The students and faculty join me in extending a cordial welcome to all of you who are here for the 1951 Homecoming events. If you have not been on the campus recently you will find many changes, especially in the expansion of the physical plant.

Nearly 7500 students have enrolled at the Iowa State College this fall. They come from every county in Iowa, every state in the Union and from more than 40 foreign countries. Of this number, 2100 are freshmen; one of the largest entering classes of recent years. While the total enrollment of 7500 represents a decrease from the 1950 fall enrollment (8150), the loss at Iowa State College is very small by comparison with the country generally. The decrease is due primarily to the disappearance of the GI student.

The educational program of the College has undergone a number of important changes. The program of resident teaching has been broadened and strengthened and made more flexible. There has been a significant expansion of the research program and the program of graduate education. The extension and adult education activities of the College now reach every part of the State. All these developments are a reflection of the increasing demands of the state and nation on the educational resources of the College.

The feature attraction today is the football game between the Kansas State College and the Iowa State College. The teams are well matched and we believe you will find it an interesting contest.

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'Cats In Fifth Homecoming

For the thirty-ninth time since the series was started, Iowa State will play host to a homecoming football foe. The homecoming series started in 1912 and was interrupted only in 1918 because of the great flu epidemic.

Today Iowa State will be trying to make it an even dozen victories before homecomers while Kansas State, seeking its first win in the series, will be trying to make it double that figure for the visiting teams. Iowa State has won 11, lost 23 and tied 4 before the old grads.

Kansas State has appeared in four previous games of this nature, yielding four victories to the Cyclones. After losing the first five homecoming games the Cyclones earned their first win in 1917 with a 10-7 score over the Wildcats. Other victories over Kansas State at homecoming were in 1919 (46-0), 1927 (12-7) and 1949 (25-21).

A quick look at those scores will reveal the type of game that can be expected here today. Hard fought and close. That 1949 contest was one of the great thrillers in the series. Iowa State scored quickly in the first period to lead, 13-0. Kansas State led at the half, 14-13. Then Iowa State gained two more in the third period to lead 25-14. Led by Hackney, Kansas State fought back to a 25-21 score and was giving the fans fits until Iowa State gained the ball near the end of the game. Hackney that day carried the ball 33 times for more than 170 yards from scrimmage.

Last year at Manhattan the two teams battled to a 13-7 win for Iowa State so the battle plan is all drawn for today—tight, close, and a bitter struggle.

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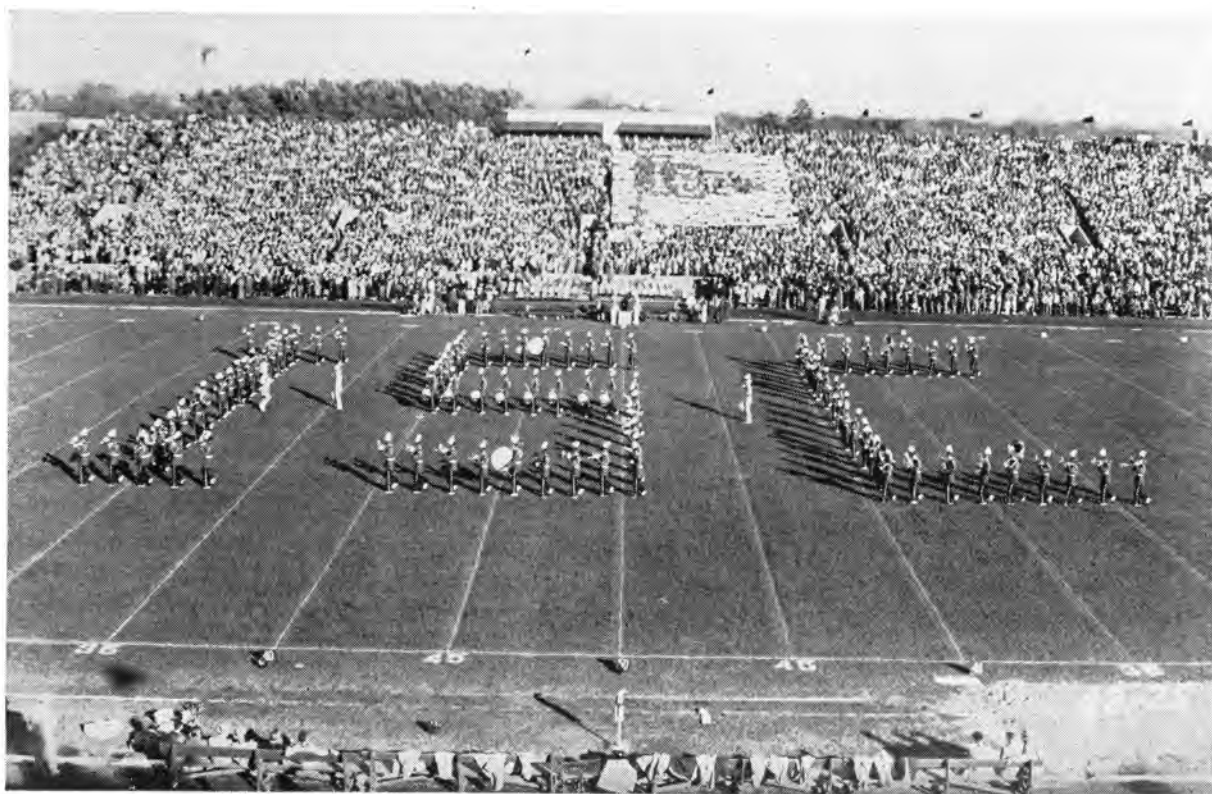
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IOWA STATE MARCHING BAND

