his arrival.

Tom Lichtenberg coaches the Cyclone quarterbacks and wide receivers. He is in his second year on the staff after coaching at Morehead (Ky.) State and spending 13 years in the Ohio high school ranks. He is a 1962 graduate of Louisville.

Randy Hart directs the ISU de-

fensive tackles and middle guards, his second year with those duties after coaching the freshman team for one season. He had previously coached at Tampa for one year. He is a 1970 graduate of Ohio State, where he played in the Rose Bowl.

Tom Harper begins his second year as Iowa State's defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. A former head coach at Wake Forest, he has also served assistantships at Eastern Kentucky, Oklahoma State and Wake Forest. He is a 1955 graduate of Kentucky.

Glen Mason is the newest member of Bruce's staff and coaches the offensive tackles and tight ends. Mason came to Iowa State from Ball State and had also coached at Allegheny College after graduating from Ohio State in 1971.

John Wiley heads the Cyclone recruiting effort and also assists in coaching the tight ends, a position he played at the University of Pittsburgh. He coached at Iowa following his 1969 graduation from Pitt and came to ISU in 1974.

Tom Backhaus in charge of the offensive guards and centers at ISU after coming from the University of Tampa with Bruce in 1973. He is a 1970 graduate of Ohio State, teaming there with assistants Randy Hart and Glen Mason.

Charlie Lyle coaches the Cyclone secondary, his fourth year on Bruce's staff and third year at Iowa State. A 1962 graduate of Tampa, he had coached in the Florida prep ranks before going to Tampa.

Tom Vaughn a former All-America at Iowa State in 1964, returned to the campus in the spring of 1975 to direct the ISU running backs. Vaughn spent seven years with the Detroit Lions in the NFL and one year coaching in the World Football League before joining Bruce's staff. He is considered to be the best all-around back in school history.

Bob Tucker coaches the defensive ends at Iowa State. He came to Iowa State in 1973 after four years as an assistant at Wichita State. He is a 1965 graduate of Wooster College and coaches Ohio prep ball before moving to Wichita.

A History of Cyclone Football*First of a Series*

Barnstorming, Pop Warner Highlight Early Years

(Editor's Note: We would like to thank former Iowa State student Lyle Borg for much of the research done in this series. Borg, now with the Iowa Farm Bureau and Iowa Educational Broadcasting Network Bureau and Iowa Educational Broadcasting Network, did extensive work on this subject during his undergraduate days.)

The campus was a youngster then, back in the late nineteenth century. Enrollment was small but growing and agriculture was the main classroom topic.

During these early industrial years at Iowa State, there was little time or interest for sports. Games were looked on as frivolous, youthful and distracting, especially when athletics could provide no more than what the regular studies and military program already provided. The only athletics engaged in was the brief recreation period after supper and an occasional baseball or football game.

Through intramurals, football soon became the main competitive sport with games played between the classes. The winner of the classes would then challenge outside schools to see who had the best team in Iowa. As interest grew among the students, they decided to venture out on their own organizing athletic associations and providing the necessary equipment.

A faculty representative was chosen who became the athletic director, and the students themselves were coaches until a full time coach was available. The father of intercollegiate athletics, however, was the intramural programs.

Ira C. Brownlie led the way for English rugby football at Iowa State although football had been played informally on campus since the late 1870's. Brownlie, who had played football at Eureka College in Illinois, became the moving spirit, serving as captain and providing such coaching as his experience suggested and as his teammates would tolerate. Without expert training and coaching, some of the players had to take over the coaching chores.

Although enthusiasm for the new game grew rapidly, the men were quite reluctant to continue regular training. An article in the *Iowa State Student* explained the problem as "association, plenty of ground, two footballs and a hundred dollars -- in fact everything but players."

When teams became competitive there appeared such needs as equipment, money and standards of participation. Consequently, \$200 and 12 acres of land were set aside for the development of an athletic field west of Morrill Hall. Training was done in a basement room equipped with an iron tank supplied from a cold water hydrant. Money to meet expenses was secured from gate receipts and equipment was purchased on credit from sympathetic merchants.

