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High-Tech Offenses Light Up the Night in Cyclone Season Opener

The stars will be out tonight as Iowa State plays host to Tulane in the Cyclones' 1988 season-opener. Each team features an offensive weapon whose glowing performances have brightened the outlook for both teams that will face each other this evening in the second night game in Cyclone Stadium/Jack Trice Field history.

Iowa State begins its second season under head coach Jim Walden with runningback Joe Henderson in the spotlight. Henderson rushed for 1,232 yards last season, the first back to top 1,000 yards rushing since 1981. Iowa State's Most Outstanding Offensive Player last season rushed for more than 100 yards in five games, including a 226 yard outing at Kansas.

If Henderson is the key to the Cyclone running attack, then the chore of directing ISU's passing game belongs to junior college transfer Bret Oberg. An all-conference selection at Porterville (Calif.) Junior College last season, Oberg completed 52 of 119 passes for 1,033 yards and four touchdowns. The Tehachapi, Calif. native also rushed for 276 yards and five scores. He is an experienced option quarterback who has blended quickly into Walden's offensive schemes.

Wide receiver Dennis Ross returns as one of the Big Eight's best pass catchers. The senior caught 53 passes for 673 yards and four touchdowns last season. The trio of Ross, Henderson, and Oberg combined with Walden's arsenal of fake punts and onside kicks should keep opposing teams off-balance this season.

Defensively, four returning players with starting experience return to the Cyclone secondary, including safety Jeff Dole. Dole led Iowa State in tackles last season and was a dependable punt returner. Junior Tim Baker, sophomore Marcus Robertson and senior Ray Carreathers all return. Linebacker Anthony Hoskins is back after making 70 tackles last season.

Iowa State's kicking game will be in the sure hands of Jeff Shudak and Judge Johnston. Shudak was an all-Big Eight performer as a freshman, setting school records for field goals in a season (20) and consecutive games kicking a field goal. Johnston was a steady performer in 1987.

Tulane heads into tonight's game one up on the Cyclones after whipping Tennessee-Chattanooga, 33-19 last Saturday in New Orleans' Superdome. The Green Wave, 6-6 last season with an Independence Bowl berth, used two

third quarter kick returns to break open a close game. UT-Chattanooga scored a touchdown with 4:27 left in the third quarter to narrow Tulane's lead to 20-16. Then lightning struck. TU's Michael Pierce returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown that made it 26-16. Pierce had an outstanding day, making four receptions for 100 yards and finishing with 136 yards on three kickoff returns. The Green Wave defense held on the next series, setting up Mitchell Price's 59-yard punt return that iced the contest.

The Tulane offense revolves around senior Terrence Jones, one of the nation's best option quarterbacks. Jones, who compiled 6,686 yards in total offense in his first three collegiate seasons, completed 17 of 26 passes for 295 yards and two touchdowns last Saturday. Both scoring tosses were to junior wide receiver Jerome McIntosh, who had seven receptions for 129 yards. McIntosh was moved to receiver from quarterback early in the 1987 season and promptly made his contribution. He finished last season with 19 catches for 302 yards and three touchdowns. McIntosh has countered the loss of Marc Zeno, the all-time NCAA career leader in yards received with 3,725. In all, 16 starters and 39 lettermen return for Tulane.

The Green Wave returns a pair of fullbacks that have led the team in rushing the last two seasons. Senior

Rodney Hunter led the team with 657 yards in 1986 and finished the 1987 season with 370 yards. Senior Melvin Adams led the ground attack last season with 421 yards. Adams led Tulane with 42 yards rushing on five carries last weekend.

Leading the Tulane defense is senior Richard Harvey. The senior led the Green Wave in tackles last season with 109 stops, including 82 solo tackles.

Tulane is playing under new head coach Greg Davis. Davis succeeded former ISU assistant Mack Brown, who left to become the head football coach at North Carolina. An assistant at Texas A&M under Emory Bellard, Tom Wilson and Jackie Sherill, Davis went to Tulane as an assistant in 1984.

This evening's meeting follows last year's initial clash between Iowa State and Tulane in New Orleans. In Walden's coaching debut, the Cyclones outgained the Green Wave 399-287 but came up short on the scoreboard, 25-12. It was an auspicious debut for several Cyclones. Jeff Shudak kicked a school record four field goals. Henderson rushed 21 times for 96 yards and Ross caught six passes for 55 yards. Hoskins made seven unassisted tackles and Randy Richards was in on 10 total stops. Tulane's Jones hit on 15 of 23 passes for 183 yards and two touchdown passes to Zeno. Iowa State moved the ball consistently throughout the contest, notching 24 first downs to 16 for Tulane. It was a 14-12 contest in the fourth quarter before a Green Wave field goal and touchdown pass set the final margin.

Iowa State is 68-24-4 in season openers. The Cyclones are 10-2 in home openers at Cyclone Stadium. ISU has won 19 of its last 21 home openers. Tulane was 1-4 on the road last season. The only other night game in Iowa State history was played on October 20, 1984. Oklahoma edged Iowa State 12-10 before a national ESPN television audience.



Dennis Ross is one of the Big Eight's best receivers. The senior earned all-conference honors last season, making 53 catches for 673 yards and four touchdowns.

The Cyclones are home again next weekend, playing host to Baylor in a contest that will start at 12:15 p.m.

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THIS IS IOWA STATE



Since the first students enrolled at Iowa State, the institution has been committed to academic excellence. Iowa State's reputation for scholarship is internationally known and Iowa State's students are respected nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

One of the largest institutions governed by the State Board of Regents, Iowa State is a major Midwestern center of learning for 25,578 students, from all 50 states and 100 other nations. Iowa State attracts a diverse student body with a wide range of undergraduate and graduate programs, a student to teaching faculty ratio of 12 to 1 and an average class size of 29 students. Over 120 undergraduate programs of study are available from Iowa State's eight colleges: Agriculture, Business

Administration, Design, Education, Engineering, Family and Consumer Sciences, Sciences and Humanities and Veterinary Medicine.

The picturesque campus is comfortably situated in a central campus "park" - a splendid combination of conventional and contemporary architecture. ISU's classrooms and buildings are a blend of the old and the new, nestled amid thousands of trees and acres of greenery. The ultra-modern south campus is dominated by the Iowa State Center, Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field, and the College of Veterinary Medicine.

The Iowa State Center, which boasts one of the nation's finest facilities of its kind, consists of the C.Y. Stephens Auditorium, the J.W. Fisher Theater, the Scheman Continuing Education Center, and the James H. Hilton Coliseum. Concert facilities draw some of the top names in entertainment. Bruce Springsteen, Tina Turner, Bill Cosby and the Broadway hit "Cats" have been featured on campus.

One of the highlights of the year occurs in spring as the campus blooms with tulips and apple blossoms just in time for the Veishea celebration. "Veishea" is ISU's annual open house and the largest student-run festival in the nation, complete with parade, exhibits and thousands of alumni. The

campus is also a breathtaking sight in the fall, when autumn colors and leaves make it a cardinal and gold showplace.

Sports are a vital part of the life at Iowa State as the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 21 men's and women's sports and the extensive intramural program boasts one of the highest student participation rates in the country. A number of Cyclone intercollegiate teams have been nationally ranked in recent years and several have brought home national titles. Iowa State has also produced 24 Olympians, three of whom captured gold medals. While athletics remain in the spotlight, the academic side shares equal time.

