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TODAY'S GAME

Cyclone Seniors Leave Records, Memories Behind

Four years of accomplishment behind them, 13 Iowa State seniors will play their final game in a Cyclone uniform this afternoon. Names like Robertson, Giotfelty, Moore and Bauer are part of the crew that joined Jim Walden in his rebuilding effort at Iowa State in 1987. Some of them walked on and later earned a scholarship. All have been a part of the steady improvement in the Cyclone football program over the last four seasons. Each would like to go out a winner this afternoon as ISU closes out the 1990 season against Oklahoma State.

Iowa State's seniors leave a slew of school records in their wake. Blaise Bryant, who last year had the best season of any runningback in ISU history, starts today's game as Iowa State's sixth-leading career rusher, with 2,237 yards. It should be noted that Bryant, who set the ISU single-season rushing mark with 1,516 yards last season, has far fewer carries than any of the runners above him on the school record chart. A single touchdown this afternoon would make Bryant Iowa State's fourth-all-time leading scorer behind Jeff Shudak, Dexter Green and Alex Giffords.

Shudak upped his school record for career points in heroic fashion last weekend, hitting on an ISU-record five field goals for 15 points to propel Iowa State to a 27-25 victory over Missouri. Shudak's final kick, a 36-yarder into a stiff wind with 14 seconds left, gave the Council Bluffs native a school record 261 career points. His performance earned the ISU kicker Big Eight Offensive-Player-of-the-Week honors. Since his auspicious four field-goal debut at Tulane in 1987, Shudak has kicked a school record 57 field goals in 77 attempts.

Senior John Giotfelty has seen a little bit of everything. A former quarterback at Ames High and at ISU, Giotfelty switched to receiver and has made 54 career catches for 864 yards and five touchdowns. His counterpart, Troy Moore, has 29 career receptions for 501 yards and one touchdown.

Much of Iowa State's offensive success over the past three seasons is due in great part to three offensive linemen playing in their last game today. Gene Williams, George Tsiotsias and Chris Mussman have paved the way for Bryant, Pedersen and the ISU offensive unit that has already etched a large portion of marks in the school record book. Tight end Craig Mahoney, who has caught 14 passes for 179 yards this season, has bigger plans upon graduation. The Mason City native has been accepted to the University of Iowa Medical School and has earned a \$13,000 scholarship from the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame to help fund his studies.

An injury has already ended Marcus Robertson's collegiate career, but perhaps no other player epitomizes Iowa State's fight for football recognition. The Altadena, Calif. native has started nearly every game since coming to ISU in the fall of 1987. A 1989 first-team all-conference selection, Robertson had six interceptions and 260 tackles in his 40 games in a Cyclone uniform. Jeff Bauer and Dave Eder, who walked on the Iowa State roster and later earned scholarships after playing with Robertson in the Cyclone secondary, are also making their farewell appearance. Another former walk-on, linebacker Jim Doran, will play in his final game this afternoon.

The Iowa State defense will face one of its biggest challenges today when it tries to stop Oklahoma State's Gerald Hudson. One of college football's biggest secrets nationally, Hudson ranks third among the nation's rushers,

with 1,378 yards and nine touchdowns. Three weeks ago in a 48-28 win over Missouri, the senior rushed for 255 yards on 34 carries to earn Big Eight Player-of-the-Week honors. The Waxahachie, Texas native has topped the 100-yard rushing plateau seven times this season. Hudson, who originally played behind Barry Sanders during his career, had 178 yards against Kansas, 171 yards against Northern Iowa and 150 yards at Kansas State this fall. In Oklahoma State's 41-22 loss at Colorado last Saturday, Hudson rushed for 91 yards and one touchdown. Buffalo linebacker Kanavis McGhee called Hudson "the best back we have faced this year. He cuts upfield and has the ability to make people miss. I think he sees the whole field."

Three different Cowboys have started at quarterback. Junior Kenny Ford, who completed 15 of 33 passes for 219 yards and one touchdown against Colorado, has started four games for Oklahoma State. He has passed for 410 yards and four touchdowns, but has thrown seven interceptions. He is second on the team with 284 rushing yards. Sophomore Earl Wheeler has also started four games at quarterback, throwing for a team-high 727 yards. Senior Chris Smith has started two games at quarterback.

Oklahoma State leads the series, 18-12-1, 6-2 in Cyclone Stadium. The Cyclones beat the Cowboys, 31-21, last season in Stillwater, Okla. Blaise Bryant rushed 33 times for 208 yards and two touchdowns to lead Iowa State to victory, locking up a winning season. The Cyclones jumped out to a 24-7 lead and then held off a Cowboy comeback for the win. ISU senior Tim Baker finished his career at safety on a high note, intercepting two Mike Gundy passes and recovering a fumble.

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THIS IS IOWA STATE

Since the first students enrolled at Iowa State, the institution has been committed to academic excellence. Iowa State's reputation for scholarship is internationally known and Iowa State's students are respected nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts, while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

One of the largest institutions governed by the State Board of Regents, Iowa State is a major Midwestern center of learning for more than 25,000 students, from all 50 states and 100 other nations. Iowa State attracts a diverse student body with a wide range of undergraduate and graduate programs, a student to teaching faculty ratio of 12 to 1 and an average class size of 29 students. More than 120 undergraduate programs of study are available from Iowa State's eight colleges: Agriculture, Business Administration, Design, Education, Engineering, Family and Consumer Sciences, Sciences and Humanities and Veterinary Medicine.

The picturesque campus is comfortably situated in a central campus "park" - a splendid combination of conventional and contemporary architecture. ISU's classrooms and buildings are a blend of the old and the new, nestled amid thousands of trees and acres of greenery. The ultra-modern south campus is dominated by the Iowa State Center, Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field, and the

College of Veterinary Medicine.

The Iowa State Center, which boasts one of the nation's finest facilities of its kind, consists of the C.Y. Stephens Auditorium, the J.W. Fisher Theater, the Scheman Continuing Education Center, and the James H.