Almost everyone was eligible to play college football. College teams scheduled games with anyone they could -- rival institutions, town organizations and athletic clubs with professional or semi-professional players.

Players were hired and athletes from one college joined forces with neighboring institutions on a barn-storming trip. An exchange of players was quite common between Iowa State and State University. When the Cyclones had an important game coming up with out-of-state rivals, athletes from Iowa City would come and help out their fellow Iowans, while Ames would return the favor later in the season. Many coaches played with their eleven as late as 1901, especially when the opponents were thought to have hired professionals to strengthen their cause.

The first recorded game, which was played in 1892 just south of the Campanile, resulted in a 6-6 deadlock with State Center. Iowa State tasted its first victory that year with an 8-0 victory over the Des Moines Y.M.C.A.

W. P. Finney, a star at Purdue and Chicago, became the first professional coach for Iowa State. In 1893 his main task was to introduce varsity techniques to prepare his team for the tough competition on the outside.

Finney directed the team through six victories while losing just once. The first game was played at Webster City against a team from Fort Dodge. Only twice in the game did Fort Dodge gain the necessary five yards in four downs while Iowa Agricultural College lost the ball only once on downs in winning, 46-0.

The only loss that season came during a cold rain storm at Grinnell when the small I.A.C. backs were unable to dodge the "big brutes" from Grinnell because of the slippery turf. The aggies lost 14-6 and wanted another try at Grinnell on dry land but Grinnell declined.

The largest score of the season came when I.A.C., spurred on by Van Campen, beat Panora, 66-0. During the season the team scored 180 points while the opponents could muster just 24.

Iowa State still known as Ames played the Iowa Hawkeyes for the first time and upset them, 16-8. Burt German, an Iowa standout in 1891 with the record of scoring the most touchdowns in one game, came to Ames and served as coach and captain of the I.A.C. eleven. He scored over half the points the I.A.C. eleven. He scored over half the points against Iowa and became a main factor in the growth of early football and other athletics in Ames.

A further example of player switching between the two state schools came in 1895 when Joe Meyers came to Ames to help defeat his own Hawkeye team.

Two important features of Iowa State athletics went

down in history during the 1895 season -- Coach Glenn "Pop" Warner and the nickname Cyclones.

A great master of the game, Pop Warner came to Ames for four to six weeks before taking over his regular duties at eastern universities Georgia and Cornell. Warner led the team through early season drilling which paid off when Iowa State defeated Northwestern on Sept. 28 by a score of 36-0. A phrase used in the *Chicago Tribune's* game account gave Iowa State its nickname. The sports writer wrote, "Northwestern might as well have tried to play football with an Iowa cyclone as with the Iowa team it met yesterday."

At the end of 50 minutes of play the big, husky farmers from I.A.C. had rolled up 36 points while Northwestern could get no nearer the Cyclone goal than the 15 yard line.

Warner led the Cyclones through five successful seasons, during which he would coach at Georgia and Cornell for several months and then return to Ames for a month or so. On one of his trips to Iowa State, he bet money on the Cyclones when they played a team of professionals from Butte, Mont.

At the half of the game, played in Butte, I.A.C. trailed 10-0 so Warner, a past captain of the Cornell team, put on a uniform and played the second half as the Cyclones rallied for a 12-10 victory. (The *Bomb* reports that Iowa State walked off the field and forfeited the game when the rowdy miners began shooting their guns at poor official's rulings).