The opportunities that Iowa State offers stretch beyond the lengths of academics and athletics. There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized along with the top-notch academic advising program.

Iowa State University is an institution founded on a commitment to academic challenge, achievement and excellence. Iowa State reaches beyond this by offering its students some of the most advanced athletic, cultural and social opportunities in the Midwest.

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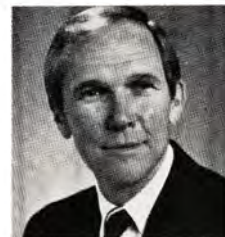
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ISU HEAD COACH JIM WALDEN

Nearly two years ago, Iowa State University President Dr. Gordon Eaton and Athletic Director Max Urick began a search for a new Cyclone football coach. The search was not only for a football coach, but for a new direction, a new personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State program. Eaton and Urick found all of those ingredients in 50-year-old Jim Walden, and on December 16, 1986, the former Washington State mentor became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can to work as hard as I know how." A glance at Walden's coaching record shows that his best has led to success at previous coaching stops.

His first ISU team finished 3-8-0 and demonstrated consistent improvement throughout the season. The Cyclone offense gained almost 4,000 yards and the ISU attack featured several trick plays.

As the head coach at Washington State for nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific-10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and only one other coach in Cougar history won more games or served longer as

head coach than Walden.

Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intra-state rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in three of Walden's last five years.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his

exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in the last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

Walden was actually at Washington State for ten years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regular-season finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

His success did not go unnoticed by his peers. Walden earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1977. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending the past 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden is familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden joined

Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.



As a college quarterback at Wyoming, Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

An excellent speaker, Walden is in demand for outside engagements. The NCAA has selected him twice as a guest speaker at its annual College Football Preview, in 1983 and 1985. Since coming to ISU, he's become a popular figure with both students and fans in appearances across the state. Since the day he was hired, Jim Walden has proven that he is the "right person" to bring a new direction, new attitude, and new personality to the Iowa State football program.

SCOUTING REPORT

The Series: This is the second meeting between the Cyclones and the Green Wave. Tulane won last year's battle in New Orleans by a 25-12 margin. The Cyclones scored first with a 35-yard field goal by Jeff Shudak and took that three-point lead into the second quarter. Tulane scored two quick touchdowns on a 16-yard pass from Terrence Jones to Marc Zeno and a two-yard run by Rodney Hunter. Shudak kicked another field goal and the Cyclones went into the locker room down 14-6 at halftime. Shudak's hot foot was on target again the third quarter. The freshman kicked two more field goals from 35 and 32 yards out. ISU found itself down by only two points going into the final period. The Green Wave offense proved to be too much in the fourth quarter, as Todd Wiggins hit on a 41-yard field goal attempt. Jones then hit Zeno for another touchdown to set the final margin.

For the Record: Two Tulane kick returns broke open a close game as the Green Wave knocked off Tennessee-Chattanooga, 33-19 in last weekend's season opener in New Orleans. UTC scored to narrow Tulane's lead to 20-16 with 4:27 left in the third quarter. But TU's Michael Pierce returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown to make it 26-16. Pierce had an outstanding day, making four receptions for 100 yards and finished with 136 yards on three kickoff returns. The Green Wave defense held on the next series, setting up Mitchell Price's 59-yard punt return for a touchdown that put the game on ice.

Offensively: Tulane's offense revolves around quarterback Terrence Jones. The senior started the season with 6,686 yards in total offense. Last weekend he completed 17 of 26 passes for 295 yards and two touchdown passes to junior Jerome McIntosh. McIntosh finished with seven receptions for 129 yards. A former quarterback, McIntosh had 19 catches for 302 yards and three touchdowns last season. The Green Wave returns a pair of fullbacks that have led the team in rushing the last two seasons. Senior Rodney Hunter led the team with 657 yards in 1986 and finished the 1987 season with 370 yards. Senior Melvin Adams led the ground attack last season with 421 yards. Adams led Tulane with 42 yards on five carries last weekend.

Defensively: Like the offense, the Tulane defense welcomes back seven starters. The Green Wave is deep at linebacker and in the secondary. Linebacker Richard Harvey returns for his senior season and his third year as a starter. Harvey led the Green Wave in tackles last season with 109, 82 of which were unassisted. Leading the way in the defensive backfield is junior free safety Price. A transfer from SMU, Price was Louisiana's Collegiate Newcomer of the Year after making 54 tackles and three interceptions in 1987.

Kicking: Junior Todd Wiggins hit on 10-of-19 field goal tries last season and was 36 of 41 on extra point tries. He was 0-for-2 on field goal attempts last week and 3-for-5 on extra point tries. Punter Micah Neuse punted four times last weekend for a 41.7 yard average.

The Coach: Tulane is playing under new head coach Greg Davis. Davis succeeded former ISU assistant Mack Brown, who left to become the head football coach at North Carolina. An assistant at Texas A&M under Emory Ballard, Tom Wilson and Jackie Sherill, Davis went to Tulane as an assistant in 1984.

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STADIUM INFORMATION

First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1:00 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms

Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.

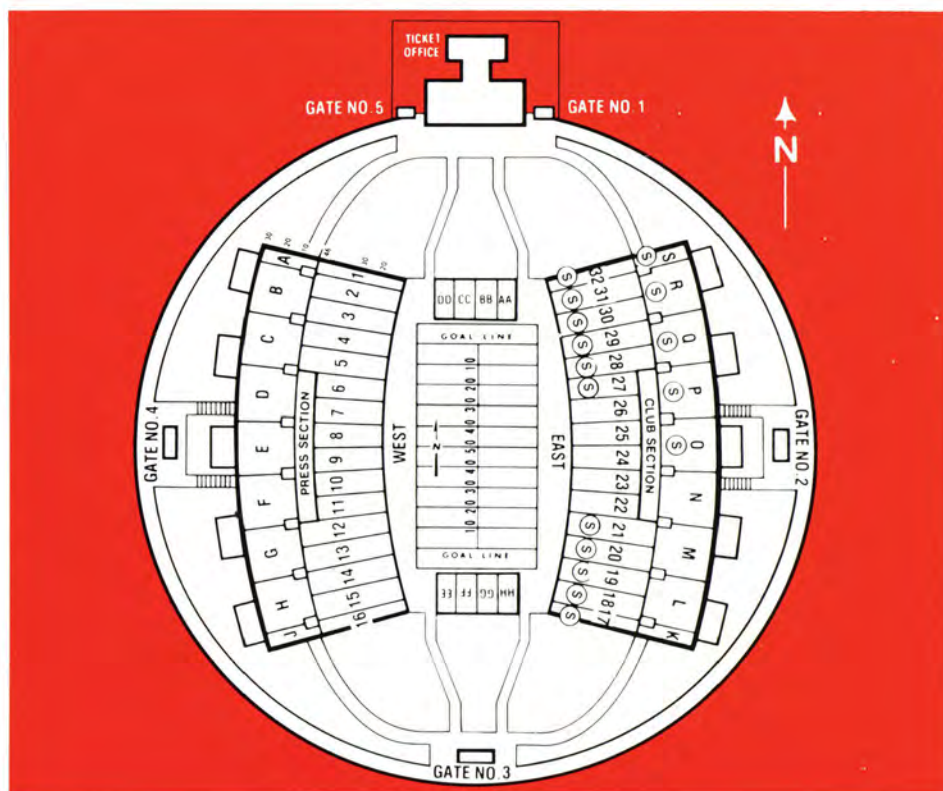
Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level behind the goalposts.

