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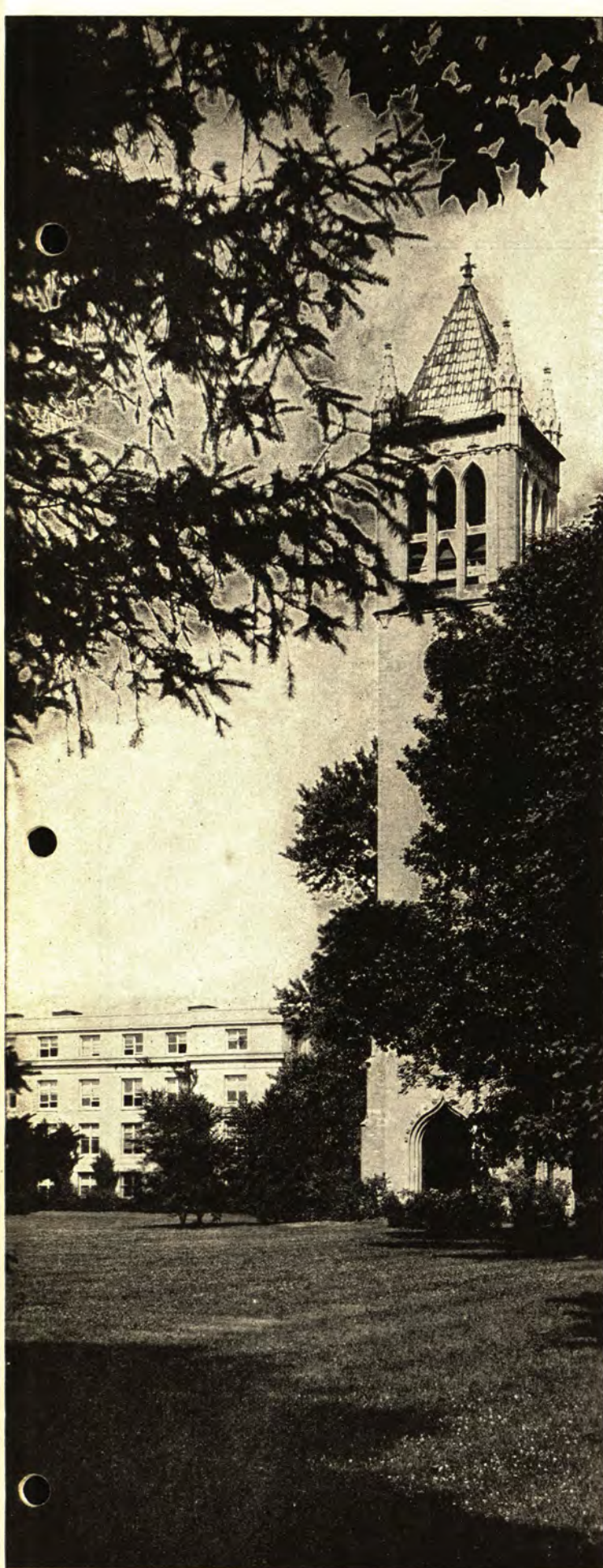

CORNHUSKERS vs. CYCLONES

A more ancient football rivalry than that which exists between Iowa State and Nebraska would be ancient indeed. The Cyclones met the Cornhuskers first in 1896 when the gridiron sport was a match of brawn and endurance and have played them every year, with a few exceptions, since.

That first contest went to the Huskers, 12 to 4, but the Cyclones had considerable to say as to the affair of '97. In fact, they said it 10 to 1, with Nebraska on the losing end.

The games of '98 and '99 served to keep the scales at an even balance, as Nebraska bagged the first one 23 to 10, while the Cyclones revolted with a 33-0 shutout the following year—the only crushing victory ever administered by the Cyclones to the Huskers.

Nebraska took revenge in 1900, with a point margin of 30-0, ushering in a straight run of victories which stood up until 1906 the first year of the forward pass when the Cyclones presented a team that was truly a Cyclone. In the Iowa State lineup were Reppert, a powerful lunging fullback, and the Lambert brothers, a pair whose elusive heels gave the Huskers an afternoon of worries. When the Iowa Cyclone ceased blowing that day, it left the Huskers in its wake with 2 points, while Iowa state had 14.

The annual conflict of 1907 was one of those nip-and-tuck affairs, in which Nebraska plucked the victory wreath by the tight margin of 10 to

9. The Cyclones led the scrap until late in the last half when John Weller of Nebraska booted a 55-yard kick from placement squarely between the uprights for the winning margin. This kick has been referred to by many writers as the most phenomenal kick in football history. It was kicked in the face of a howling gale.

Although the majority of Nebraska-Iowa State scores have been close the Huskers have won 22 of the 27 games played, Iowa State won 4, while one contest ended 6 to 6. The point total stands 462 for Nebraska and 165 for Iowa State.