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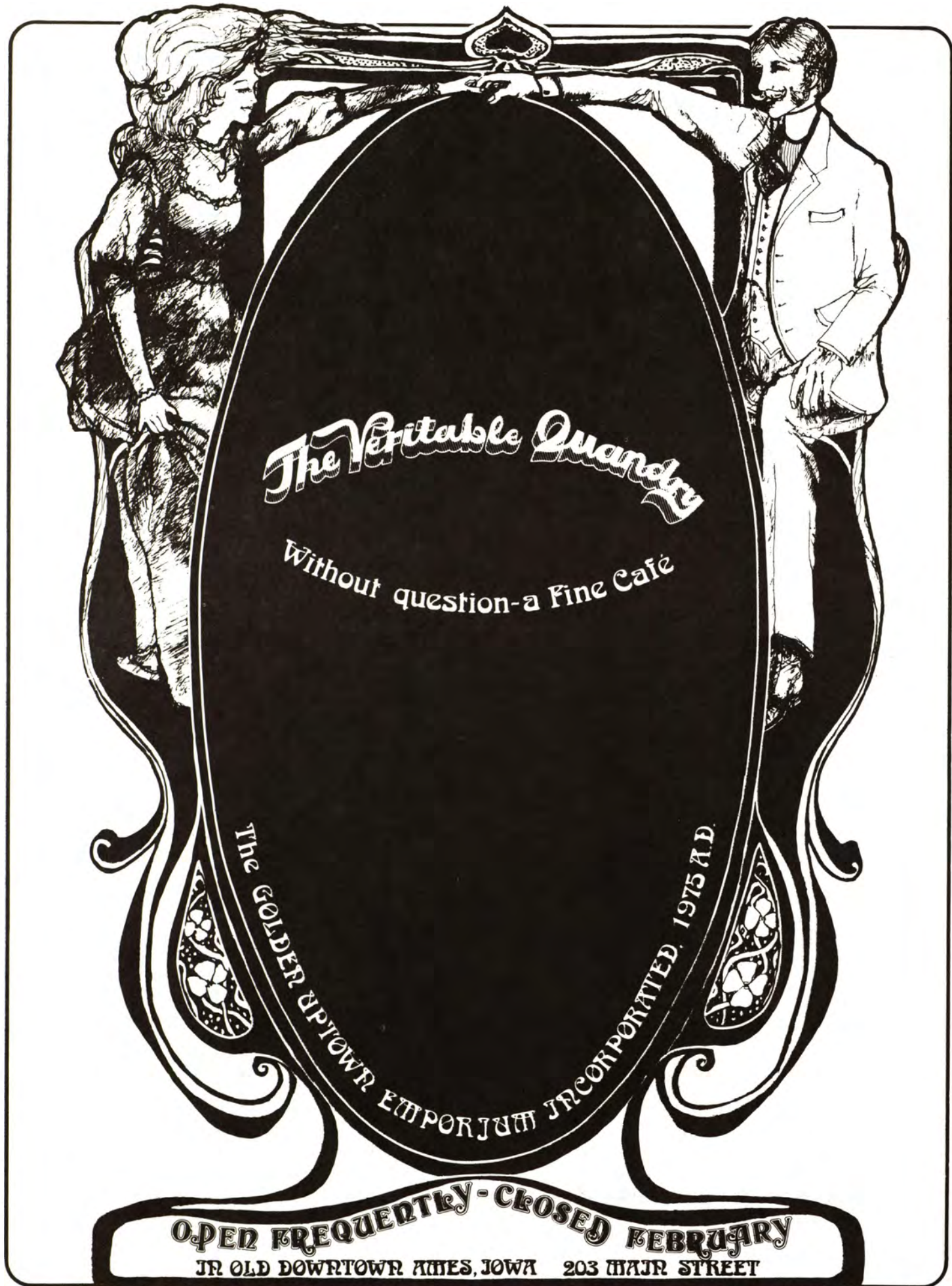

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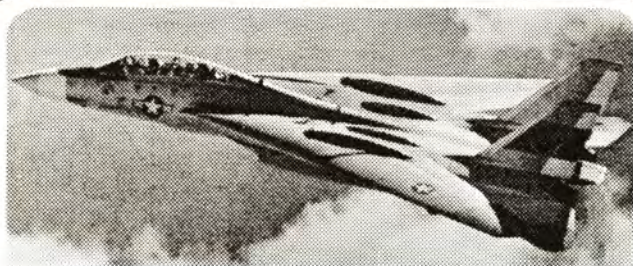