No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.



Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium, bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown on the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department is one of the very few athletic facilities to provide portable toilets for their patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

Iowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of Iowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by Iowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building, before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these

specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e.; ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure pleasant, enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

- Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

- If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed policeman to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium.

- An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.

ISU PRESIDENT GORDON EATON

Gordon Eaton's leadership has already made an impact on every department and segment of the campus community as Iowa State improves its facilities, academic programs and student services.

The former vice president for academic affairs at Texas A&M, Eaton took office July 1, 1986 as Iowa State's 12th president.

Eaton received his bachelor of arts from Wesleyan University at Middletown, Conn., in 1951. He graduated "With High Honors and High Distinction" with degrees in geology and mathematics. He earned his masters of science degree in geology (1953) and his Ph.D. in geophysics and geology (1957) from the California Institute of Technology.

He served on the faculty of Wesleyan University (1955-59) and the faculty of the University of California-Riverside (1959-63) before a two-year stint as the project chief for the U.S. Geological Survey in Denver, Colorado. Eaton then returned to California-Riverside where he was the chairperson of the department of geological sciences.



DR. GORDON EATON

From 1967-81 Eaton was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in a number of capacities. He was the project chief for the Southwestern Project, scientist-in-charge of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory, and associate chief geologist at the national headquarters in Reston, Va.

In 1981, he was appointed the dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A&M, which includes the departments of geology, geophysics, oceanography, meteorology and geography. Eaton was named provost and vice president for academic affairs in 1983, a post he held until coming to Iowa State.

An established scholar and scientist, Eaton is the author and co-author of more than 40 publications covering such subjects as mineral resources throughout the United States, volcanic ash deposits, and mining geophysics in the Soviet Union. He has worked on the "Journal of Volcanology and Geothermal Resources" as an associate editor, and was the co-editor of the Geological Society of America's "Memoir 152".

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Iowa State Ushers in New Era of High Technology

Iowa State University is synonymous with high technology. The electronic digital computer was invented here; numerous scientific plant and animal breeding breakthroughs have occurred here; the use of high-technology communications techniques have been pioneered here; and some of the purest materials in the world have been developed and processed in Iowa State's laboratories, for use in everything from nuclear reactors to solar power generators.

Today, Iowa State University is embarking on a new era of high technology, an era that will result in new discoveries to help reshape many fields of science and offer exciting possibilities for new businesses and industries in the state.

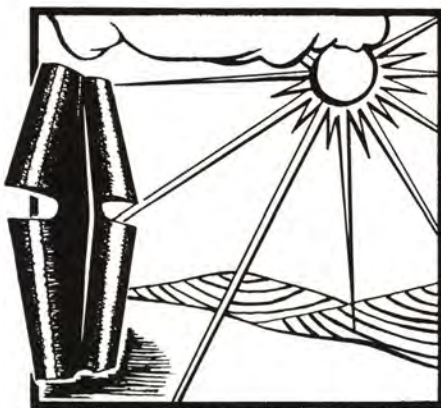
During the past three years, public and private funding sources have invested more than \$150 million in the development of research facilities and staff at Iowa State University. These research projects and facilities are designed to recharge the university's historically renowned research enterprise and stimulate economic development in the state. Through their support of the Iowa Lottery, which annually provides millions of dollars to research and development activities at Iowa State University and throughout the state, Iowans have aided the cause.

Today, Iowa State University salutes the people who are spearheading these new research and economic development activities, and you, the people of Iowa, for your progressive attitude and financial support.

Agronomy Hall Dedicated

In the never-ending effort to perfect crop and soil management, a new educational and research facility was dedicated Friday on the Iowa State University campus—a facility that will solidify Iowa State's position as the premier agricultural research institution in the nation. The dedication signaled the completion of a \$30 million project, initiated during the height of the recent agricultural depression. Construction included a 102,000 square foot addition and complete remodeling of the 33,000

square foot Agronomy Building. With the upcoming completion of the \$12 million U.S. Department of Agriculture's Soil Tilth Laboratory just a block away from Agronomy Hall, Iowa State University will have at its disposal a battery of research facilities in plant growth and development unlike anywhere else in the world.



The new Agronomy Hall is the direct result of interest and active participation by Iowa's agricultural business and education leaders, represented by the group "Friends of Agronomy." This organization, involving more than 1,500 persons, led the drive to secure funding and approval for construction of this new facility, which will serve to benefit all Iowans, now and long into the future.

Construction To Begin On Molecular Biology Building

No new science holds more promise for excitement and potential in revitalizing Iowa's agricultural industry than biotechnology, and the state of Iowa is determined to secure an

international leadership role in this field. With the commitment of \$17 million in Iowa Lottery profits beginning two years ago, Iowa State University has already started to build a world-class program, and is already seeing results. Nearly 20 new biotech researchers have been attracted to Iowa State to help build this new program, bringing with them millions of dollars in additional outside funding to support their research projects.

Just this year, Iowa State University became the first university in the nation to receive approval, under stringent and meticulous state and federal safety guidelines, to field test a genetically altered plant. The goal of the project, the work of researcher Robert Thornburg, is to perfect a genetic engineering technique to transfer pest resistance characteristics from one plant into others of high economic value to the state, such as corn and soybeans.

Earlier today, groundbreaking was held for the centerpiece of ISU's agricultural biotechnology efforts—a \$30.5 million Molecular Biology Building. When completed in 1990, this new laboratory, research and educational complex will provide more than 123,000 square feet of space for more than 300 scientists from Iowa State and other research institutions, as well as the many private industries throughout the world interested in perfecting new biotechnological techniques for the benefit of people everywhere.

Agriculture and Home Economics Experiment Station Celebrates Centennial

The Iowa State University Agriculture and Home Economics Experiment Station is one of the nation's oldest and most respected research institutions. More important, it's the leader of an industry that is the basis for one out of every three jobs in the state.

The Agricultural Experiment Station system traces its roots to two Iowa State faculty, Seaman A. Knapp and Charles Bessey, who drafted legislation in the early 1880s proposing federal funding of state research stations. The

legislation was approved as part of the Hatch Act in 1887, and the Iowa Agricultural Experiment Station was officially formed on March 1, 1888.

The Experiment Station was among Iowa State's earliest means of technology transfer—taking research developments from the university and putting them to practical use on farms and businesses based in agriculture. Significantly boosting such programs was the establishment of the nation's first state-financed Cooperative Extension Service at Iowa State in 1906.

ISU's Experiment Station celebrates its 100th anniversary this year, culminating with special events today on the ISU campus. Its research projects encompass biotechnology, food and nutrition research, public policy, the development and marketing of new products from crops, agricultural diversification, and competitive, environmentally sound farming systems. Station researchers also examine foreign trade and economic policies to help prepare Iowa for a more active role in the global marketplace.

The Experiment Station has considerable human resources at its disposal, including 275 scientists and 350 graduate students in two dozen disciplines. All are working toward the common goal of strengthening Iowa by strengthening its agricultural sector.

