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● CYCLONE SCOUTING REPORT

Iowa State fans will be looking at the coach who has, next to Oklahoma, made the most effective use of the Wishbone offense.

Rudy Feldman, who started his coaching career as an assistant at Iowa State in 1957, has seen his Lobos finish second to the Sooners for the past two years in total offense and rushing. The offense must have an above average quarterback, a hard-hitting, hard-blocking fullback, and a couple of running backs (or more) who can run faster than any back has a right to run.

That is the way New Mexico styles its Wishbone.

The quarterback is new but capable of being a great one—Bruce Boone. The crunching full back is there (212-pound Rich Diller). The left half is a transfer (Bob Barber, 1971 JC All-American) with excellent speed.

But it is that right halfback that causes the real trouble—no matter

how good the other three backs are. Fred Henry is the hub of the Lobo attack. He has gained more than 2,000 yards so far in his 2 years plus 2 games at New Mexico.

New Mexico prefers to run but can throw and will. Might throw more this year but still look for the Wishbone to be a running attack.

Feldman features a 52 defense built around the middle guard. There is excellent experience but the lack of proven depth is a worry to the Lobos. George Oakes is the key to the line at left tackle with Greg Jones handling the middle guard spot.

Defense has been a problem for the Lobos who score a lot but who have given up an average of 24 points per game over the past two years. At the same time they have scored 31 points per game. Explosive is the word for the Lobos.

Cyclones Go After the Lobos

Victory No. 3 is the goal of the Cyclone football team this afternoon. A win over New Mexico this afternoon would give the Cyclones a string of eight straight victories over teams from the Western Athletic Conference. The string could be called eight right now except that Colorado State, the loser to the Cyclones in 1970, had not rejoined the conference at that time.

Iowa State has had extra connections with New Mexico in each of the four games they have played. Bill Weeks, one of the truly great Cyclone quarterbacks, was the coach at New Mexico when the two teams first met. Weeks handed his alma mater a 10-9 defeat in 1965 but bowed by 17-12 when he brought the Lobos to Ames two years later.

Rudy Feldman, who had his first college coaching experience at

Iowa State in 1957, has been the Lobo mentor in the last two encounters.

Johnny Majors figures today's game will be the toughest so far this season. New Mexico is one of the teams that has exploited the Wishbone offense almost as well as powerful Oklahoma. Feldman, incidentally, coached at Oklahoma and Colorado before taking charge at New Mexico in 1968.

Fred Henry, who ranks as the all-time rushing leader at New Mexico, has gained more than 2,000 yards running in a little over two seasons. He is a most dangerous and exciting runner. How well the Cyclones do today will be largely determined by how well they can contain this native of New Mexico.

Iowa State has shown a strong tendency to get tougher and tougher the longer the game goes so far this season. So far in two games the Cyclones have scored just one first quarter touchdown. But after that they seemingly settle down and get real serious about the job of winning the game. They have scored 21 points in the second period, 23 in the third, and 34 in the fourth quarter.

Incidentally, you'll notice that when that fourth period comes around every Cyclone player and coach seems to be waving. A close count will show that they are waving four fingers just to remind each other that the fourth quarter belongs to the Cyclones!

Despite the loss of such great players as Matt Blair, Keith Krepfle, Henry Lewis, Larry Marquardt and Jerry Moses for parts or all of the first two games, the Cyclones have functioned fairly well. The consistency that John Majors feels must come if the Cyclones are to be a winner, is not there yet. But players and coaches alike are working overtime to mature the sophomores and transfers so that the cool confidence needed to challenge for the Big Eight title will be acquired.

Mike Strachan is the leading rusher so far with a 6.3 average and a total of 270 yards. A sophomore, like Strachan, is Don Greenwood who has caught 12 passes so far as he fills in for the injured Krepfle.

The defense is more experienced and it is showing most of the time. So far there have been seven pass interceptions, for instance. Enemy ball carriers have been tossed for 53 yards of losses and permitted to gain only 264 yards on the ground.

Today ought to bring another exciting football game. New Mexico is a high scoring team. The Cyclones have shown more explosiveness than consistency. So it ought to be a fan's delight.

Iowa State will not play again until Oct. 14 when Colorado will try to use the Cyclones for a homecoming victim in Boulder. The next home game will be the parents day contest with Kansas State Oct. 21.

