WHAT THE SIGNALS MEAN



Holding. (Penalty—by offense, 15 yards; by defense, 5 yards.)



Offside or violation of kick-off formation. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Illegal forward pass.



Crawling or pushing, 5 yards; helping ball carrier, 15 yds.



Score—touchdown, field goal, or conversion.



Unnecessary roughness, illegal defensive use of the hands, clipping, running into or roughing the kicker. (Penalty, 15 yards.)



Player illegally in motion. (Penalty, 5 yards. If from shift or huddle, 15 yards.)



Penalty refused, incomplete pass, missed field goal or conversion, both sides offside, etc.



Interference with forward pass. (If penalty on offense, when interference occurs beyond line of scrimmage, 15 yards and loss of down.)



Safety.

Delay of game or extra time-outs. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Time out.

Today, Cyclone football fans will see the Iowa State College grid board of strategy at work on Clyde Williams field for the last time this season as Coaches Mike Michalske, Chick Sutherland and Chan Welch direct the Cardinal and Gold eleven in their game with Kansas State.

Today's opponent is still looking for a conference win. So far, they haven't drawn blood in the Big Six loop. However, the Wildcats have been coming up with each successive game and today could be the afternoon they have picked to upset the applectart.

Michalske, Sutherland and Welch have brought the Cyclones through the season so far with 2 wins, 2 losses and one tie. In Big Six Conference play the Cyclones have dropped Nebraska, lost to Missouri and tied with Kansas University. In non-conference games, they defeated Iowa State Teachers

and lost to Northwestern University of the Big Ten circuit.

After today's encounter, the Cyclones will travel to Norman, Oklahoma, where they will take on the Title-Defending Oklahoma University squad who are undefeated to date in the scramble for top rung in the loop ladder. Last year, the game with the Sooners was characterized by a see-saw battle which Oklahoma finally won by a 12-7 score. Peak of the game was the Cyclone touchdown which could have won the game. Officials ruled that Iowa State had gone out of bounds in scoring their final touchdown so the game went to the Sooners.

Winding up the season will be the game with Drake at Des Moines when the Cyclones and Bulldogs tangle in a non-conference game at the Drake Stadium.

Kansas State Coaches

Master-minding the Wildcats this year is Lud Fiser who is in his first year of college coaching. Incidentally, Fiser is the first home-grown head in the history of the Wildcat school. He is a former Kansas State athlete and starred at football under Bo McMillin in 1929 and 1930. He also lettered in baseball and track at Kansas State.

Fiser takes over temporarily in the absence of Lt. Comdr. Hobbs Adams. Fiser has one of the best high school coaching records in Kansas at Washington, Atchison and Manhattan high schools. His offense is colorful and the Wildcats feature deception in their attack.

Fritz Knorr is handling the Kansas State linemen this season in the absence of Lt. Bill Schulte who is with the navy. Knorr coached one of the most-feared basketball squads in the Big Six last year. He is a former Kansas State athlete and starred at football for three years. Prior to becoming a member of the

Kansas State College physical education department, he taught at Kansas City Junior College. This is not Fritz' first venture into college coaching. For one year, he assisted with the freshman squad at the Wildcat school.

Micky Evans is another former Kansas State athlete who has come back to assist with the athletic destinies of the school. He played on the football and basketball teams in 1927, 1928 and 1929. He was head coach at Iola high school from 1930 to 1936 and turned out some of the finest teams in southeastern Kansas. Later, he taught in Argentine high school. Evans is assisting Fiser with the backfield men this season.

These are the coaches of our guests this afternoon and their lads will be out to try to trip the Cyclones and card their first conference win this year.