ISU Research Park Becomes Reality

Two years ago, the Iowa State University Research Park was only a picture on a drawing board and a dream in the minds of the university's leaders. Today, it is a reality, as the activity just south of Cyclone Stadium/Jack Trice Field will attest.

The ISU Research Park bridges the gap between university laboratory

discoveries and the application of these discoveries for commercial and industrial purposes. Designed to be a hub of industrial activity, the park will host research and development facilities for established industries and new high-tech businesses there to take advantage of the proximity of a major research university.

Initial development of the first phase of the 190-acre site, including street and utility construction and preparation, is nearly complete. Construction is under way on the first building at the park, a multi-tenant facility that will house a number of new enterprises before January, 1989.

The ISU Research Park is a multi-million dollar cooperative project by Iowa State University, the city of Ames, Story County, and the state of Iowa. With its companion facility, ISIS (Iowa State Innovation System, an incubator for high-technology start-up businesses), Iowa State University has implemented a comprehensive program to spur the development of new high-technology business and industry in Iowa. Through its expanding research programs, ISU will be able to direct the establishment and expansion of a new and diversified economic base for the state.

Iowa State University's reputation for research excellence in numerous areas—materials development, veterinary medicine and pharmaceuticals, agricultural biotechnology, high-energy physics, superconductivity, analytical and organic chemistry—is international in scope. ISU is putting this reputation for research excellence to its best advantage with the research park concept—its showcase for the public/private partnerships necessary for Iowa's continued growth.

Institute For Physical Research and Technology Established

The research enterprise at Iowa State University is growing by leaps and bounds, thanks to the efforts of Iowa's Washington Congressional delegation, as it works to rebuild the economy of a state hit hard by the agricultural crisis. Although the state's No. 1 industry will continue to be agriculture, university and government leaders have also identified that the state needs to

expand its economic base. For part of that expansion, they are looking to Iowa State University and its expertise in the physical sciences.

In addition to the Ames Laboratory of the U.S. Department of Energy, which is operated by Iowa State, the university has established a new complex of research centers at its Applied Sciences Center, the former location of the university's synchrotron. This complex, known as the Institute for Physical Research and Technology, traces its origin to a foundation in materials science which was established at Iowa State University decades ago by such renowned scientists as Frank Spedding and Henry Gilman.

The Institute for Physical Research and Technology consists of the Ames Laboratory, the Center for New Industrial Materials, the Center for Nondestructive Evaluation, the Microelectronics Research Center and several other research centers. Since its creation just a few years ago, this complex has been targeted for more than \$50 million in direct federal appropriations to expand its research programs, and has received millions more from private industries that could benefit from access to research conducted at IPRT. One of these projects is a three-year, \$17 million joint project between ISU and 3M to create a new generation of amorphous semiconductors to generate electrical power from solar energy, a project that holds immense potential for the development of related industries in Iowa, and the establishment of Iowa as a center of technology for this type of renewable energy resource.

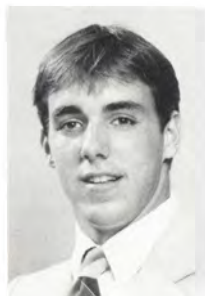

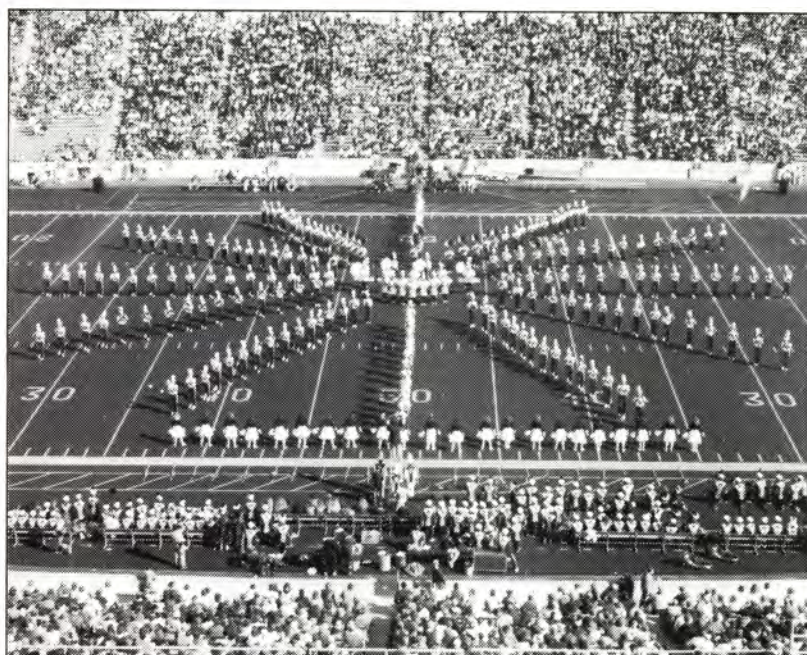

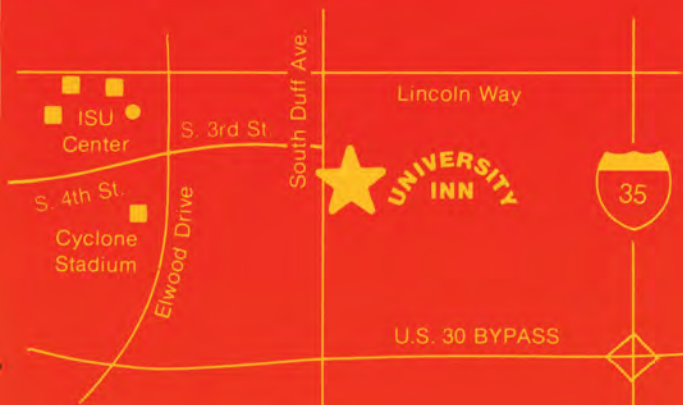

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The Night the Lights Went on in Ames

Gather 'round, Cyclone fans, and I will tell you a story. Settle into your seats, and listen closely. For this tale has excitement, suspense and acts of bravery that create a chill as biting as the September night air.

It was close to Halloween in 1984, Oct. 20 to be exact. A ticklish wind crept in from the shadows, disturbing the peace of a crisp, Autumn evening. Cyclone Stadium/Jack Trice Field cut into the darkness, illuminating the sky much like a lighthouse, guiding the Cyclones to their destination.

Suddenly, **they** appeared. Big, hungry, and ranked No. 2 in the nation. Everyone knew them, and many had felt their wrath. Old timers told of games gone by, when the Sooners of Oklahoma had annihilated our gallant men. Sometimes, they wiped out our entire offense and defense, as some witnessed in 1946 (63-0), and once again in 1956 (44-0). But this particular meeting was different. Something was in the air.

ESPN brought a national television audience into our town, as the first night game in Iowa State football history neared kickoff. Undaunted by the attention, the Cyclones took to the field. Oklahoma had invaded their territory, the whiteness of its uniforms standing out in the fall darkness. But this did not bother our noble men; they were more than willing to play the bad guys on this special occasion.

For as one member of the 1984 squad was heard to say, the atmosphere provided strength to the

ISU attack.

"It was the best crowd I had ever seen," then-freshman fullback Chris Hentges once told me. "There was a lot of excitement. It gave everyone a good feeling that we could compete with the best in the country."