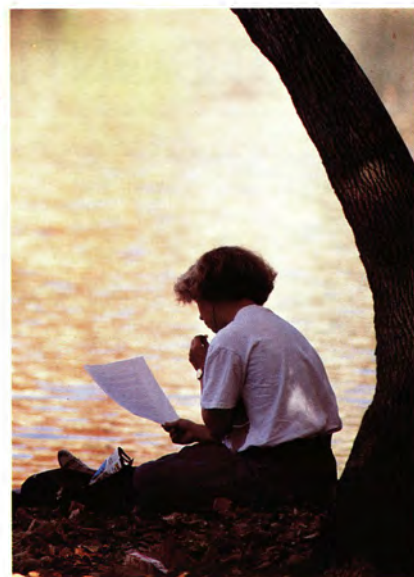
Hilton Coliseum. Concert facilities draw some of the top names in entertainment. Bruce Springsteen, Tina Turner, Bill Cosby, the Rolling Stones, Paul McCartney, and the Broadway hit "Cats" have been featured on campus.

One of the highlights of the year occurs in spring as the campus blooms with tulips and apple blossoms just in time for the Veishea celebration. "Veishea" is ISU's annual open house and the largest student-run festival in the nation, complete with parade, exhibits and thousands of alumni. The campus is also a breathtaking sight in the fall, when autumn colors and leaves make it a cardinal and gold show place.

Sports are a vital part of the life at Iowa State, as the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 21 men's and women's sports and the extensive intramural program boasts one of the highest student participation rates in the country. A number of Cyclone intercollegiate teams have been nationally ranked in recent years and several have brought home national titles. Iowa State has also produced 24 Olympians, three of whom captured gold medals. While athletics remain in the spotlight, the academic side shares equal time.

The opportunities that Iowa State offers stretch beyond the lengths of academics and athletics. There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports, as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized, along with the top-notch academic advising program.

Iowa State University is an institution founded on a commitment to academic challenge, achievement and excellence. Iowa State reaches beyond this by offering its students some of the most advanced athletic, cultural and social opportunities in the Midwest.



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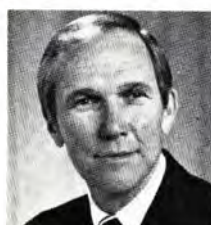
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SU INTERIM PRESIDENT — MILTON GLICK

Milton D. Glick became provost of Iowa State University in 1988 and interim president in October 1990.

He is the second provost in Iowa State history. (The first was James H. Jensen from 1953-61). Glick's appointment as provost brought the teaching, research and extension functions together in a single office at Iowa State.

He has been particularly active in increasing representation of minorities and women on the Iowa State faculty and increasing access to computers as a research and teaching tool.

Glick was born July 30, 1937 in Memphis, Tennessee, and grew up in Rock Island, Illinois. He received a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Augustana College in 1959, graduating cum laude. He earned a Ph.D. in chemistry in 1965 from the University of Wisconsin, and was a postdoctoral

fellow in 1966 at Cornell University.

He was dean of the College of Arts and Science and a professor of chemistry at the University of Missouri from 1983 until he joined the ISU administration.

Glick was on the faculty at Wayne State University, Detroit, from 1966 to 1983, serving as assistant professor, associate professor, professor and chairman of the department of chemistry.

SU ATHLETIC DIRECTOR — MAX URICK

Max Urick, one of the most respected and popular athletic administrators in the Big Eight, has served as Iowa State's Director of Athletics for seven years. He was named to the post on June 1, 1983, after serving as both an assistant and associate director to the 21-sport intercollegiate program for nine seasons.

The 11th athletic director in Iowa State history, Urick has been effective in working with all segments of the athletic public, including the faculty, staff, the student body, Cyclone coaches, alumni and friends of the university.

Urick has been at Iowa State during, and was instrumental in, an exciting growth period for Cyclone athletics, marked by the merging of the men's and women's athletic programs, which was a landmark achievement in Iowa State athletic history. Among his duties is supervision of the stadium (constructed in 1975 with a 50,000-seat capacity), a nine-lane, synthetic-surfaced track facility, a softball and baseball complex, and six all-weather tennis courts. Urick also played an integral role in the construction of Iowa State's new indoor facility.

With these outstanding facilities — believed to

be the best in the conference and among the best nationally — Iowa State has been active in hosting Big Eight and NCAA championship competition.

Prior to his arrival at Iowa State, Urick coached collegiate football for 13 years. He was the head coach at Wabash College (1967-71) and was an assistant at West Point (1961-62), Ohio State (1963-65), Denison (1966), and Duke (1971-73).

The Troy, Ohio native was an All-American football and lacrosse player, as well as a conference wrestling champion, prior to his 1961 graduation from Ohio Wesleyan. He also holds a master's degree from Ohio State.

Urick is the father of three — daughter Courtney, and sons Mark and Michael.

IOWA STATE HEAD COACH — JIM WALDEN

Nearly four years ago, Iowa State University began the search for a football coach. The Cyclones were looking for a new direction, a new personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State program. ISU found all of those ingredients in Jim Walden, and on December 16, 1986, the former Washington State mentor became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can and to work as hard as I know how." Walden proved to be a man of his word, bringing greater success both on and off the field to each of his Cyclone squads.

His first ISU team finished 3-8-0 and demonstrated consistent improvement throughout the season. The Cyclone offense gained almost 4,000 yards and the ISU attack featured several trick plays.

His 1988 team improved to 5-6-0 and challenged for a winning season. The team finished fifth in the Big Eight Conference and took a 5-5-0 mark into the final game against Oklahoma State.

The third time proved to be the charm, as Walden's 1989 squad went 6-5-0 for the school's first winning season under his direction, posting ISU's best road record since 1978 with a 4-1 mark. Along the way, the Cyclones set a team record for rushing touchdowns (30), while taking over the No. 2 slot on the season chart for passing yardage (2,297). Both Iowa State's rushing offense and total offense ended the year ranked in the top 25 nationally. Following the regular season, Walden was tabbed as an assistant coach for the East-West Shrine Game.

His 1989 team featured the 1-2 punch of junior running-back Blaise Bryant and senior quarterback Bret Oberg. Bryant led all Big Eight players in rushing, scoring, and all-purpose running, while Oberg led the league in pass completion percentage and total offense, in addition to ranking among the nation's top 10 in passing efficiency. Both athletes set numerous ISU records, while Oberg smashed the Big Eight Conference career passing completion percentage record. Bryant and tight end Mike Busch were selected to All-America teams.

As the head coach at Washington State for nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific 10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and ranks second among all-time Cougar coaches for both wins and longevity.

Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 Conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intra state rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in three of Walden's last five years in Pullman, Wash.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in Walden's last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

The 52-year-old Walden was actually at Washington State for 10 years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regular-season finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

Walden's success did not go unnoticed by his peers. He earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the

Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine Game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1977. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden came to ISU familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden

joined Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.