Telecommunicative Arts Scholarship Winner

Teresa Beer, Telecommunicative Arts senior, examines her scholarship check for \$1,250 dollars from the National Association of Broadcasters with her faculty adviser and Director of Telecommunicative Arts' training program, Dr. George P. Wilson, Jr. Teresa was one of four students in the nationwide competition who received the grants, which are awarded in memory of Harold E. Fellows through the NAB, and the Association for Professional Broadcasting Education. Teresa has been working as a production assistant on WOI-AM-FM-TV under the guidance of Dorcas Speer, Women's Editor at WOI-AM-FM-TV. Teresa is one of seventeen women in the Telecommunicative Arts program, which has an enrollment of more than 100 students. Telecommunicative Arts is a division of the Department of Speech, where students also have the option of doing the major portion of their academic work in the areas of Theater, Rhetoric and Public Address, or Speech Correction.

Iowa State University is unique among the more than 200 American colleges and universities that offer academic programs in Radio, Television, and Film. It is the only

one that owns and operates a commercial network-affiliated station that allows its students ready access to its studios, equipment, and staff. Because of the unique opportunities offered by the WOI stations, the Iowa State Telecommunicative Arts student obtains more practical experience in conceiving, writing, producing, directing, and partici-

pating in television and radio programs and films than do students in academic programs in other institutions.

Johnny Majors, the Big Eight Football Coach of 1971, has brought the Cyclones to the top in the football world. Majors was a Tennessee All-American and one of the all-time great Vols. He coached at Tennessee, Mississippi State, and Arkansas before he started rebuilding football fortunes for the Cyclones. A real winner.

Jackie Sherrill, assistant head coach, was a top line-backer at Alabama. He has coached at Alabama, and Arkansas before joining Majors at Iowa State. He ranks with the best as a defensive coach.

Joe Avezzano, the offensive line coach, has the job of rebuilding the Cyclone forward wall. He played at Florida State, took time out to play a couple of years of professional ball, then began a coaching career that brought him eventually to Iowa State.

King Block, offensive backfield coach. A great high school and college player, Block has coached at Idaho, his Alma mater; Arkansas State, Nebraska, and Washington State. He was head man at Arkansas State. He joined Majors in 1968.

George Boutselis, defensive end coach. Played his football at North Carolina. Coached at North Carolina, Cincinnati, and Maryland before joining the Cyclone staff this past spring.

Jim Dyar, defensive line coach. A Houston graduate and an Alabama native. Drafted by the Atlanta Falcons, he later returned to Houston then came to Iowa State three years ago.

Jerry Fiat, scout team coach. One of Johnny Majors' finest linebackers and a former Cyclone captain. Fiat works with the "card team" and does a share of the scouting of future Cyclone foes.

Ray Greene, receivers coach. Greene is a football, track graduate of the University of Akron. Has coached in high school, been the Akron recreation director, and coached at Akron and Miami before joining the Cyclones in 1969.

George Haffner, offensive coordinator. Played at Notre Dame, then went into the service and finished at McNeese. Played for the Baltimore Colts at quarterback. Won a state title as the Lake Charles, La., coach before coming to Iowa State in 1969.

Keith Kephart, freshman coach and coordinator of scouting and recruiting. Football, track letterman at Du-buque, coached in Illinois before joining Cyclone staff in 1970 after working with Majors as a grad assistant.

Bobby Roper, defensive secondary coach. Another protege of Majors, playing for Johnny at Arkansas. All-Southwest as a razorback. Coached at Wichita State, the Citadel, and Virginia before coming to Iowa State last spring.

Arch Steel, academic counselor. Works primarily with Cyclone kickers. Three sport star at Bowling Green. Coached in high school and at Eastern Michigan before joining Cyclones in 1954.

Frank Randal, head trainer. Baseball star at New Mexico State, later trainer and coach at New Mexico State, New Mexico Military, and Idaho. Became a part of the Iowa State program in 1970.

Keith Schroeder, graduate assistant. One of the best linebackers ever to play for Iowa State. All-Big Eight, co-captain of Iowa State's first bowl team. A 1972 graduate, Schroeder joined the Cyclone staff last spring.

