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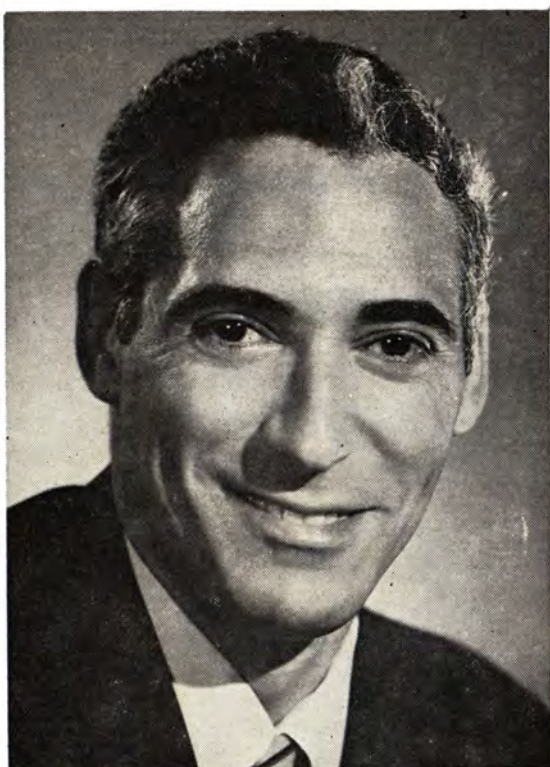
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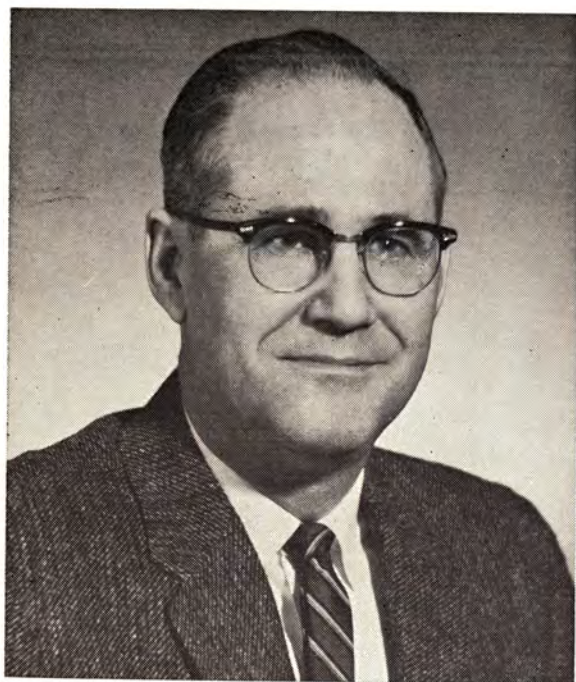

To Observe Horticulture Society Centennial

The 100th anniversary of the founding of the Iowa State Horticultural Society will be observed in a four-day celebration at Iowa State University from October 20 through October 23 in Memorial Union.

The Iowa Horticultural Society was organized on June 28, 1866, at Iowa City with 28 charter members. Prime purpose of the organization was to answer the needs of Iowa settlers who were dependent on orchards and gardens for a good share of their food and upon existing timberland for lumber, fuel and shade trees.

In the 1870's, experiment stations were set up in different sections of the state to promote work with new varieties of plants and to improve on the existing varieties. In the late 1870's, Iowa State University took over the operation of the experiment stations and their programs as a part of the educational program for which the University was established.

The first student horticulture club was organized at Iowa State University in 1900. The Horticulture Club was also the first departmental club for students at the university. The Horticulture Club sponsored

its first show in 1916 and has continued to do so on an annual basis, with the exception of a few years in the early history of the club.

Events will feature the State Flower Show presented by the Federated Garden Clubs of Iowa, Inc., The State Mum Show presented by the Iowa Chrysanthemum Society, the annual Horticulture Show presented by the Iowa State University Horticulture Club, the Iowa Nut Growers Association Show and the model beautiful garden arranged by the Iowa Nurserymen's Association.

Special exhibits will be sponsored by the Iowa Christmas Tree Growers Association, the Iowa Commercial Honey Producers Association, the Iowa Rose Society, the Iowa Fruit Growers Association, the Iowa Vegetable Growers Association, the Iowa Golf Course Superintendent's Association, the Iowa Irrigators Association and the Iowa Gladiolus Society.

The Centennial Celebration will also mark the crowning of the Horticulture Queen on Friday evening, October 21, at the Centennial dance. Theme for the celebration will be "Iowa's Horticultural Heritage."