As a college quarterback at Wyoming, Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

An excellent speaker, Walden is in demand for outside engagements. The NCAA has selected him twice as a guest speaker at its annual College Football Preview, in 1983 and 1985. Since coming to ISU, he's become a popular figure with both students and fans in appearances across the state. Since the day he was hired, Jim Walden has proven that he is the "right person" to bring a new direction, new attitude, and new personality to the Iowa State football program.



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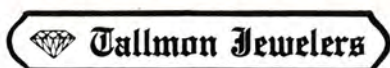
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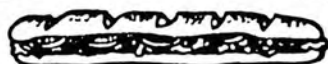


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S STADIUM INFORMATION

First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms

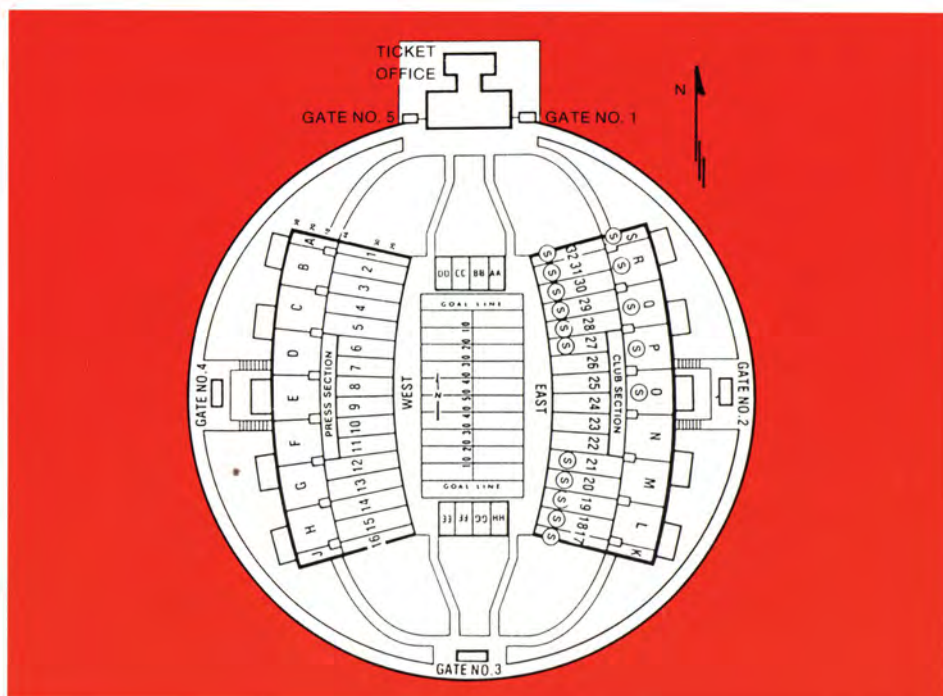
Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.

Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level behind the goal posts.



No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.

Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium any bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown onto the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department provides portable toilets for its patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

Iowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of Iowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by Iowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building, before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department

reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e.; ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure a pleasant enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

- Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

- If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed police officer to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium.

- An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.

Glotfelty at Home as Wide Receiver

Four years ago, John Glotfelty was shredding defenses in the rugged Metro Conference from his position as quarterback of the Ames High Little Cyclones. During the past four seasons, Glotfelty has in no way stopped shredding opposing defenses. However, with nearly a half-mile in receiving yards as evidence, the senior has obviously found new ways to do it.

After breaking the collarbone on the side of his throwing arm, Glotfelty knew that he needed to find another place to play on the Cyclone roster. Head coach Jim Walden and the ISU coaching staff decided to let the young quarterback enlist in the Cyclone receiving corps, and the switch has been beneficial to all concerned.

"I really wanted to play quarterback here, but after I broke my collarbone, I knew it just wasn't going to be possible," Glotfelty said. "I wasn't too worried about playing receiver. If anything, it gave me a chance to play a little quicker than I could have."

As a quarterback at Ames, Glotfelty was tabbed as a second-team all-state selection. He helped lead the Little Cyclones to the second round of the class 4A playoffs his senior season, throwing for 1,284 yards and 10 touchdowns, while rushing for 450 yards and seven touchdowns.

He made the switch to receiver during the spring of 1988, and went on to catch five passes for 49 yards the following fall.

Coming into his senior season at ISU, Glotfelty had grabbed 27 passes for 443 yards and two touchdowns. The majority of that came last season when the Ames native collected 394 yards on 22 catches. His 1989 yardage total stood as the second-highest among Iowa State receivers, and ranked 15th on the Big Eight chart.

Glotfelty picked up this season right where he left off a year ago. Heading into his curtain call this afternoon against Oklahoma State, he has rolled up 421 receiving yards on 27 catches, including three grabs for touchdowns. His yardage total places him second among Cyclone receivers, and 11th in the conference.

Last Saturday versus Missouri, Glotfelty chalked up one of his three touchdown catches of the year—this one in the form of a 42-yard scoring strike from Chris Pedersen—which helped Iowa State climb back into the game after falling behind 17-6 at halftime.

"Boy! Was I open, or what?" Glotfelty said. "The free safety ran right by me, and I thought 'where is he going?' I figured we fumbled, so I turned around to look, and Pete (quarterback Chris Pedersen) was looking right at me and just threw it down there."

After being shut out in ISU's season-opening victory over Northern Iowa, the 181-pound wide receiver got hot. Against Minnesota, he caught a game-high six passes for 107 yards. At Iowa, his statistics included six receptions for 92 yards and two touchdowns. When Iowa State returned home to defeat Western Michigan, he led the team for the third straight week, this time with five catches for 74 yards. In ISU's Big Eight opener, it was the Kansas defense that received a large dose of the Pedersen-Glotfelty connection—74 yards worth on six passes to be exact.

While perhaps taking Iowa State's opponents by surprise during those first five games, those numbers were not unusual to Iowa State assistant coach Dave Elliott, who is in charge of the Cyclone receivers.

"John has really good football sense, along with a lot of experience and playing time," Elliott said.

Elliott had the responsibility of helping Glotfelty make the transition from quarterback to receiver during 1988.

"I wasn't worried at all about whether he could make the switch," Elliott said. "He's a good athlete and he has adapted well to the position. He has continually gotten better the more he has played."