But the Sooners scored first, kicking a 36-yard field goal to go up 3-0 with 5:30 remaining in the first quarter. So the score remained—until the final five minutes of the second quarter. Starting on his own 20-yard line, sophomore quarterback Alex Espinoza covered 80 yards in 18 plays, culminating the drive with a 3-yard pass to Kirk Thomas for the touchdown. Junior Marc Bachrodt then stepped in for the extra point, and the Cyclones led 7-3.

The half ended almost two minutes later with Iowa State in the lead, and a nation knew the Cyclones meant business.

The third quarter proved to be a test of the defenses, as ISU managed only two first downs to Oklahoma's three. The Cyclones had one chance to score, but missed a 46-yard field goal with 3:25 remaining.

The game now moved into the fourth and final quarter. Cyclone fans held their breath, afraid to mutter the thoughts that filled each and everyone's mind. Could they do it? Could they hold on for 15 minutes? Would the nation see our boys win the battle with the evil Oklahoma Sooners?

The answer seemed to be yes. Making up for a missed opportunity, Bachrodt kicked a field goal from 45 yards out to

increase the Cyclone lead by three. With a little more than 11 minutes remaining, ISU was in control, 10-3.

But the Sooners came right back with a field goal of their own, reducing the Cyclone lead and putting them within a touchdown of taking the lead. After ISU failed to make a first down in its next series, Oklahoma came charging.

With 7:33 remaining in the contest, the Sooners marched 40 yards in nine plays, capped by a 7-yard run off the option pitch. A fake extra point attempt was fumbled on the snap, and the score stood at 12-10, Oklahoma.

The men of the Cardinal and Gold did their best in the time remaining, however, making it to mid-field before running out of downs. Oklahoma then preceded to run out the clock, and escape Ames with a two-point victory.

But the Cyclones were not defeated, as many will tell you. In the final statistics, ISU won several battles. Iowa State led in time of possession, 32:29 to 27:31, as well as in net yards passing, 147 to 44. The Cyclones also had twice as many third-down conversions as the Sooners, and were penalized only four times to Oklahoma's seven.

They were a proud bunch of men, proving to their fans, the Sooners, and the nation, that they were a force to be reckoned with. They had played with all their hearts, and had put a scare into the country's No. 2 team.

And that, my friends, is the story of the night the lights went on in Ames.

Yes, it seems the night air agrees with the Cyclones.

Versatile Volleyball Team Takes The Court in 1988

ISU head volleyball coach Vicki Mealer hopes success is catching. Veterans Linda Evans, Merry Happe, Sue Nosal and Missy Roberts have left from a team that finished 20-11 a year ago. But Mealer has a young team that is eager to pick up where last year's team left off.

"We'll lose four starters and we'll be inexperienced game-wise, but the people that are going to step in have been with us at least a year, if not two or three," Mealer said. "They're not inexperienced in the training they have, but in the court time."

Two veterans that Mealer will count on tremendously this year are co-captains Linda Welch and Dana Burson. Welch, a starter at right outside hitter last season, will be a big part of the offense in 1988, Mealer said.

Junior Dana Burson's two years of starting experience at middle blocker will be a real asset to Mealer's 1988 squad. The Walcott, Iowa native broke into the starting lineup as a freshman and has started every game since then. An all-Big Eight honorable mention

selection in 1987, Burson led the Cyclones in blocking last season. However, Mealer will look to Burson to carry more of the offensive load this year.

Mealer has given Jill Sharp and Janice Ninemire starting nods at middle blocker and outside hitter, respectively. Sharp and Ninemire each had the opportunity to start at different times during the 1987 campaign, and Mealer feels their experience will help solidify the team. Freshman Tracy Graham has started at the third outside hitter position, but juniors Kris Leonard and Michelle Judas will also see plenty of playing time.

Mealer is placing her team in the capable hands of redshirt freshman setter Lisa Burke. Burke, who trained with the team last year, is an extremely accurate setter who can get the ball anywhere on the court.

Mealer feels the biggest challenge for 1988 will be learning to play together as a team. Although the talent is definitely there, Mealer realizes that her players have not had a lot of game

experience.

"It's hard to expect inexperienced players to come in and play well everyday. I think that's a challenge with this young team—to play consistently at the same level."

Cross Country Teams Optimistic For 1988 Season

With the Iowa State cross country season one week away, both the men's and women's teams are preparing for the year with both optimism and concern. The women are looking to finish higher in the Big Eight standings, while the men are wondering if an injury will keep them out of the race to be number one in the nation, as it did last year.

The Iowa State men's cross country team returns its top six runners that won the Big Eight title in 1987: seniors Barnaba Korir and Eric Gonstead, juniors Darrell Smith and John Nuttall, and sophomores Andrew Hollens and Roland Pauwels.

Going into the season, Barnaba Korir is the top runner for the Cyclone squad. Korir has the potential to be the number one runner in the nation, barring injury. Last year the Kenya native finished eighth at the NCAA Championship meet. Darrell Smith finished 41st at last year's NCAA meet, and is looking to improve on that mark in 1988.

The sixth and seventh runners this

year are going to be stronger than years before, according to assistant coach Steve Lynn. Six men are competing for the two spots, and the competition has been intense and fast-paced in practice.

The women are looking forward to improving on the fourth-place finish they had in the Big Eight last year. Coach Dick Lee is optimistic, since three of his top five runners are returning this season, in seniors Jill Slettedahl and Tami Colby, and sophomore Lisa Skidmore.

Slettedahl should be setting the pace for the women in 1988. Last year she was very consistent in finishing at the top in each race. The Minnesota native led the Cyclones in the Big Eight meet in 1987 by placing sixth on the 5,000-meter course.

On ISU's home schedule this season are two NCAA meets. The Cyclones will host the NCAA regional meet on Nov. 12, followed by the NCAA Championship Nov. 21. Both contests will be held at Jester Park. In preparation for these meets, the

Cyclones will hold the Memorial Race at Jester Park on Oct. 17.

Iowa State will open the cross country season on Sept. 17 at the Nebraska Invitational in Lincoln.

Cyclone Academic Success Highlights 1987-88 School Year

The Iowa State University Athletic Department's commitment to serving its student athletes is underscored by the scholastic success achieved by Cyclone competitors last season. In all, 83 ISU athletes earned Big Eight Conference Honor Roll recognition for maintaining a grade point average of 3.0 or higher during the 1987-88 academic year and earning a varsity letter in their respective sport.

ball team member Pat Heiderscheit of New Albin. Skidmore and Letzring earned High Scholarship awards from the Cyclone athletic department last spring. Skidmore earned a 4.0 grade point average in physical education during the 1987 spring and fall semesters. Letzring scored a 3.87 grade point average in zoology. Heiderscheit earned national recognition after notching a spot on the CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors Association) Academic All-America team for the second straight season. The pitcher-first baseman hit .321 last season, with a team high 48 RBI. He was 2-1 on the mound and finished the academic year with a 3.7 grade point

average in elementary education.