In recent years the scores have been comparatively close. In 1930 the Cyclones battled

the Huskers to a 14-12 game, Nebraska winning. In 1931 the Cyclones played Nebraska at Lincoln for the Big Six championship and lost 23-0. Last year the final score was 12 to 6 in the Huskers favor.

Today's game with the Cornhuskers is of unusual importance as it marks the opening of the 1933 Big Six football campaign for both teams, and is the first Big Six game played this season.

Both teams emerged victorious from previous scraps. The Huskers smothered Texas University last Saturday, while the Cyclones have defeated Central College and the University of Denver.

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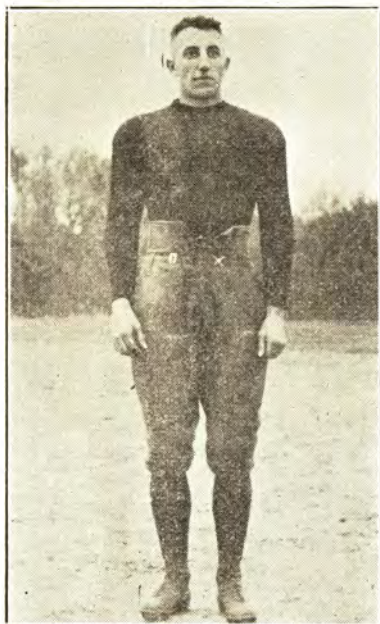

Not since 1919 have the Cyclones whipped the Cornhuskers, but that year a light but fighting Iowa State eleven blanked their much heavier opponents, 3-0.

The Cyclones outplayed the Huskers throughout the first half but failed to reach their objective until near the close of the second quarter. Dispairing of reaching the goal line by lugging the ball, Davis of Iowa State dropped back and sent a dropkick flying directly over the crossbar from the 35-yard line.

Not to be denied their well-earned victory the Cyclones fought like Demons the last half and staved off several scoring threats by the Huskers.

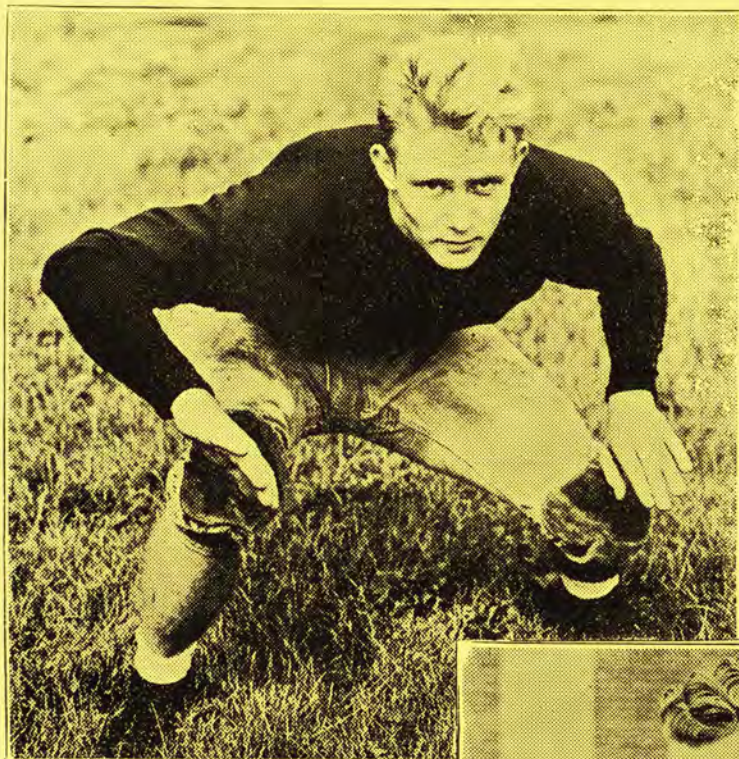

Some time ago the Federal Congress passed an act providing for a tax on admissions to athletic events, the tax being ten per cent (10%).

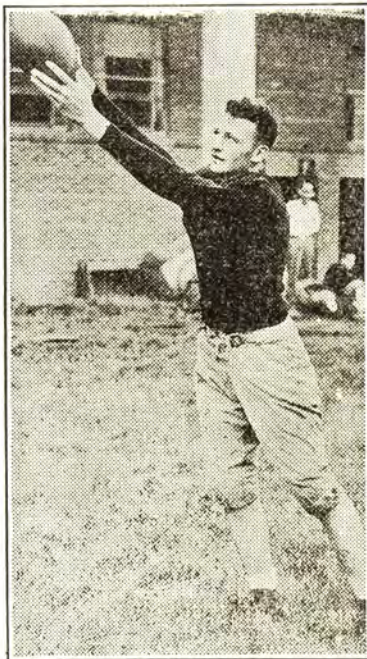