The four weeks that followed the Kansas game turned out to be a trying stretch for Glotfelty, after getting off to such a fast start. The Cyclones were forced to play in some of the worst weather conditions of the year. Passing the ball was a near impossibility, and when Iowa State could throw it, Glotfelty found himself being accompanied by opposing defensive backs everywhere he went. During that four-game stretch, he caught only two passes for 22 yards, and was shut out by Oklahoma and Kansas State.

"I would have to admit I got a little frustrated right away when they started keying on me," he said. "But, it opened things up for some of the other guys, like Chris Spencer. He's a great receiver, and it might have helped him get his hands on the ball by having somebody on me all the time."

Along with Spencer, Glotfelty shares the primary receiving duties with tight end Craig Mahoney, runningbacks Blaise Bryant and Sherman Williams, and wide receiver Troy Moore. In 1989, Glotfelty and Moore combined for 699 yards on 39 receptions with three touchdowns. With one game remaining, the duo is keeping up that same pace, as they now stand with a combined total of 608 yards receiving on 38 catches with three scores.

While the 1990 campaign has fallen short of some pre-season expectations, Glotfelty feels that there are still some positive things to look at, both for this season and for the future.

"It's been a real roller coaster this season," he said. "First, we won one, and then went out and lost two that we really felt we could have won. I think the first real turning point was Kansas. After that game, I think we realized that we just weren't as good as we had hoped we'd be and I think there were a lot of factors that went into that, with our injuries and all. But, then we went to Oklahoma and won. That seemed to put everything behind us. I guess that was kind of our bowl game."

"That game was a real indication of where the program is going. It's definitely on the right track. I know the coaches really don't like to talk about bowl games, but there are going to be some good things to come in the future."

Fever Spreads Through Cyclone Country

As the 1990 football season comes to a close, the Iowa State Athletic Department is already developing ways to bring a new excitement to the 1991 season for fans throughout the state.

Kickoff Fever 1991, an inspiring four-week promotion involving food manufacturers, brokers and retailers, is about to make its debut. The program is a statewide effort created to raise funds in support of scholastic achievement within athletics at Iowa's three state universities: Iowa State University, the University of Northern Iowa and the University of Iowa.

Brokers, manufacturers and wholesalers select products to be used for Kickoff Fever, while including the three school's logos in the promotion. For each product they wish to affiliate with the program, they must pay a \$2,500 participation fee.

Kickoff Fever offers increased sales for the food companies, while retailers benefit from additional customer traffic and the use of in-store display materials provided to promote the sale of official Kickoff Fever products. Not only do the retailers and manufacturers benefit, but the universities also profit from the program. All revenues from the participation fees will be divided between the three universities for their respective athletic scholarship programs.

The Kickoff Fever promotion will run in participating retail outlets statewide Sept. 8, 1991-Oct. 5, 1991. The specified time is designed to utilize the excitement created by the start of the new college football season, while incorporating the unique loyalty Iowans have to the football programs at all three universities. Although Kickoff Fever has been targeted for use during the football season, the profits will be divided among all athletic teams.

To promote the project, a four-color insert featuring coupons for all of the official products will appear Sept. 8, 1991. In addition, one million advertising supplements will be dispersed through newspapers and at university-sponsored events.

Kickoff Fever also will provide consumers with a chance to win the Official Kickoff Fever Sweepstakes. Prizes are provided by the universities and include such items as weekend packages to an athletic event, hotel accommodations, and official Kickoff Fever merchandise. There is no cost for participation.

Retailers who include official Kickoff Fever products in their advertising are encouraged to join in the Official Kickoff Fever Retailer Lottery. To participate, retailers submit weekly newspaper advertisements that must feature a minimum of 10 official Kickoff Fever products, along with the official Kickoff Fever logo. The more weekly advertisements entered, the greater the chance to win tickets to the Official Kickoff Fever Tailgate party. This party will be held at one of the three participating universities in conjunction with the annual convention of the Grocers Association of Iowa.

Joan Bowles, program manager for the Athletic Development Office at Iowa State University, has helped



organize the Kickoff Fever concept for the past year.

"One of the most important ideas is probably the endorsement of Kickoff Fever by the National Grocers Association," she said. "It is a unique opportunity for us to work together toward a common goal."

But even more important is what this project will bring to Iowa's state universities, she said.

"This is what people have been waiting for," Bowles said. "It's the first project that all three schools have worked together on. That concept alone brings with it a totally new market, and new avenues to discover."

A similar program was started in 1985 at Ohio State University by then-Athletic Director Rick Bay. The idea was actually created by Bay during his three-year stint as athletic director for the University of Oregon. In its infancy, Bay was able to make the project a statewide program, in conjunction with Oregon State University. The Ohio State campaign, known as Buckeye Fever, generated approximately \$210,000 dollars in its first two years, allowing for 21-23 scholarships.

With the success of Ohio State's program, other schools began to take interest, including the University of Iowa, who participated in a project known as Hawkeye Fever the last two years.

But with the increasing numbers of alumni, parents, students, and faculty residing in the three university communities, the possibilities of providing the best opportunities for both academic and athletic excellence are endless, as the schools join forces in making the campaign a statewide effort.

"Together, Iowa's state universities can provide better academic and athletic support for their student-athletes, while strengthening ties with the business community," Bowles said. "With Kickoff Fever, everyone is a winner."

SCOUTING REPORT



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The Series: Oklahoma State holds an 18-12-1 advantage over the Cyclones. The Cowboys lead the series, 8-7, in Ames and 6-2 in Cyclone Stadium. Last season Blaise Bryant rushed 33 times for 208 yards and two touchdowns to lead Iowa State to a 31-21 victory. Bryant, who finished the game as ISU's all-time leading single-season rusher, scored on a 4-yard run with 12:59 left in the first quarter. Iowa State led, 24-7, with 10:49 left in the third quarter after ISU quarterback Bret Oberg scored on a 16-yard run. The Cyclones then held off the Cowboys to post their first winning season since 1986.

Last Weekend: Oklahoma State held off Colorado for a little more than two quarters, but the Buffs exploded for three third-quarter touchdowns to ice a 41-22 win in Boulder, Colo. Oklahoma State's Gerald Hudson rushed for 91 yards and Robert Kirksey had a career-high five catches for 88 yards. The Colorado win over OSU clinched the Big Eight title and a second straight trip to the Orange Bowl for the Buffaloes.