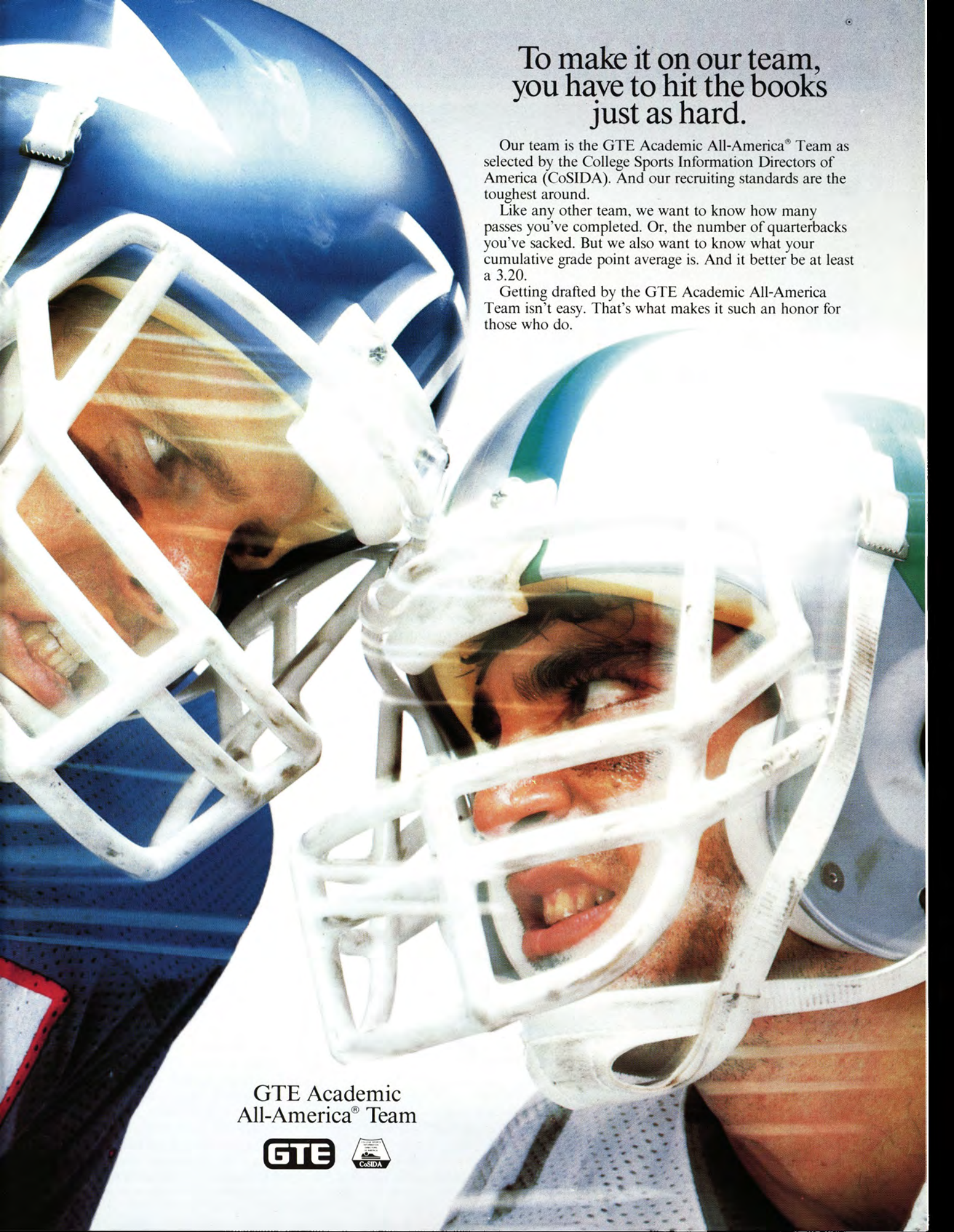

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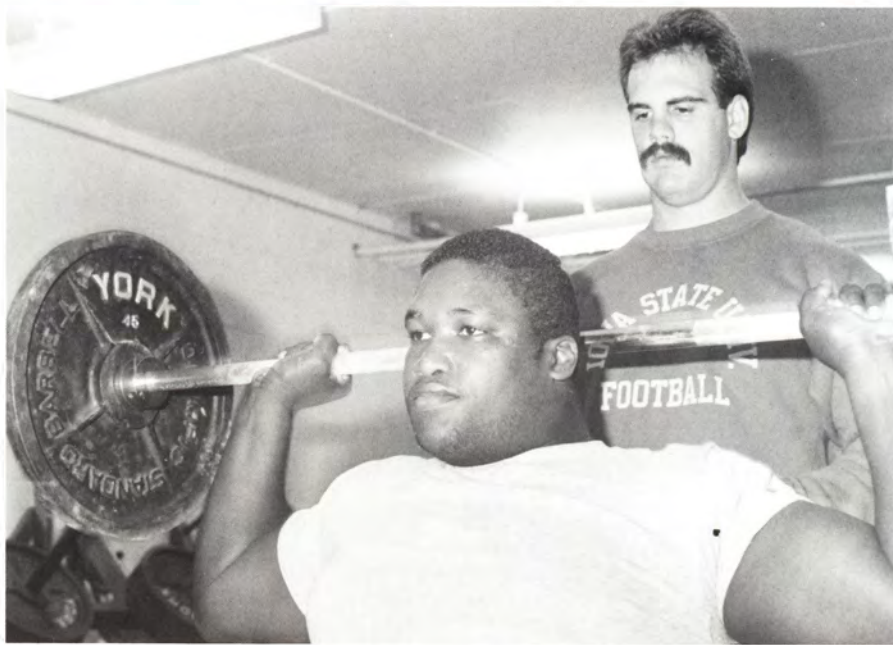
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SUPPORT SERVICES



STRENGTH PROGRAM

Today, one of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under

the direction of full-time strength and conditioning coach Tom Wilson, Iowa State's athletic teams have made tremendous strides.

The goal of the strength and conditioning program is not to make avid weightlifters out of athletes, but rather to keep athletes healthy and

prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers all athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, "plus excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. Utilizing such a strictly supervised strength and conditioning program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become bigger, faster and more disciplined than their opponent."

For Iowa State's football team, as well as many other Cyclone squads, the strength and conditioning program continues on a year-round basis. During the summer and winter months, athletes concentrate on increasing strength and conditioning while in-season work consists of maintaining strength and the level of conditioning.

Through evaluation and testing, use of computerized training programs and diet analysis, ISU's strength and conditioning program is helping make Iowa State student athletes into better athletes.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING



The term "student-athlete" carries an important distinction at Iowa State University. Athletes at ISU must be students first if they are to retain the privileges associated with participating in intercollegiate athletics. The hours and energy demanded of today's college athlete can adversely affect a student-athlete's education without

guidance in time management and study techniques.

Iowa State's athletic academic coordinators monitor all student-athletes' academic status in terms of both eligibility and progress toward graduation to help prepare them for life after a collegiate athletic career. Four full-time academic coordinators, plus

several part-time counselors and numerous tutors, assure that these goals are being met. The staff works directly with the student-athletes, as well as with the athletes' academic advisers and instructors throughout the university.

Although absence from class because of athletic participation is held to an absolute minimum, any missed class time can impose a burden on the student-athlete. Support services such as tutoring and study table, help alleviate that problem. ISU's football team utilizes a study table that meets on a daily basis throughout the year. Academic staff members and tutors attend each session and are available throughout the day to meet with student-athletes.

The education of ISU student-athletes and their progress toward degrees has always been a prime consideration of the athletic department at Iowa State. A strong athletic academic counseling service helps support the student-athletes and offer them guidance and assistance as they work toward degrees and enjoy athletic successes.