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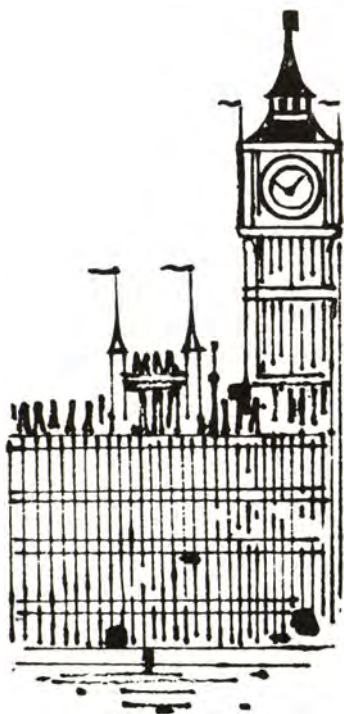
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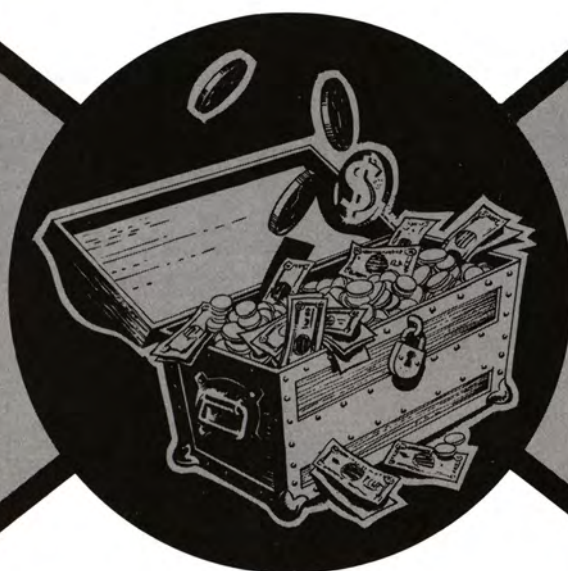

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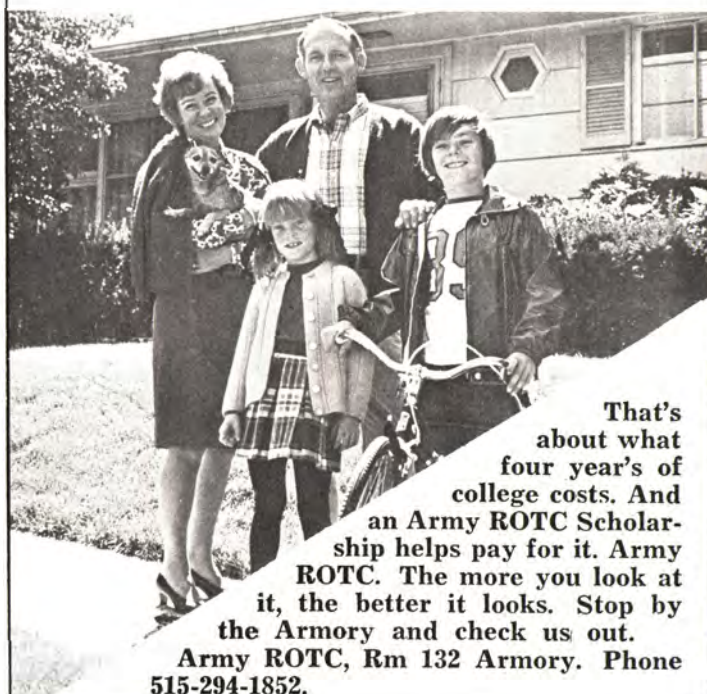

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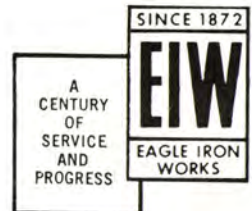
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ISU Theatre

Iowa State University Theatre has become an integral part of the curriculum for students seeking creative outlets in the performing arts by offering stage directing, acting, set construction, costuming, stagecraft and promotion. As one of the areas of the Department of Speech, ISU Theatre strives to enhance its own courses by updating current offerings and introducing new courses for a more balanced curriculum as well as encouraging its students to explore the other areas of the performing arts such as dance, television, and music. All Iowa State students have the opportunity to work with six different

major productions during the academic year plus various special theatrical projects conducted by individual students under faculty supervision and evenings of one act play presentations, all of which are open to the public.

The two major productions this fall are: "I Never Sang for my Father Oct. 10-14 and 17-21) and the mini-musical, "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown," Nov. 1-4 (Homecoming). "I Never Sang for My Father" will be the ISU Theatre entry for the American College Theatre Festival on a regional and national basis. Regional winners will

be invited to perform at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.

During the past academic year a scholarship fund was established in the name of Fredrica V. Shattuck, former faculty member and the "First Lady of Theatre" at Iowa State University. It is a scholarship which will aid students in the various areas of theatre during their four year tenure at ISU. This scholarship has been funded by students, faculty and patrons of ISU Theatre as another way of perpetrating the performing arts at Iowa State University.

