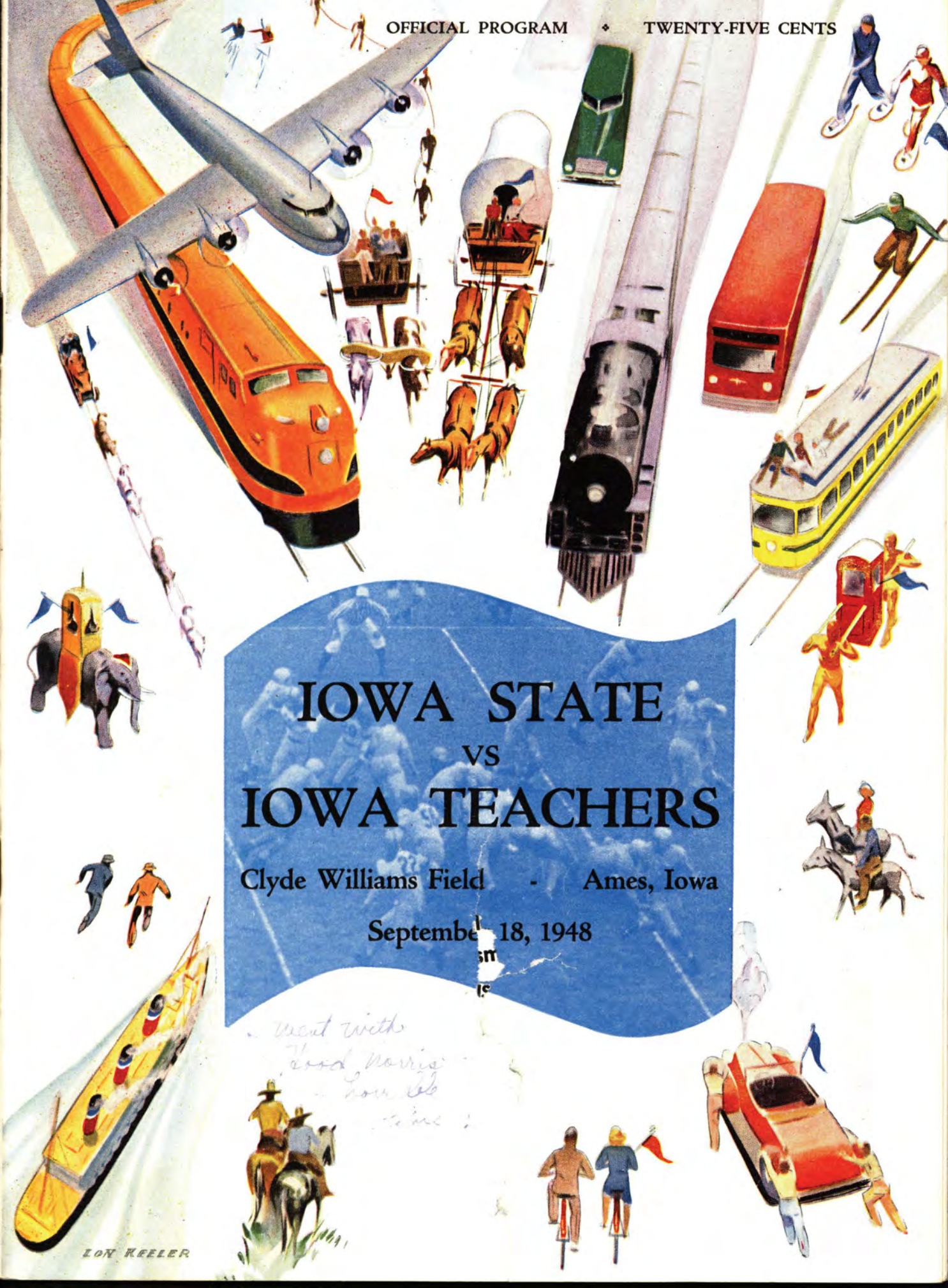

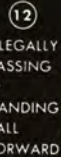

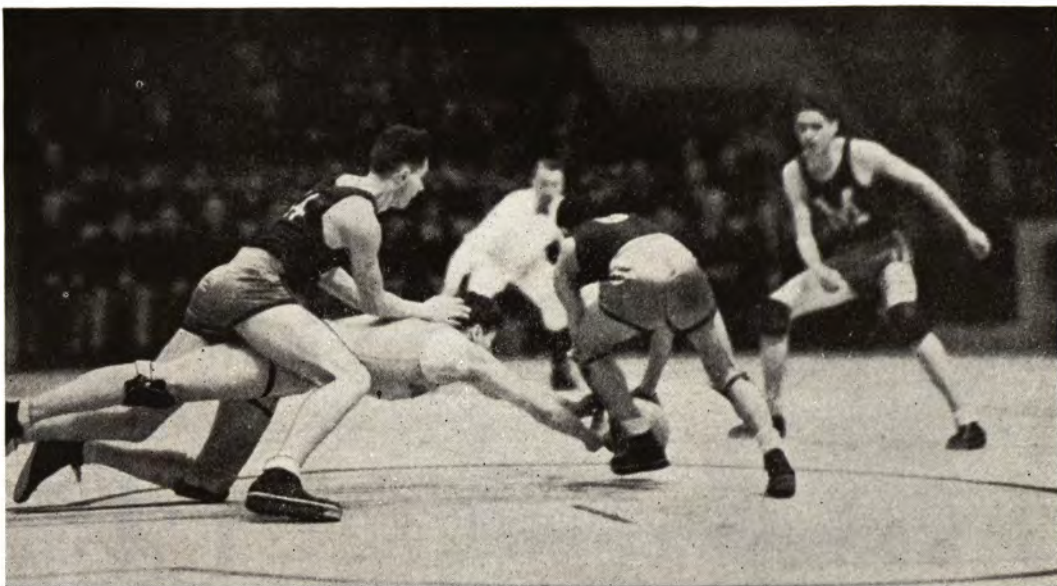

# PANTHERS AFTER WIN NO. 2



Back in 1900 the Iowa State Normal School threw a 5 to 0 surprise at the Iowa Agricultural College.

That 1900 victory represents the last time the Panthers—now representing Iowa State Teachers College—defeated the Cyclones—now called Iowa State College. But that's a situation Clyde L. Starbeck is planning to change this afternoon.

Starbeck has tried five times to score that second win and only in 1945 was badly trounced. In 1936 the Cyclones and Panthers fought to a muddy 0-0 tie. The following year it was the accurate toe of Ev Kischer that gave the Cyclones a 14-12 win. In 1945, the year the Teachers returned to football following the war, the score was 45-13 for Iowa State.

In 1946 it looked like the Panthers had finally come through for they had an 18-13 lead with 35 seconds to go. What's more they had possession of the ball! But a Panther fumble was recovered by Iowa State. Bud Willer and Ed Farni concocted a new pass play on the spur of the moment and Farni scored the winning touchdown in a 20-18 victory.

Last year the score was 31-14 for Iowa State by virtue of a brilliant passing game which saw Ron Norman complete 11 of 20 attempts and throw three touchdown tosses.

All that is history, though, warn confident Panther fans. Today is the day Iowa Teachers has designated as "THE" day.

But the same spirit which has counted eight wins against one loss and three ties is not going to let Cyclone gridgers enter the game as willing partners in Panther victory plans. Iowa State is figuring to win a ball game today, too!

The Cyclones want to keep right on adding to the Tutor loss string in the series. Never has an Iowa State team worked harder for an opening game than this year. There's no argument that Teachers will be tough but if they win they've got to play some great football—is the opinion of the Cyclone gridgers.

Another great incentive for victory for Iowa State is the record in opening games. The Cyclones have won 41 openers and lost but 12. Others in the opening day series have been ties.

Another bit of a look at the series record with Iowa Teachers shows that the opening game was in 1899 and was fought to a scoreless tie. The next year the Panthers won the 5-0 game and followed that by another tie in 1901.

In 1902,-04-05 Iowa State scored 52-0, 17-0, 28-0 victories. The next contest was played in 1916 and resulted in a 19-0 win for Iowa State.