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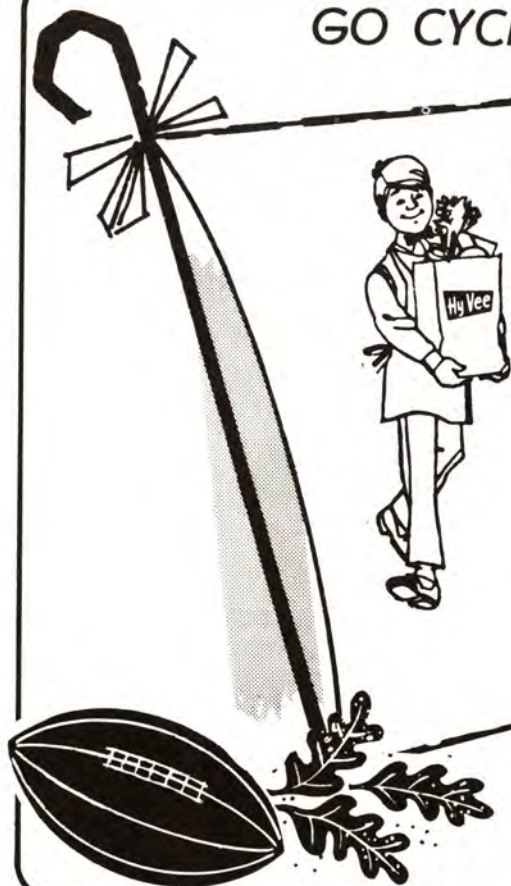

THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY

The United States Air Force Academy is neither an engineering nor a liberal arts college, but combines certain elements of both. It may be accurately described as a school which endeavors through its mission to give each cadet the knowledge and qualities of leadership required of an officer in the United States Air Force and a basis for continued development throughout a lifetime of service to his country, leading to the readiness for responsibilities as a future air commander.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY MISSION

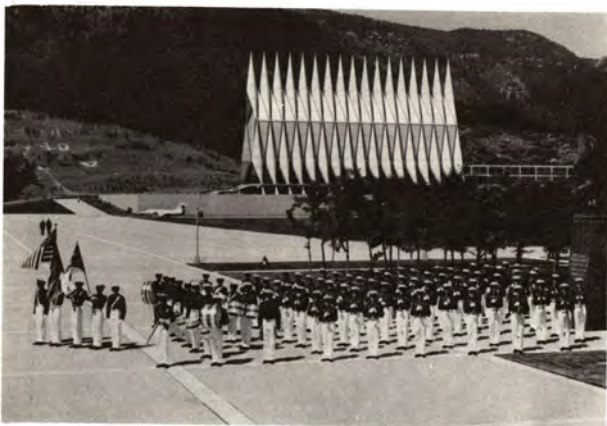
To provide instruction and experience to each cadet so that he graduates with the knowledge and character essential to leadership and with the motivation to become a career officer in the United States Air Force.

A cadet who completes four years at the Academy will graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree and earn a commission as a second lieutenant in the Regular Air Force.

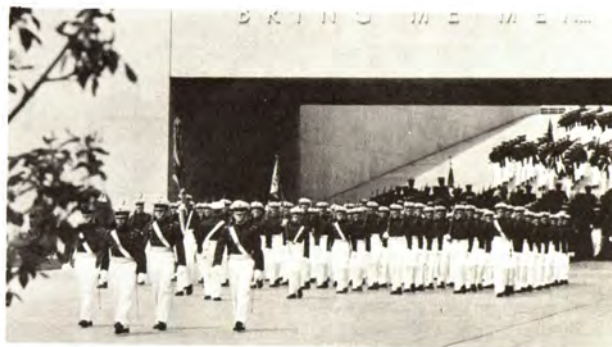
The Academy site, which covers 18,000 acres, is located approximately 10 miles north of Colorado Springs, Colo., at the base of the Rampart Range of the Rocky Mountains. The area was selected from applications from nearly 22 states and was founded on April 1, 1954 with the first class being recieved on July 11, 1955 and graduated in June 1959. Since that time, more than 8,000 cadets have taken their posts as commissioned officers in the United States Air Force. In that time, the Academy has produced two Air Force flying aces, 20 Rhodes Scholars and 170 All-Americans in 19 years of varsity athletic competition, including 12 during the 1974-75 school year.

Presently there are 11 major structures at the Academy, including the Cadet Chapel, which is annually one of the largest tourist attractions in the Pikes Peak region.