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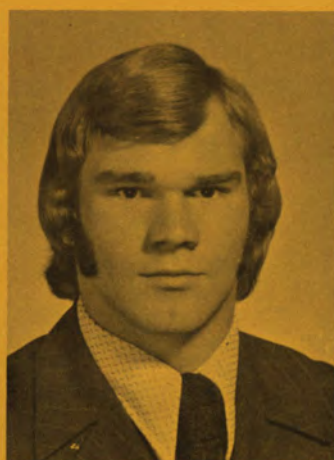




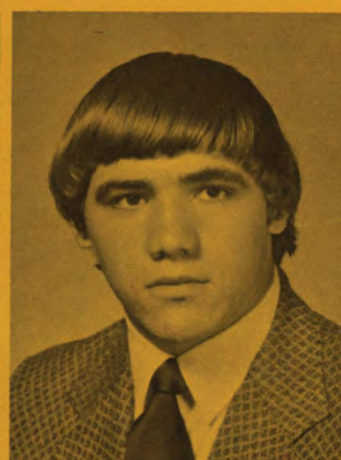
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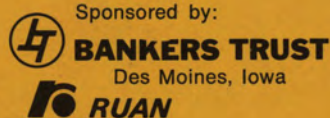
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About the University of New Mexico



Nearly half of all college students in New Mexico are enrolled at the University of New Mexico.

UNM, with its main campus at Albuquerque, has experienced an enrollment gain of more than 80 per cent in the last seven years, going from about 10,000 students in 1964 to more than 19,000 this year. The bulk of the student population is at the Albuquerque campus. Other student centers are a two-year branch college in Gallup, N.M., graduate and undergraduate resident centers in Los Alamos, N.M., and a center for study and research in Quito, Ecuador.

While UNM attracts students from around the globe, the majority come from New Mexican homes.

Enrollment is spread among 11 colleges and schools—University College, the Colleges of Arts and

Sciences, Engineering, Education, Fine Arts, Nursing, and Pharmacy, and the Schools of Law, Medicine, and Business and Administrative Sciences, and the Graduate School.

Nearly a quarter of UNM's enrollment is at the graduate and professional level. More than 3,000 students are enrolled in the Graduate School alone. The University offers the master's degree in 47 fields and the doctorate in 27 programs in the colleges of Arts and Sciences, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Law, and Medicine.

During its early years the University of New Mexico acquired an outstanding reputation for academic excellence in fields integrally related to its geographical location, such as Anthropology, Spanish Language and Literature, and Latin American Studies. Over the

years these strengths have been carefully preserved and expanded to bring UNM an international reputation in these areas.

The University has many ties with Latin America, in addition to the Andean Study Center—as much a UNM campus as the main one at Albuquerque—in Quito. The University has developed special teacher education programs, in Spanish, for educators at different levels from several Latin American nations, including Paraguay, Ecuador, Brazil, and Bolivia. In addition, it has now or has had cooperative arrangements with Colombia, Brazil, and Ecuador for long-term programs aimed at improving elementary and secondary teacher training and school plant facilities in those countries.

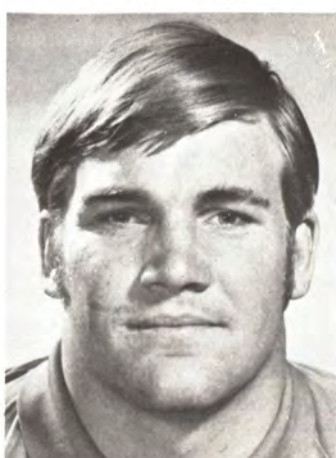

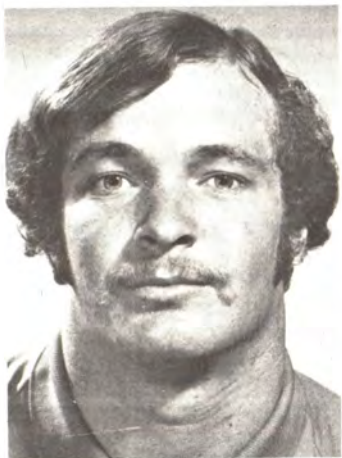

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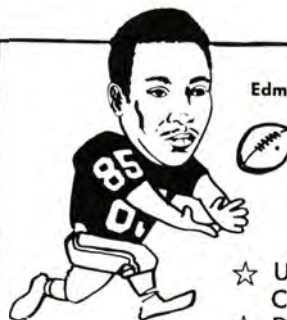
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