Offensively: The Oklahoma State offense has averaged 33 points per game over the last three contests after scoring just 15.4 points per game in the first seven contests. Gerald Hudson is the nation's third-leading rusher with 1,378 yards through ten games. The Cowboys have used three different quarterbacks this season. Junior Kenny Ford has started the last four contests. He has completed 43 percent of his passes for 410 yards and four touchdowns. He has also thrown seven interceptions. He is the team's second-leading rusher.

Defensively: Defensive lineman Stacey Satterwhite has been one of OSU's top guns. He had six tackles last weekend, including one for a loss at Colorado. Freshman free safety Scott Harmon, making his second straight start, came up with his first interception. As a team, the Cowboys are allowing 400 yards per game, which ranks sixth in the Big Eight and 80th overall.

Kicking: Harmon, who had a 38-yard kickoff return against Kansas, had two returns for 45 yards against Colorado, including a 26-yarder. Placekicker Cary Blanchard is one of the nation's best. A first-team all-Big Eight selection a year ago, he has hit on 50 of 70 career field goal attempts. Blanchard set an NCAA record in 1988-89, hitting on 86 straight extra-point attempts. He also serves as the team's punter, averaging 41.0 yards per kick.

The Coach: Pat Jones is finishing his seventh season as Oklahoma State's head coach. He has been on the varsity football staff longer than any coach in OSU history, taking a 51-29 mark into today's game. During his tenure Oklahoma State has averaged eight wins per season, the best six-year plus average of any era in Cowboy history. Jones owns a 12-11 Big Eight mark on the road. He is 4-2 against the Cyclones, 1-1 in Ames.

CYCLONE ACADEMIC SUCCESS HIGHLIGHTS

1989-90 School Year

The Iowa State University Athletic Department's commitment to serving its student-athletes is underscored by the scholastic success achieved by Cyclone competitors last season. In all, 94 ISU athletes earned Big Eight Conference Honor Roll recognition for maintaining a grade point average of 3.00 or higher during the 1989-90 academic year and earning a varsity letter in their respective sports.

A total of 40 Iowa State athletes earned first-team all-Big Eight academic honors last season, the highest total in school history. An additional 46 ISU athletes earned honorable mention all-Big Eight academic recognition.

Among these student-athletes are four individuals who were recognized by ISU as high scholarship honorees for last season. Shannon Boals, a member of the football team, posted a 3.80 GPA in mechanical engineering; Darron Jones, a member of ISU's wrestling team, had a 3.96 GPA in zoology; track and cross country team member Lisa Skidmore posted a 4.00 GPA for the third straight year in biology; and Julie Witt, a member of the softball team and a pre-business major, had a 3.74 GPA.

Two student-athletes were tabbed by ISU officials for Big Eight Medal of Honor recognition after the 1989-90 season. Lee-Jay Strifler, Big Eight record-holder in the one- and three-meter diving events, was nominated after posting a 3.17 GPA in biochemistry. Strifler earned All-American honors by placing fourth in the one-meter competition at the 1990 NCAA Championships. Women's basketball team member Shelly Coyle recorded a 3.12 GPA in physical education during the season. The forward/center was a first-team all-Big Eight selection as well as a first-team academic all-conference pick.

The Cyclone softball squad landed two players on the GTE Academic All-America team for the second year in a row. Outfielder Jenny Condon earned first-team honors after posting a 3.44 GPA in physical education. Denise Harper, a catcher for the ISU squad, earned third-team honors with a 3.78 GPA in physical education. Skidmore took third-team GTE at-large honors with her perfect 4.00 GPA.

CYCLONE STADIUM/JACK TRICE FIELD



Without a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field. Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field, as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, and the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, while providing lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years, from the ground breaking on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy earth-moving equipment sculpted the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,458 for the 1989 Iowa State-Iowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters, as well as eight radio broadcast teams, and three television crews. A

cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms complete the media facility. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is also an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section, with theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge, as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of structural steel, and has a four-inch-thick asphalt base under an All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.

The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as through athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.

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CYCLONE SPOTLIGHT

Doran's Determination Brings Success

Jim Doran followed in his father's footsteps five years ago when he decided to come to Iowa State and play football. Jim, Sr., an All-American receiver for the Cyclones in 1954, left the decision solely in his son's hands.

"I knew my dad played here, but that really didn't influence me to come to Ames," said the Paton, Iowa native. "I have always followed Iowa State and I wanted to come here. This was the only school that I was interested in."

Doran was recruited by smaller schools, but didn't consider them because he had his heart set on becoming a Cyclone. He walked on to the ISU team in 1986, and after lettering three times for play mostly on the special teams, was awarded a scholarship for the 1990 season.

Lant Doran, Jim's younger brother, joined the Cyclones in 1989. He also joins his brother on the special teams.

"I wanted Lant to come here and play," Jim said. "He had scholarship offers to go elsewhere, but I'm glad he's here. We don't get the chance to go head-to-head much since we both play on defense. It's a lot of fun when we are both in there at the same time."

Jim, who played in nine games last season, led the special teams with 10 tackles.

"Lant is only a couple off the lead this year," Jim said. "Since I led the team last year, I'd like to see Lant lead the team this year."

The elder Doran hasn't had much of a chance to post leading numbers this year due to a series of nagging injuries. He currently has 49 tackles on the season, seeing action in eight of the Cyclones' 10 games to date.

"I hyper-extended my knee against Iowa and that caused me to miss most of the Western Michigan game," he said.

But he came back from that injury with a great performance against Oklahoma, posting 15 tackles to lead the team. For his efforts, Doran was named the defensive player of the game for the Cyclones.

The following week against Nebraska, Doran strained his neck in the second quarter, and again found himself on the sidelines.

"When I went in for the x-ray, the doctor said one of the reasons for my injury was due to a previous fracture that I didn't know I had," Doran said.

Receiving treatments twice a day has been a part of Doran's rehabilitation.

"I'm still in a little bit of pain," he said. "I'm a little tentative when I go out there. I still can't take a hard shot to the head."

Doran suited for the Kansas State game, but didn't play.

"It was real frustrating not being able to play," he said. "I don't like to watch games from the sidelines. I have only missed one game since high school. I'm the type of guy who wants to play all of the time. Football has taught me a lot of things, especially how to work hard and not

be a quitter. Playing football is like having a job. The ones that will play and work hard are going to move up."

That tough attitude has made the difference in his collegiate career.