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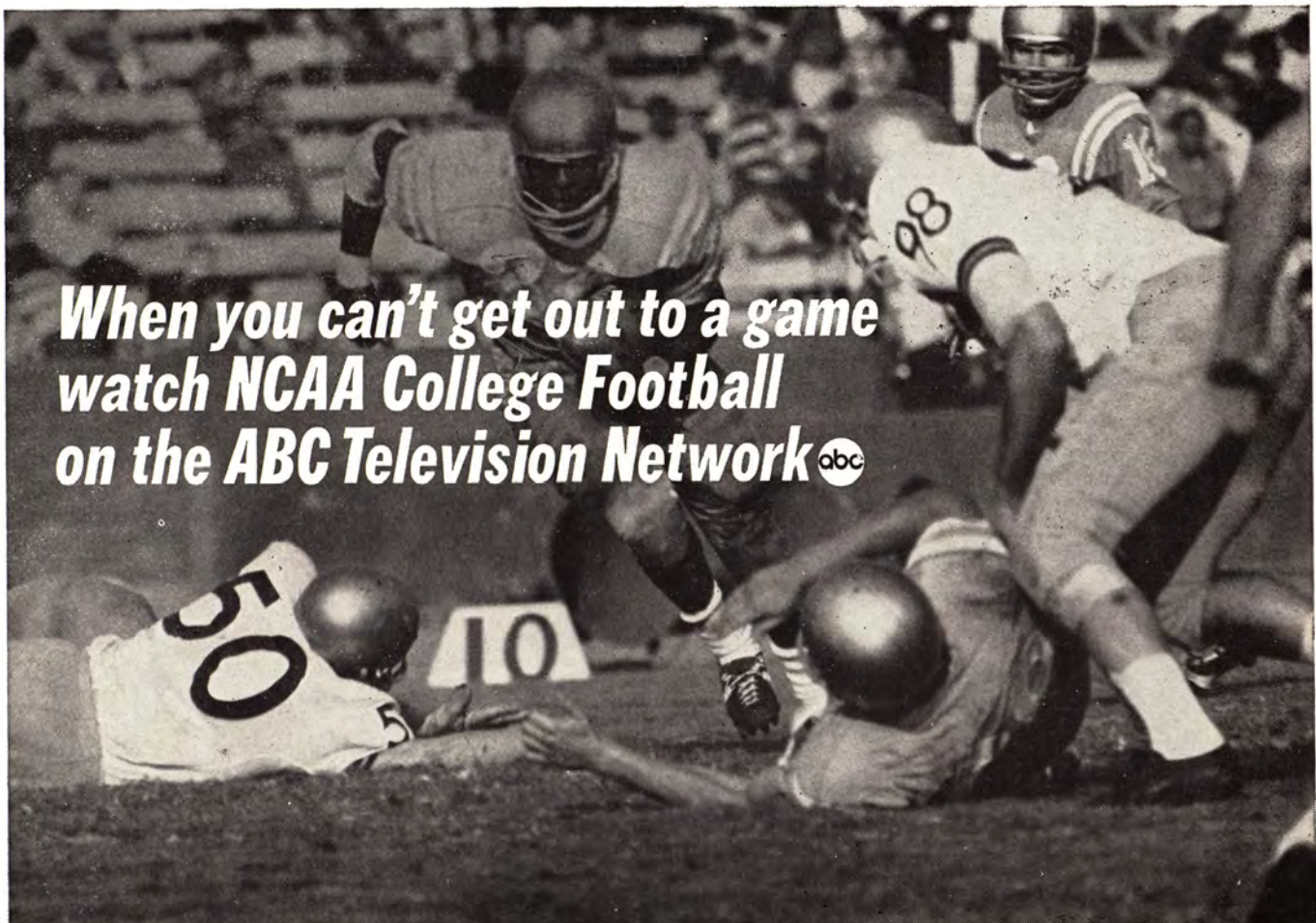

Cyclones, Buffs in Homecoming Clash

Today's homecoming crowd -- that may number as many as 25,000 -- can figure to see a pair of determined, stubborn football teams providing 60 minutes of gridiron excitement.

Iowa State has played improved football the past two weeks and gained a victory as a reward for those efforts when it bounced Kansas by a 24-7 score before some 22,000 parents day-state day fans. The Cyclones have regained both pride and faith in themselves and hope to add a homecoming win in this final contest of the varsity year in Ames.

After today's Big Eight encounter with Colorado, the Cyclones take to the road for five games, meeting Missouri, Oklahoma State, Kansas State, Arizona, and Colorado State.

Colorado, like the Cyclones, given good pre-season ratings that have proven just about as hard to live up to as those for Iowa State. Colorado played a terrific game, yielding just 47 yards, yet lost the opener to Miami, 24-3. The Buffs rebounded right after that and whipped nationally ranked Baylor, 13-7. Next was Kansas State for a 10-0 win. Last week in the final seconds of the game, the Buffs yielded to Oklahoma State, 11-10. The Cowboys scored late to make it 9-10 and then won on a two-point conversion.