COACHING STAFF

NORM ANDERSEN

Runningbacks



Andersen joined Jim Walden's staff in March of 1987 after nine seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA. For five seasons (1982-86), the former Bruin tight end coached and developed some of the nation's top runningbacks at his alma mater, including Gaston Green and Eric Ball. ISU runningback Joe Henderson rushed for 1,232 yards in Andersen's first season in Ames.

A three-year starter at UCLA (1973-75), he now ranks 10th in career receiving with 61 catches for 1,051 yards. He led the Bruins in receiving as a sophomore and a junior, catching 19 passes in 1973 and 27 the following year. An all-Pacific-8 first-team selection in 1974, he was chosen in the 11th round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears.

CRAIG BOLLER

Defensive Line



The 1988 season is Craig Boller's second as an assistant coach at Iowa State. The Belmond native is no stranger to Ames, however, where he lettered three times as an ISU defensive tackle under Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors (1967-69).

Boller came to Iowa State in January of 1987 after serving six years as the defensive line coach at Oregon State. The 40-year old Boller was an assistant coach at Memphis State for two seasons (1978-79) after working one year as a part-time assistant coach at Tennessee.

Boller spent three seasons (1974-76) building the William Penn (Iowa) College football program. William Penn won the Iowa Conference title in Boller's final season as head coach. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Knoxville High School from 1971-73.

and played in three games of the 1976 regular season. He went on to play five years in the CFL (1977-81), the first four with Montreal and the 1981 season with Ottawa. He earned a master's in Education Administration in June, 1981 at Washington State. Burrow and his wife, Carol, are parents of two children, Jamie (9) and Danny (7).

DAVE ELLIOTT

Wide Receivers



The 1987 season marks Dave Elliott's 14th campaign as an assistant coach and his tenth season as an assistant to Jim Walden. At Washington State, Elliott tutored the inside linebackers from 1979-86.

The Champaign, Ill., native coached the defensive backs at Miami (Fla.) in 1975. In 1976, he coached at Michigan, working with linebackers. He spent the 1977-78 seasons at Toledo as defensive backfield coach before joining Walden's staff at Washington State.

Elliott, the nephew of Iowa Athletic Director Bump Elliott and cousin of former Cyclone assistant coach Bobby Elliott, lettered three times in football as a defensive back. He played for the Michigan squad that went to the 1972 Rose Bowl. Elliott also played in the 1975 Hula Bowl and was invited to play in the 1975 American Bowl. Dave and his wife, Peggy, are the parents of two daughters, Catherine Lynn (6) and Christina (4).

TIM BALD

Program Coordinator



Tim Bald is in his third season as Iowa State's program coordinator, organizing the recruiting and administrative responsibilities in the Cyclone football program.

The Freeport, Ill., native came to the Cyclones from the Washington Redskins of the National Football League. He served as the Redskins' administrative intern in charge of player personnel.

The 30-year-old Bald is a 1980 graduate of Loras College where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He received his master's degree in Physical Education with an emphasis in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1985.

JIMMY BURROW

Defensive Secondary



Secondary coach Jimmy Burrow came to Iowa State in January of 1987 with Head Coach Jim Walden, after five seasons as a full-time coach at Washington State, the last four as the Cougars' secondary coach. The 34-year old Burrow coached tight ends at WSU in 1982.

Burrow's association with Walden dates back to his high school days in Amory, Miss. Walden was Burrow's coach in ninth and tenth grade football and baseball. Burrow attended the University of Mississippi for one season before transferring to Nebraska where he was reunited with Walden. At Nebraska, Burrow earned second-team all-Big Eight honors his senior season and was an academic All-American. A member of the 1972 Orange Bowl and 1973 Cotton Bowl teams, he also played in the 1974 Sugar Bowl and 1975 Fiesta Bowl. He graduated with a B.S. in education.

Burrow was picked in the eighth round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Green Bay Packers

JON FABRIS

Outside Linebackers



Jon Fabris, who coached the tight ends under Jim Walden at Washington State (1983-86), will coach the Cyclone linebackers in 1988. Fabris, a native of Starkville, Miss., first joined Walden's WSU staff in 1982, when he assisted with the secondary, coached the offensive scout team and scouted the opposition's kicking game.

Fabris coached the junior varsity defensive backfield and defensive scout team at Georgia Tech in 1980, before working for an oil company in 1981. He earned four varsity

LINDSAY HUGHES

Tight Ends



For Iowa State tight end coach Lindsay Hughes, the 1988 season will mark his 21st campaign in the collegiate coaching ranks and his 11th under Head Coach Jim Walden. Hughes coached the outside linebackers at Washington State.

Hughes started his coaching career as the freshman coach at San Jose State in 1967. He was a graduate assistant in charge of the offensive scout team and assisted with linebackers at Florida State in 1968, when the Seminoles played in the Peach Bowl. In 1969, the Redondo Beach, Calif., native worked with the secondary. He went to San Diego State in 1970-71 where he was an assistant coach working with the linebackers. From 1972-74 he was an assistant coach at Los Amigos (Calif.) High. He spent three seasons (1975-77) at Cerritos College as an assistant in charge of the linebackers.

Hughes played center for two years at San Jose State, earning a bachelor's degree in physical education. He received his master's in physical education from San Diego State in 1971. Hughes had earned All-America honors as a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College in 1964. Hughes and his wife, Bonnie, have one daughter, Nicole (18).

STEVE MORTON

Offensive Line



Steve Morton's second year at Iowa State is his 14th in collegiate coaching and his 11th under Head Coach Jim Walden. The Chehalis, Wash., native coaches the Cyclone offensive line-the same position he held at Washington State for the past five seasons.

an offensive line assistant. He was a defensive line assistant in 1976 and junior varsity and assistant offensive line coach in 1977.

Morton played at Grays Harbor (Wash.) Junior College in 1972 and 1973. He played two seasons and won the Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award, earning All-NWJC honors. Morton played guard and center at Washington State in 1973-74 before graduating with a bachelor's in physical education. The 34-year old Morton and his wife, Karen, are the parents of two children, Beau (12) and Bethany (8).

ROBIN ROSS

Defensive Coordinator



Robin Ross, Iowa State's defensive coordinator and inside linebacker coach begins his third season under Jim Walden. The Pico Rivera, Calif., native was the defensive line coach at Washington State in 1986.

Ross moved to Washington State after a two-year stint at Cincinnati. In 1984, he coached the defensive line and was strength and conditioning coordinator. In 1985, he was the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. From 1979-83, Ross coached the defensive line and was the recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State. He started at CSLB as an assistant offensive line and tight end coach, a position he held during the 1977 and 1978 seasons.

Ross was a two-year starter (1974-75) at Washington State, where he earned second team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention All-America offensive tackle. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1977.

Mel Sanders' second season at Iowa State is his 12th under Cyclone Head Coach Jim Walden. The Los Angeles, Calif., native played under Walden at Washington State for four seasons (1976-80) before joining the WSU coaching staff after graduating in 1981.

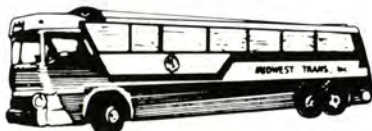
Sanders' first coaching assignment was assisting with the outside linebackers in 1981. In 1982, he tutored the WSU defensive line. Sanders assumed administrative and offensive line coaching duties in 1983. He coordinated the Freshmen Athlete Scholastic Training (FAST) program at Washington State.