"I came to ISU as a defensive back," he said. "Jon Fabris, the outside linebacker coach, saw how I worked hard and asked me to switch to linebacker. Coach Fabris is one of the best on Coach Walden's staff because he has the toughness that it takes to win. I have to give him a lot of credit. He gave me the chance to play because he knows that I won't quit and I'll always work hard. Coach Fabris tells it like it is. I admire him for that."

Coming to Iowa State as a walk-on and working up to a scholarship was tough to do, but definitely worth the effort, Doran said.

"When I came here, I was a nobody," he said. "I had to fight for my life just to stay on the team. I worked hard and finally made my way into the starting lineup. They put me on a scholarship for my last year, but it didn't matter. I was going to play my senior season no matter what. Receiving a scholarship was just a bonus to me. I just wanted to play football."

As Doran looks back on his Cyclone career, there are no regrets, he said.

"I've had a lot of good times. The best thing about playing football here is the friends that I've made," he said.

Doran plans to graduate in the spring with a degree in Agricultural Studies. He'll put his degree to work at home on the farm.

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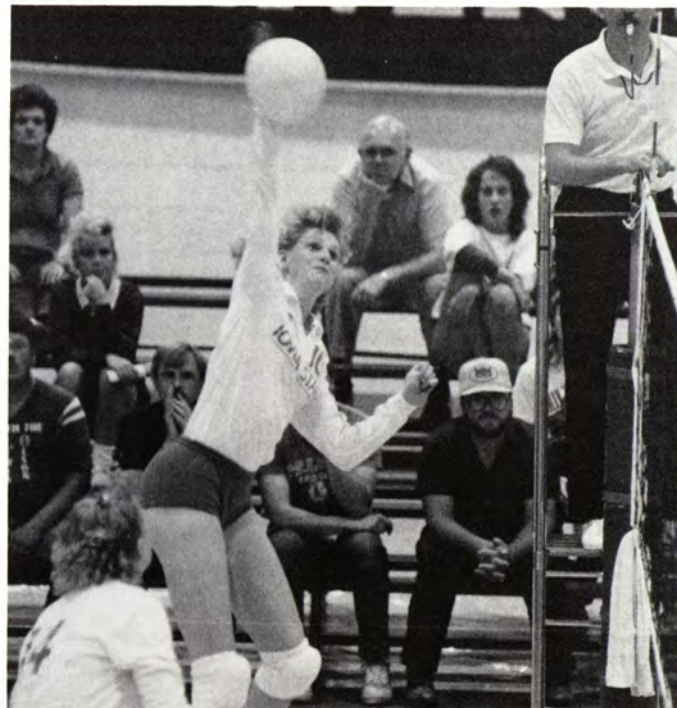

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STRENGTH & CONDITIONING PROGRAM

One of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under the supervision of eight-year strength and conditioning director Tom Wilson and his assistant, Steve Ballenger, Iowa State's student-athletes have made tremendous strides.

The overall goal of Iowa State's program is to keep athletes healthy and prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer-analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers all athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, who previously served four years in the nationally acclaimed program at the University of Nebraska. "ISU has excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. We work with everyone from the 'blue-chip' athlete to the unknown walk-on—our program is intended to help everyone. And utilizing such a strictly supervised strength and conditioning program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become stronger, faster and more disciplined than their opponents."

Iowa State's strength and conditioning program is conducted throughout the calendar year. During the summer and winter months, athletes go through

conditioning and strength training four times per week. The four aerobic workouts consist of concentrating on speed drills and plyometrics two days per week, with the other two spent on conditioning and agility drills. Strength training is also very rigid, with the athlete working a minimum of 1½ hours per workout, and alternating three body parts per day.

During the fall season and spring workouts, maintaining strength and the level of conditioning obtained during the winter and summer months is the primary objective. The goal is for athletes to be as strong for the season finale as they were for the season opener. This is accomplished by following a four-day per week workout schedule, with each player lifting and stretching for approximately 20-30 minutes per day.

Prior to the implementation of a strength and conditioning program, every player is evaluated in six areas. Each athlete is tested on upper and lower body strength, flexibility, agility, power, speed (40-yard dash and 10-yard splits), and cardiovascular endurance. The testing results are then entered into the program's computer and analyzed to illustrate strengths and weaknesses. Each athlete meets individually with the strength and conditioning director to evaluate the results and establish appropriate goals.

"Our program is set up to meet the needs of the individual athlete according to the testing evaluation and the athlete's goal," said Wilson. "We also take into consideration the needs and demands of the sport. All training done is very sport specific."

ATHLETIC SPORTS MEDICINE

Men's Athletic Trainer Frank Randall, his assistant Steve Stricker, and Women's Athletic Trainer Alice McLaine direct Iowa State's sports medicine programs. The men's and women's athletic training staffs work closely with each of Iowa State's teams and, along with the team physician, apply the most recent techniques in the field of sports medicine.

The training staffs are headquartered in four locations on the ISU campus - the Olsen Building, James H. Hilton Coliseum, Beyer Hall, and the Physical Education Building. The staffs also work closely with the team physician, Dr. Alan Philippi, and orthopedic surgeons at McFarland Clinic.

The athletic training rooms, equipment room, and weight room comprise the conditioning component of the athletic program. In the training room, athletic trainers deal with the prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. Each trainer must have working knowledge of the other two areas, however, to properly care for athletes.

Prevention includes taping and padding different areas of the body. Each football player gets both ankles taped prior to every workout and game. All players, except wide receivers and defensive backs, also are equipped with lightweight protective knee braces for each practice and game. Randall played an integral part in the development of the knee brace, which is now being marketed nationwide.

Treatment of athletic injuries is another valuable aspect of the sports medicine program. Treatment methods can be as simple as applying a bag of ice to the injured area, or as complex as utilizing electrical muscle stimulation. Each injured athlete receives at least three treatments per day during the season. Most of the treatment units are portable



and give the athletes the advantage of treatment at home or on the road.

Rehabilitation is necessary following an injury or surgery. Along with receiving treatment, the athlete is tested with various flexibility and strength exercises. All athletes are supervised by a member of the training staff from the first day of rehabilitation until it is completed.

ATHLETIC ACADEMIC SERVICES

At Iowa State University, the word "student" comes first in the term "student-athlete" for a very good reason: being a student **must** come first to keep the privilege of competing in intercollegiate athletics. More than 430 student-athletes in 21 team sports budget their time and energy to practice, travel, and compete while enrolled as full-time students. The Athletic Academic Services staff, which includes director Steve McDonnell and counselors Kathy Lyons and Ed Banach, helps ISU student-athletes become the most successful students they can be through an individualized blend of programs.