So, from opposite points of view, both teams come into today's game primed for a fine contest. Iowa State, hoping to maintain the momentum that brought them pride in a close loss to Nebraska, and victory over Kansas. Colorado, determined to wipe out the memory of that last second loss to Oklahoma State.

So, as has so often been mentioned on this page in years gone by, the one certain winner today will be the fans in the stands. You will number from 23,000 to a possible 25,000, depending upon what kind of a sale there has been today. This will break the old record for attendance at an Iowa State-Colorado game in Ames. The old mark was 19,778 set the last time the

Golden Buffs were in Ames two seasons back.

While we are mentioning crowds, the Cyclones are certain to bring about the best home attendance in history. Every game has been witnessed by at least 20,000 (estimated) fans. The present crowd record for a 4-game season is 81,192. The most fans ever to witness home games at Iowa State came in 1962 when 85,982 saw five games. Both those marks went by the boards this afternoon. Chances are that the one season record of 256,180 for all games will also go since the five game figure is now 142,000 with five to go.

The homecoming honor team today is the 1941 group. The men who made up that team are seated on the honor stand at mid-field. LeVerne (Butch) Lewis captained that group, which was coached by Ray Donels, now the secretary of the National Cyclone Club.

A year ago the Buffs and Cyclones fought one of the finest games fans could ever want to see and wound up in a spine-tingling 10-10 draw. Colorado dominated the first half for a 7-0 lead. Slowly but steadily the Cyclones took charge in the final half. Steve Balkovek kicked a field goal and later added the extra point after George Maurer's diving touchdown catch of a Tim Van Galder pass. In the dying moments of the game the Buffs fought back to kick a tying field goal for the final 10-all count.

Neither team was happy about the draw so that, too will be a factor in Cyclone-Buffer efforts here this afternoon.

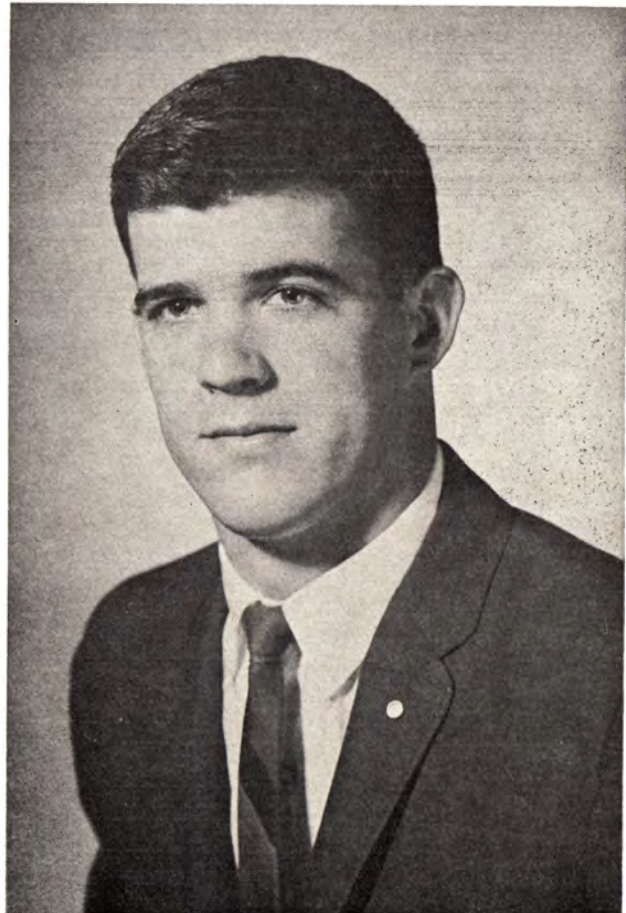

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About University of Colorado

Authorized by an act of the first territorial legislature in 1861 and opened on Sept. 5, 1877, the University of Colorado is located in Boulder, 27 miles northwest of Denver.

The enrollment on the Boulder campus has grown from an original 44 in 1877 to 15,500 this fall. An additional 13,000 students study at the Medical Center in Denver and at extension centers located in Denver, Colorado Springs and Grand Junction.

The University of Colorado's students come from all over the world. Every state in the union is represented in the student body along with 38 foreign countries and all U.S. possessions.

Located at the foot of the rugged Rocky Mountains in the shadow of the Flatirons front range, Colorado's campus setting and its beautifully-related architecture lend an ideal atmosphere to its outstanding

academic climate. The University offers a refreshing and lively academic approach to courses and research.

Colorado is composed of 12 schools and colleges and a student can major in any of 120 fields. The schools and colleges are: Architecture, Arts & Sciences, Business, Education, Engineering, Graduate, Journalism, Law, Nursing, Medicine, Music and Pharmacy.

Dr. Joseph Smiley became the school's ninth president in 1963, coming to Colorado from the University of Texas where he had been president since 1961. From 1958 to 1960 he was president of Texas Western College.

The University is governed by an independent board of six elected Regents, the President and the Faculty Senate.