The 30-year old Sanders was a four-year starter at Washington State, where he earned second-team freshman All-America honors from *Football News*. He injured his ankle in the 1977 season opener and was redshirted. Sanders came back to start the next three seasons for the Cougars. During the 1978 season, he was credited with 80 stops, ranking him second on the squad in tackles. He recorded 56 tackles in 1980, including two quarterback sacks. Sanders made 241 career tackles, including 149 solo stops in his career.

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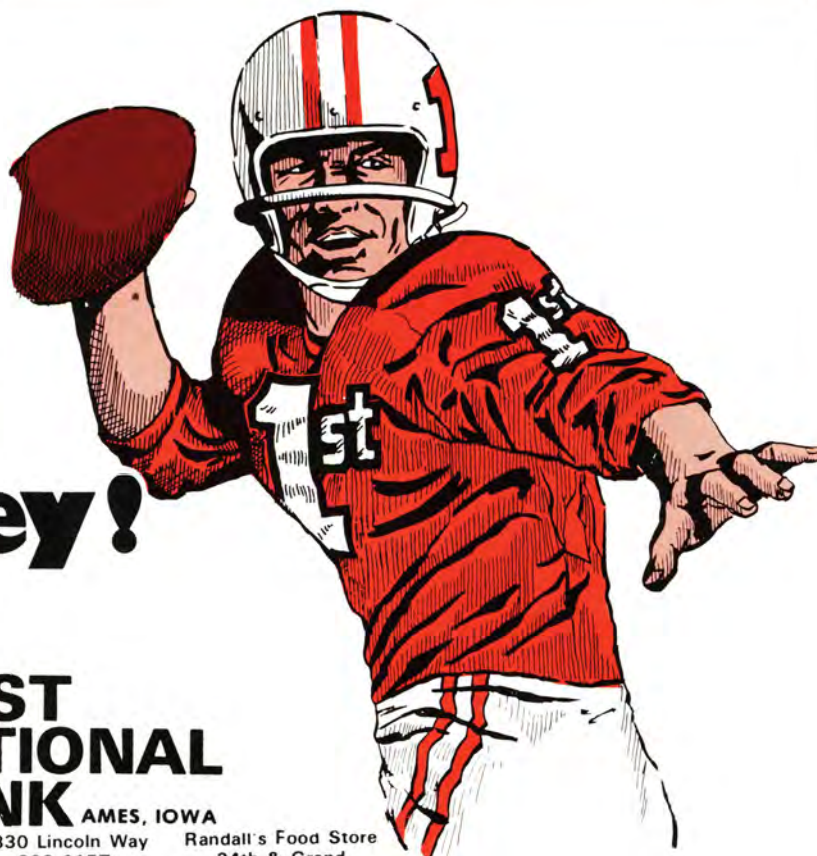

CYCLONE STADIUM/JACK TRICE FIELD



Without a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field.

Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, with lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years from the ground breaking, on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force, on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy

earth-moving equipment shaped the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,101 for the 1987 Iowa State-Iowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters and eight broadcast teams as well as a cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section, seating in theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of

structural steel and has a four-inch-thick asphalt base under a new All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

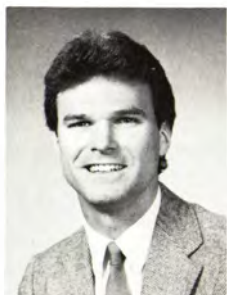
Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.

The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.

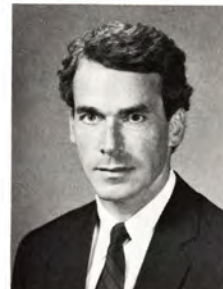

Buccaneers since 1984.

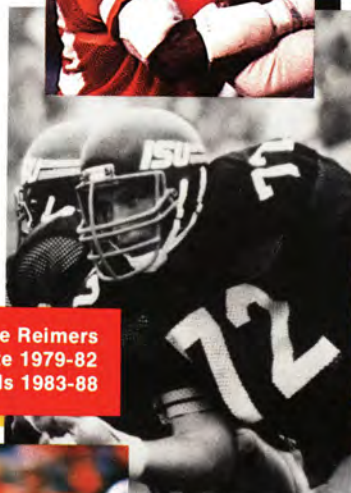
Bruce Reimers has enjoyed a successful pro career with the Cincinnati Bengals over the past five seasons.

Stensrud (Houston Oilers, Minnesota Vikings) are among this elite group of Cyclone athletes.



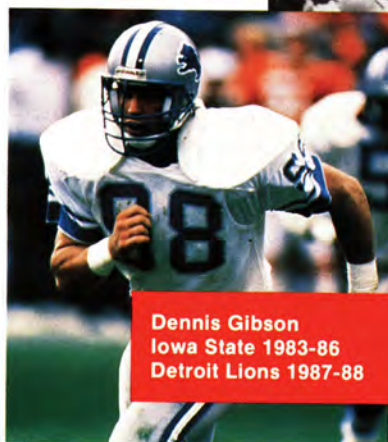

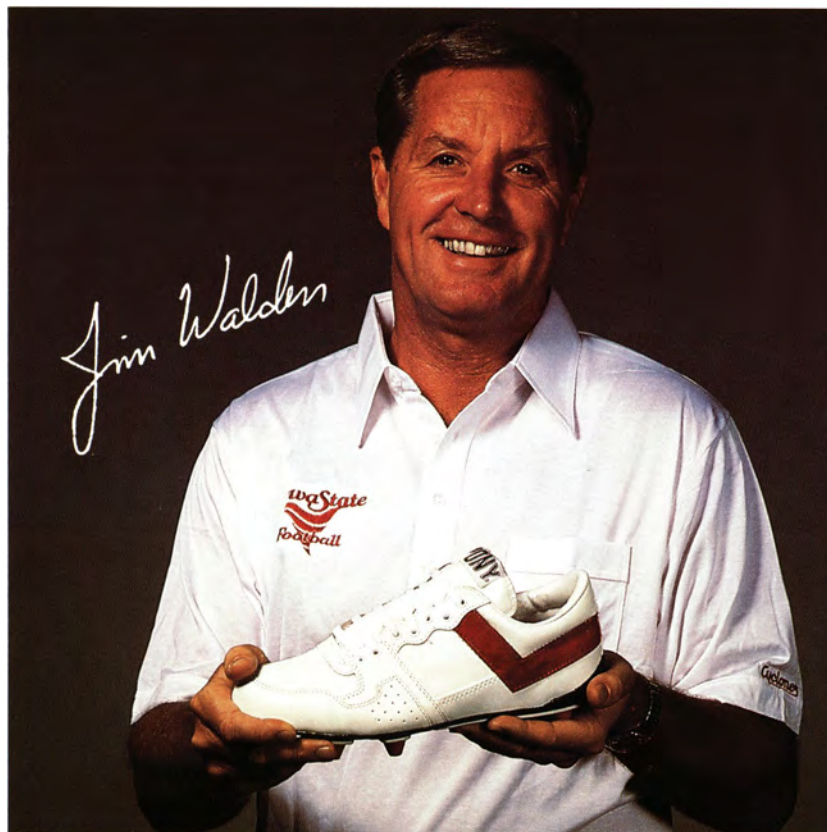