New Student-Athlete Orientation

An orientation session is held each semester to welcome all new student-athletes to ISU. The athletic academic counselors provide information about university procedures such as registration, fee payment, and residence hall living. They also explain eligibility requirements, academic support services, and athletic department rules. The counselors help the new student-athletes become familiar with the campus layout and generally assist in their transition to college life at ISU.

Student-Athlete Handbook

ISU student-athletes are given a practical handbook full of up-to-date information about NCAA, Big Eight, and university regulations, plus a list of commonly used local phone numbers. The calendar portion of the handbook can be used for reminders of important dates and for time management purposes.

Study Tables

Regularly scheduled study tables are sponsored for all ISU athletic teams, giving student-athletes a consistent time and place for studying and for meeting with tutors. In addition, the athletic academic counselors instruct student-athletes in study skills and time management techniques.

Tutoring Services

Tutors are available for ISU student-athletes to learn more rapidly, to prepare more thoroughly for classes and tests, and to develop more effective study habits. As a result, student-athletes generally experience reduced test anxiety and improved grades.

The Write Place

This service provides tutoring help when student-athletes write papers for any course at ISU. The staff works individually with student-athletes on whatever skills they need to improve, including punctuation, spelling, expression, formatting, and proofreading. The student-athletes become independent writers as they learn writing skills that will transfer to on-the-job situations and improve their course grades.

Educational Programs

The staff of the Athletic Academic Services unit presents instructional programs on study skills, time management, and stress management to groups of student-athletes, especially in study table settings.

Career Exploration

Student-athletes need preparation for their lives after college. The athletic academic counselors, in conjunction with on-campus resource people, help student-athletes identify their interests and aptitudes, explore college degree programs and related careers, and learn how to write resumes and application letters.

Monitoring of Academic Progress

The main duty of the athletic academic counselors is to identify problems early in each semester and assist in resolving them. They maintain frequent contact with the academic advisers in each college to stay informed about student-athletes' academic status and satisfactory progress within their degree programs. The counselors also send out academic progress report forms to instructors so that they can check the student-athletes' class standings, be alerted to possible tutoring needs, and encourage improved performances.



Intervention/Referral

The athletic academic counselors work with the Student Counseling Service and the Dean of Students Office in diagnosing and resolving the problems faced by student-athletes. Such problems might be personal (coping with a parent's illness, for example) or academic (dealing with a learning disability in the college classroom).

Advocacy

The staff of Athletic Academic Services acts on behalf of student-athletes in negotiating the university system. Student-athletes can receive help in dealing with instructors and administrators to achieve better working relationships within the classroom and the university.

Athletic Academic Recognition Dinner

Those student-athletes who have performed well in the classroom are recognized at a special banquet held in their honor every spring. Invited are those who have achieved a grade point average of at least a 3.00 within the previous two semesters, as are those who have significantly improved their academic performances. Also in attendance are university administrators, faculty members, and athletic department personnel.

Graduation Reception

Each spring, the athletic department sponsors a celebration of graduation for student-athletes, their families, and their friends in the company of department members.

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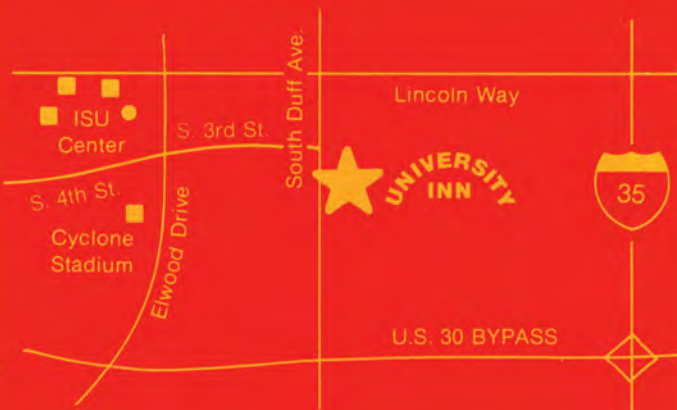

COACHING STAFF

Norm Andersen

Runningbacks

Andersen joined Jim Walden's staff in March of 1987 after nine seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA. For five seasons (1982-86), the former Bruin wide receiver coached and developed some of the nation's top runningbacks at his alma mater, including Gaston Green and Eric Ball. At Iowa State, Andersen guided runningback Joe Henderson to the third spot on the Cyclone career rushing chart, and is now directing All-American Big Eight sensation Blaise Bryant, a pre-season Heisman candidate.

A three-year starter at UCLA (1973-75), Andersen still ranks ninth in career yards per reception, averaging 17.3 yards per catch. He led the Bruins in receiving as a sophomore and a junior, catching 19 passes in 1973 and 27 the following year. An all-Pacific 8 first-team selection in 1974, he was chosen in the 11th round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears.

He is married to the former Heidi Julich, and the couple has a one-year-old daughter, Paris.



Tim Bald

Program Coordinator

Tim Bald is in his fifth season as Iowa State's program coordinator, organizing the recruiting and administrative responsibilities in the Cyclone football program.

The Freeport, Ill., native came to the Cyclones from the Washington Redskins of the National Football League. He served as the Redskins' administrative intern in charge of player personnel. From 1981-83, Bald was an assistant coach at Aquin Central Catholic in Freeport.

A 1980 graduate of Loras College, Bald earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He received his master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1985.

Defensive Ends

The 1990 season is Craig Boller's fourth as an assistant coach at Iowa State. The Belmond native is no stranger to Ames, however, where he lettered three times as an ISU defensive tackle under Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors (1967-69).

Boller came to Iowa State in January of 1987 after serving seven years as the defensive line coach at Oregon State. He was an assistant coach at Memphis State for two seasons (1978-79) after working one year as a part-time assistant coach at Tennessee.

Boller spent three seasons (1974-76) building the William Penn (Iowa) College football program, leading it to the Iowa Conference title in his final season at the helm. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Knoxville High School from 1971-73.

Jimmy Burrow

Defensive Backs

Jimmy Burrow came to Iowa State in January of 1987 with head coach Jim Walden, after five seasons at Washington State. He served as the Cougars' tight end coach in 1982, but spent his last four years at WSU coaching the secondary.