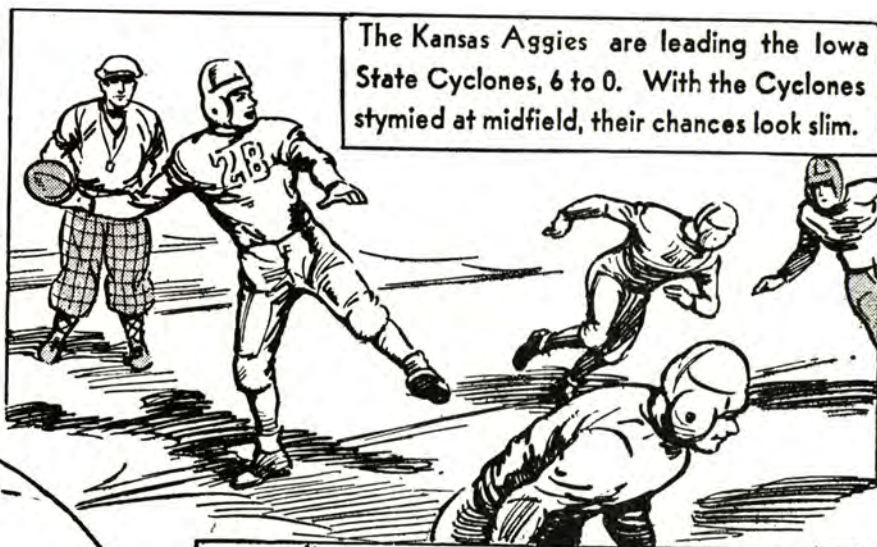

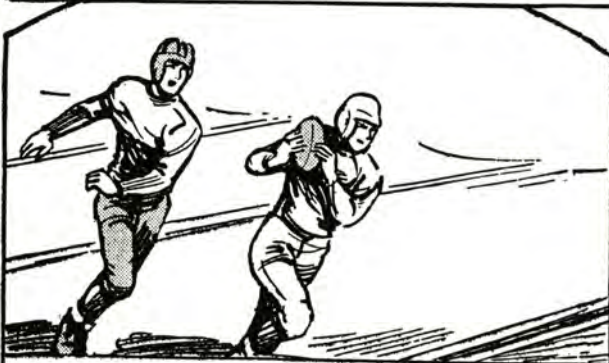
The Kansas Aggies are leading the Iowa State Cyclones, 6 to 0. With the Cyclones stymied at midfield, their chances look slim.



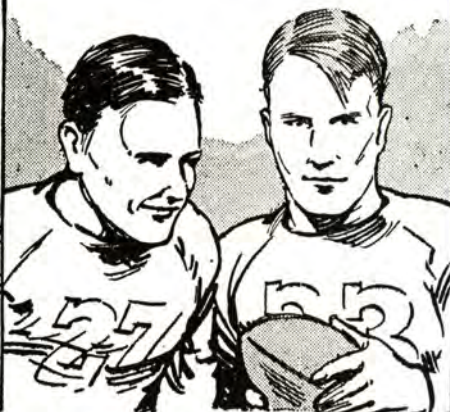
Then into the air shot that long 40-yard pass from Schafroth, Cyclone right halfback, to Wells, the flying right end. But here comes Auker, the Aggies' backfield flash, who has been breaking up Iowa State passes all afternoon.



Again that pesky Auker leaps into the air and bats the ball in its flight.



The fans groan as Auker appears to have broken up the play and then cheer wildly as the ball goes straight into the arms of Wells.



And here is Wells, who ran the remaining 10 yards uninterrupted that day, Nov. 7, 1931, at Ames, and Dick Grefe, the Cyclone who kicked the extra point for a 7 to 6 win for Iowa State.

Let's Look At The Record

In his few spare moments, Merl Ross, business manager of the Iowa State College sports plant, compiled a chart which shows the standings of the Big Six teams in all sports since the formation of the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association in 1928. Based on a point system covering the ten major sports in which championships are attained. These sports are football, basketball, wrestling, baseball, fall track, winter track, spring track, swimming, golf and tennis. The team with the most firsts or rankings near the top has the lowest number of points and therefore takes first place in the all-time rankings. Here's how they stand.

Anything Can Happen . . . And Usually Does

When Iowa State and Kansas State meet, anything can happen—and usually does. Just ask the fans who have seen the two teams tangle on the gridiron.

Out of the 28 games which have been played by the two teams, starting away back in 1917, the Cyclones have won 14 and the Wildcats have laid claim to 11. Three of the games were tie contests. The ties were registered in 1923, 1938 and in 1941.

Probably the most outstanding game played by the rivals was in 1938. With but three minutes left in the game, the Wildcats had the affair all tied up and ready to hang on the hook as a 13 to 0 win. Then, things happened. Iowa State scored twice in the remaining three minutes and tied the score.

Another interesting item about that 1938 game was that Iowa State had one of the best teams to be turned out that season and had won all of their games, seven to be exact. Kansas State was in fifth place and yet they were the ones who marred the undefeated record of the Cyclones.

If you are still skeptical, here's more evidence of how tough the two teams make it when they meet. In 1926, Iowa State nosed the Kansas State eleven out by a 3 to 2 score. Three years later, in 1929, Kansas State took

a 3 to 2 decision away from the Cyclones.

In 1934, Kansas State won the Big Six championship. In 1939, Kansas State finished in second place and Iowa State in fifth. That year, Kansas State got away with a 7 to 0 win. In 1931, the two squads played another thriller with Iowa State nosing Kansas State out for second place by a 7 to 6 score. That was the year that Iowa State lost the championship to Nebraska. In the 28-game history, there have been only 4 games with lopsided scores. Iowa State has two of them and Kansas State two. Most of the time the score has been a difference of one or two points or one touchdown.

Kansas State has had lean years during the war period. They were not endowed with a navy program which would give them a selection of athletes. They have carried on a full sports program with regular schedules and have used only civilian students. Now that more men are coming back to college, the Wildcats will be in the Big Six loop tougher than ever.

Iowa State and her students extend a hand of welcome to Kansas State. As we said at the beginning, anything can happen and usually does when the Wildcats take on the Cyclones. So, settle down for an afternoon of good football and see what happens.