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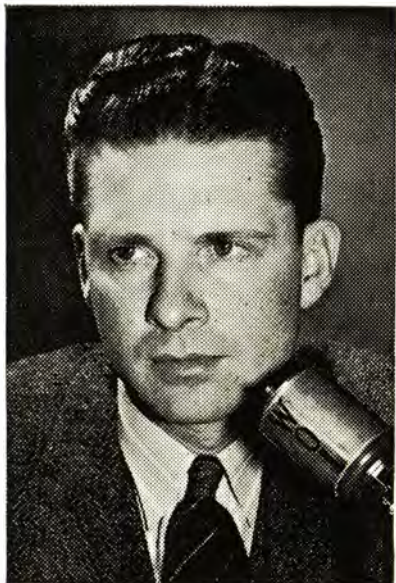

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Cyclones Coach in High School

From the days when Al Waite at Estherville, Ken Wells at Grundy Center and later Ames, Bob Lamson at Webster City and Ray Donels at Ames were just about the only Iowa State graduates in the coaching field the picture has changed to where more than a score of the state's top coaches are former Cyclones.

A slow but steadily increasing flow of high school material is being sent Iowa State way by these men and each year the department of physical education sends more coaches into action. Even during the past year when the armed forces took more than the usual number of men, Iowa State added several names to the coaching roster of the state.

We are going to start hopping around now to start mentioning a number of former Iowa Staters now coaching in this and other states. There is no rhyme nor reason to the order of mention—just that the names popped up at the moment.

First off there's Ken Wells at Ames high school. Last year Ken was named Coach of the Year by the Des Moines Register and Tribune. He won the award not alone for the undefeated season but because of the great moral and spiritual contribution he made to his players. Ken was an eight letter man in football, basketball and track.

At the same school there's Ron Norman who won seven letters in football and basketball. He's the basketball coach.

Over at Boone former Cyclone Larry Owens went back into the Air Force this fall but former Cyclone captain "Butch" Lewis stepped right into his shoes.

At Webster City Harle Rollinger is the athletic director and head football coach, replacing Bob Lamson when the latter returned

to the Iowa State staff. Webb Halbert is due to join the Lynx soon.

In the same conference at Clear Lake there is Vic Weber, head coach, and Bob Erwin, his assistant. Over in the WaMac conference Bill Chauncey and Harold Shugart direct the destinies of Tipton and Monticello. Don (Whitey) Laun is at Nashua. Don Paulsen is on the Oelwein coaching staff in basketball. At Tama Joe Brubaker is the line coach. At Sioux City Central Jim Perkins is assistant. At Ogden the assistant is Wes Ebert.

Up at Ackley Clarence Carney is helping to impart his knowledge of Cyclone football to the youngsters there. Jim Mairs is doing the basketball and baseball chores at Huxley.

John Griffith is coaching at his alma mater in Jefferson City, Mo. Harold Birney is at DeWitt and has Jack Lessin and Dick Mohr on the 1951 Cyclone squad. Ray Klootwyk is the head man of a tough team at Knoxville. Dean Laun is at Spirit Lake. Ray Obermiller, the fine little diver from Clinton, is assistant coach at Kennedy, Mo.

Carl Paetz is an assistant at Muscatine. Rod Rust was at Webster City until he got his army call. Ken Queensland is the basketball and baseball coach at Radcliffe. Wayne Seibold was the Oskaloosa line coach before going into the army. Don Weishaar is the basketball coach at Corpus Christi high in Fort Dodge.

Jim Sutherland is basketball and baseball coach and assistant in football at Denison. The Webb brothers are both coaching—Don at Spencer and Jack at Atlantic. Don Stevenson is the wrestling coach at West Union. Leo Schneider is a three sport coach at Randall, Wash.