Burrow's association with Walden dates back to his high school days in Amory, Miss. Walden was Burrow's coach in ninth and 10th grade football and baseball. Following his prep career, Burrow attended the University of Mississippi for one season, and then transferred to Nebraska, where he was reunited with Walden. As a Cornhusker, Burrow earned second-team all-Big Eight honors his senior season. He was a member of the 1972 Orange Bowl, 1973 Cotton Bowl, 1974 Sugar Bowl and 1975 Fiesta Bowl teams.

An eighth-round pick in the 1976 NFL draft, Burrow played nine games with the Green Bay Packers, and went on to play five years in the Canadian Football League.

He earned his bachelor's degree in education from Nebraska, and his master's in education administration from Washington State.

Dave Elliott

Wide Receivers

The 1990 season marks Dave Elliott's 16th campaign as an assistant coach, and his 12th season as an assistant to Jim Walden. At Washington State, Elliott tutored the inside linebackers from 1979-86. All-Big Eight wide receiver Dennis Ross is among Elliott's former ISU pupils.

Jon Fabris

Outside Linebackers

Jon Fabris, who coached the tight ends under Jim Walden at Washington State (1983-86), will again coach the Cyclone outside linebackers and kickoff team, as he has done since his arrival at Iowa State in 1987. In addition, Fabris will also coach the Cyclone punt block and punt return units this season.

A native of Starkville, Miss., Fabris first joined Walden's WSU staff in 1982, when he assisted with the defensive backfield, coached the offensive scout team and scouted the opposition's kicking game.

Fabris coached the junior varsity defensive backfield and



defensive scout team at Georgia Tech in 1980, before working for an oil company in 1981. He earned four varsity letters playing all four positions in the defensive backfield at Mississippi (1976-79), including three years as a starter. He ranked third in Southeastern Conference punt returns in 1977 and graduated fifth in career punt returns at Ole Miss. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies in 1980.

Lindsay Hughes

Tight Ends

Cyclone tight end coach Lindsay Hughes marks his 23rd season in the collegiate coaching ranks this year, and his 13th under head coach Jim Walden. As a member of Walden's Washington State staff he tutored the outside linebackers. At Iowa State, Hughes coached NFL draft choice Mike Busch.

Hughes started his coaching career as the freshman coach at San Jose State in 1967. A year later, he served as a graduate assistant in charge of the offensive scout team and assisted with linebackers at Florida State. In 1969, he worked with the Seminoles' secondary. He then moved to San Diego State, where he was an assistant coach in charge of linebackers from 1970-71. After a stint as an assistant coach at Los Amigos (Calif.) High, he spent three seasons (1975-77) at Cerritos College as an assistant coach, where again he was in charge of the linebackers.

A center for two years at San Jose State, Hughes earned a bachelor's degree in physical education, and in 1971 was awarded his master's degree from San Diego State.

As a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College, Hughes earned All-America honors in 1964.

Steve Morton

Offensive Line

Steve Morton's fourth year at Iowa State is his 16th in collegiate coaching and his 13th under head coach Jim Walden. The Chehalis, Wash., native coaches the offensive line — the same position he held at Washington State for five seasons.

Morton directed the Cougar tight ends from 1978-81. He started his collegiate coaching career at WSU in 1975 as an offensive line assistant. He was a defensive line assistant in 1976 and junior varsity and assistant offensive line coach in 1977.

In 1972 and 1973, Morton played at Grays Harbor (Wash.) Junior College, receiving the Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award, while earning all-NWJC honors. He played guard and center at Washington State in 1973-74 before graduating with a bachelor's degree in physical education.

With Morton's offensive line paving the way, Iowa State posted the second-highest total-offense mark in school history in 1989. Among his ISU pupils was Keith Sims, now on the offensive line of the Miami Dolphins.

Robin Ross

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Tackles

Robin Ross is in his fifth season under Jim Walden. Prior to joining the Cyclone staff, he served as the defensive line coach at Washington State for the 1986 season.

Ross moved to Washington State after a two-year stint at Cincinnati. In 1984, he coached the defensive line and was strength and conditioning coordinator for the Bearcats. A year later, he served as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. From 1979-83, Ross coached the defensive line and was the recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State. He started with the 49ers as an assistant offensive line and tight end coach, a position he held during the 1977 and 1978 seasons.

A two-year starter (1974-75) at Washington State, Ross earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention All-America offensive tackle. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1977.

Ross was a first-team all-conference selection at offensive tackle in his second season at Rio Hondo (Calif.) College in 1973. He claimed second-team honors as a freshman.

A 10th-round choice of the San Francisco 49er's, Ross signed as a free agent with the Seattle Seahawks and played the 1976 exhibition season.

Ross is married to the former Jean Kwid.



Mel Sanders

Middle Linebackers

The 1990 season marks Mel Sanders' fourth at Iowa State, and his third coaching the middle linebackers. The Los Angeles native joined head coach Jim Walden's staff at Washington State in 1981, but he has been associated with Walden as a player and coach for the past 14 seasons.

After earning a bachelor's degree in fine arts, Sanders' first coaching assignment was assisting with the Cougars' outside linebackers in 1981. The following year, he tutored the WSU defensive line. Sanders assumed administrative and offensive line coaching duties in 1983 and continued the same duties in his first season at Iowa State. He co-coordinated the Freshman Athletic Scholastic Training (FAST) program at WSU and has been a key figure in the academic assistance programs at Iowa State.

A four-year starter at outside linebacker at Washington State, Sanders earned second-team freshman All-America honors from *Football News* in 1976. His career total of 241 tackles distinguished him as the sixth-leading tackler in WSU history.

Tom Wilson

Strength & Conditioning

Wilson came to Iowa State in May of 1983 from the University of Nebraska, where he was an assistant strength coach under Boyd Epley, who has served as president of the National Strength and Conditioning Association. Wilson is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist, and a consultant to the California Angels.

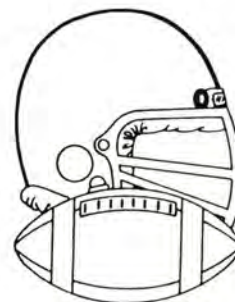

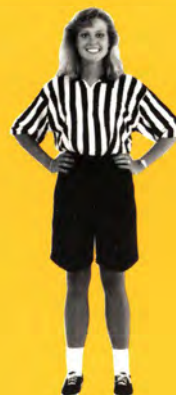