Also included at the Academy are some of the finest athletic facilities in the country. This includes the Cadet Fieldhouse, measuring 396 feet by 426 feet, over half of which is a multi-purpose area containing a Tartan floored basketball court, which seats 6,600; an indoor varsity ice hockey area with seating for 3,400; and a six-lane

one-sixth mile indoor track which encircles an Astro turf infield which can be used for a variety of athletic purposes. In addition, the separate Cadet Gymnasium, which has four levels, houses 18 handball courts plus rooms for competition in boxing, wrestling, weight training and gymnastics. There are also two indoor swimming areas, one olympic size, and contains an area for diving from one and three meter boards as well as a five and 10 meter platform.

Outdoor facilities include 45 athletic fields used for some of the 18 varsity and 16 intramural sports played at the Academy. There is also an 18-hole golf course, with construction already begun on a second 18 holes. One of the most versatile areas of the Academy is Falcon Stadium, Air Force's football stadium, which seats 49,068 spectators.

During the 1974-75 athletic season, 12 Air Force cadets were chosen as All-Americans, including football's Dave Lawson, number 64, who set a national collegiate record last fall by kicking 19 field goals. The Air Force track team set a world record last February with a 27.6 clocking in the 240-yard shuttle hurdle relays.

CYCLONE SCOUTING REPORT

The Air Force Academy will present a well-balanced challenge to Iowa State this afternoon. Typical of Ben Martin's Falcon teams, Air Force is a disciplined club that makes very few mistakes -- fumbles, interceptions, penalties and the like.

The Falcons use a multiple offensive scheme with the basic attack featuring the slot with split running backs.

Quarterback Mike Worden is a smooth signal-caller rated as a good runner and passer. He will be one of the few southpaw quarterbacks Iowa State will see.

The Air Force rushing attack is led by tailback Ken Wood, who gained 78 yards last week against Arkansas' stingy defense and fullback Chris Milodragovich, a bruising ball-carrier who can pick up the tough yards inside.

Defensively, Air Force also uses multiple schemes with a 52 defense as the base. The heady Falcons often change alignments at the last moment in order to confuse the opposition.

Cornerback T. G. Parker leads the unit and is one of the best all-around athletes on the team. He is a track star and last year was on an Air Force relay team that set a world record.

Noseguard Dave Lawson leads the interior and also is a premier placekicker. He is nearing a national record for career field goals, he enters the game with 38 and the NCAA record is 42. He is also nearing a kick-scoring mark, his 177 points are closing in on the record of 212.

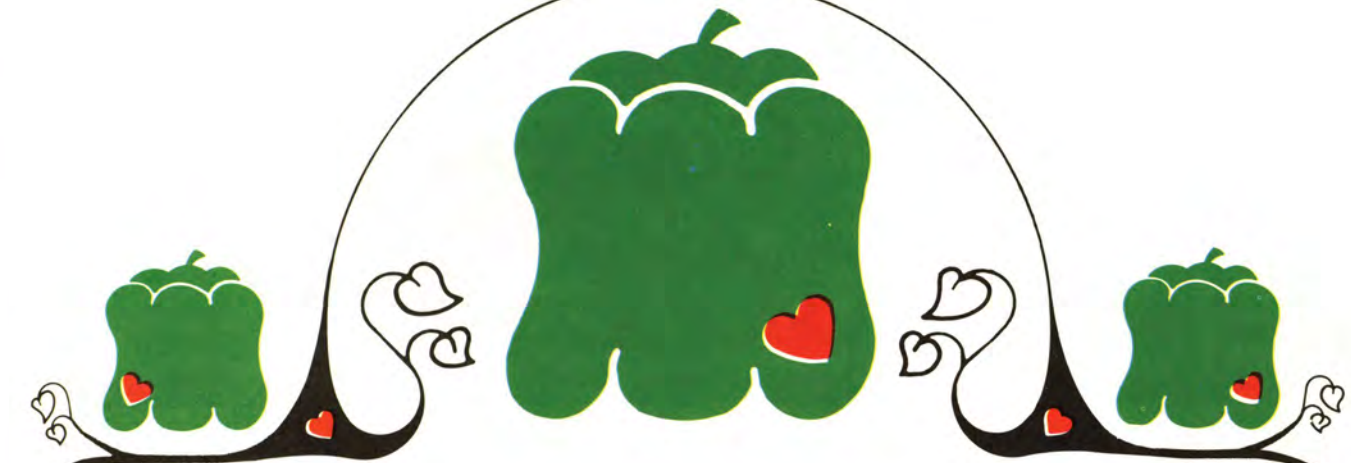

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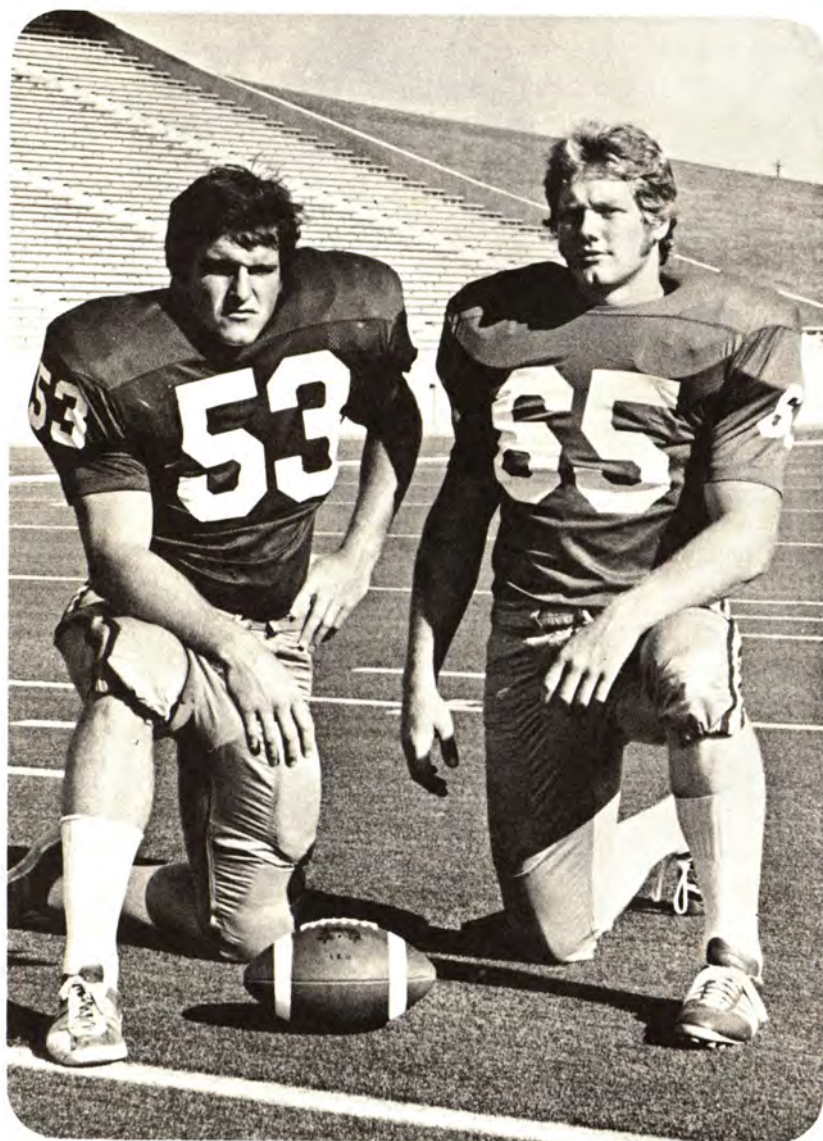

More Students, Parents Attend ISU Orientation

The attendance was an increase of 207 students and 160 parents over a year ago, continuing to show a reversal of a trend in reduced parent interest in orientation in recent years. The totals include students registered for pre-veterinary medicine in the College of Sciences and Humanities.

The program is for incoming freshmen and new transfer students with a portion of the schedule designed to acquaint parents of new students with the university.

During orientation students completed tests, visited with counselors, and arranged academic programs for the first quarter of college work.

The summer visits give students more time in the fall to become familiar with the campus, to find classrooms, and to participate more fully in activities during the first week of school.
