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TODAY'S GAME

ISU, UNI Get Ready to Rumble

The leaves on the trees are still green and summer has not shown any signs of slacking off, but college football returns to Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field this afternoon as Iowa State plays host to Northern Iowa in the Cyclones' season-opener. If the last two meetings between the two schools are an indicator of the type of game that will be contested today, one would be advised to come early, and by all means stay late.

Iowa State head coach Jim Walden was looking for his first Cyclone victory when ISU and UNI met on October 10, 1987 in Ames. That contest was the series' first in 37 years. The Panthers dominated early, and led 38-21 with ten minutes left. What followed is arguably the greatest comeback in Iowa State football history. ISU quarterback Brett Sadek, who completed 15 of 29 passes for 295 yards and three touchdowns, connected with Eddie Bridges on an 11-yard scoring toss that closed the gap to 38-28 with 9:06 left. Late in the final quarter, the Cyclones drove 60 yards in eight plays for a touchdown that made it 38-34. Edwin Jones rushed for a two-point conversion that narrowed the Panther lead to 38-36. The Cyclones then executed an onside "cluster kick" maneuver and ISU's Greg Gloede recovered the ball at the Iowa State 47-yard line. Two plays later, Dennis Ross made a spectacular catch of a Sadek pass for a 39-yard completion. Ross finished the day with eight catches for 174 yards and a touchdown. Ross' reception helped set up the winning field goal, a 28-yarder by ISU's Jeff Shudak with 1:23 remaining. The game featured 980 yards of total offense, including 580 yards of passing. Unfortunately, many fans missed the final minutes, having left the stadium thinking the outcome had already been determined. Walden and the Cyclones had taught the fans a lesson, which they heeded the following fall.

Former Cyclone head coach Earle Bruce was the UNI coach when the Panthers came back to Ames on Oct. 8, 1988. Northern Iowa erased a 13-0 halftime deficit and led 17-13 with 2:32 left in the game. But again, the Cyclones rallied. Quarterback Bret Oberg managed an eight-play, 77-yard drive that included four passes for 57 yards to Ross. The last completion of the winning drive was a 21-yard touchdown pass to Ross with 1:03 left that gave Iowa State a 20-17 victory.

This year, Northern Iowa head coach Terry Allen appears to have a few big plays up his own sleeve. Panther quarterback Jay Johnson, a 6-foot sophomore from Lakeville, Minn., threw for 397 yards, most of that total coming on touchdown passes, as UNI routed Southern Illinois, 30-9, last Saturday in the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls. Johnson threw scoring passes to tight end Chris Nuss for 62 yards, to split end Rich Wellbrock for 71 yards and to fullback Mike Schulte for 56 yards.

Schulte, a junior from Cedar Rapids, led all receivers with three catches for 122 yards. The Panthers outgained Southern Illinois, 525-331, to win their first season-opener since 1987. Senior linebacker Matt Brinkman led UNI with 11 tackles, including six solo stops. Strong safety Duane Petersen had 10 tackles and inside linebacker James Jones had nine for the Panthers. The Northern Iowa defense held Southern Illinois runningback Yonel Jourdain to just 46 yards in 17 carries.

"(Jourdain) is a pretty good runningback for Southern Illinois," said Northern Iowa head coach Terry Allen. "But that's not (ISU runningback) Blaise Bryant and...if we want to break the plays, we'll have to rush the football (against Iowa State)."

Bryant has been the center of national attention this summer as Cyclone fans awaited the 1990 season with an optimism reminiscent of the days of Bruce and Donnie Duncan. The senior runningback keyed ISU fans' anticipation last fall, rushing for a school-record and Big Eight-leading 1,516 yards. The Huntington Beach, Calif., native broke or tied eight school records and is the nation's top returning rusher.

Doing the blocking for Bryant will be an offensive line that compares favorably with last year's unit. That front plowed the way for ISU's record-setting offense that averaged an incredible 427.9 yards per game. Among the men up front this fall is three-year starter Gene Williams, a second-team all-Big Eight selection at guard last season. Also back on offense are experienced wide receivers John Glotfelty and Troy Moore, who combined for 39 catches in 1989. Cyclone quarterback Bret Oberg set several ISU offensive marks and finished his career in 1989 with the highest career completion percentage in Big Eight history. Replacing him is Ankeny junior Chris Pedersen, who saw limited action in eight games last season. A major weapon in the Iowa State arsenal is senior placekicker Jeff Shudak, an all-Big Eight honoree.

When you talk Iowa State defense, the conversation usually begins with cornerback Marcus Robertson. A three-year starter, Robertson was a first-team all-Big Eight selection as a 1989 junior. Three-year letterwinner Jeff Bauer is back after making 62 tackles last season. Sophomore cornerback Andrew Buggs was in on 36 tackles in 1989, and made two interceptions.

The Cyclone defensive line, like the ISU offensive front, must mature quickly this fall. Returning starters Matt Grubb of Indianola and Travis Block of Zwingle have each lettered twice. Junior Matt Rehberg is back at defensive end.

Weak outside linebacker Larry Ratigan is a returning starter and an honorable mention all-Big Eight standout. He made 81 tackles last season and figures to be the cornerstone for ISU's linebacking success this season.

Iowa State will play at Minnesota next weekend in Minneapolis. Game time is set for 1:30 p.m. The Cyclones visit Iowa City on Sept. 22 for an 11 a.m. date against Iowa (the game will be televised statewide). ISU then will return home to play host to Western Michigan in a Parents' Day game that will start at 1 p.m. on Sept. 29.

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THIS IS IOWA STATE

Since the first students enrolled at Iowa State, the institution has been committed to academic excellence. Iowa State's reputation for scholarship is internationally known and Iowa State's students are respected nationwide as serious scholars.

Iowa State University was founded in 1868 under terms of the Land Grant College Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War. Since the beginning, Iowa State has been a co-educational "people's college". As years passed, the University developed a reputation as an outstanding broad-based institution with academic emphasis in the humanities and the arts, while maintaining its position in the scientific and technical fields. Recently, Iowa State has become known as a leading research center, renowned in the fields of engineering and agriculture.

One of the largest institutions governed by the State Board of Regents, Iowa State is a major Midwestern center of learning for more than 25,000 students, from all 50 states and 100 other nations. Iowa State attracts a diverse student body with a wide range of undergraduate and graduate programs, a student to teaching faculty ratio of 12 to 1 and an average class size of 29 students. More than 120 undergraduate programs of study are available from Iowa State's eight colleges: Agriculture, Business Administration, Design, Education, Engineering, Family and Consumer Sciences, Sciences and Humanities and Veterinary Medicine.

The picturesque campus is comfortably situated in a central campus "park" - a splendid combination of conventional and contemporary architecture. ISU's classrooms and buildings are a blend of the old and the new, nestled amid thousands of trees and acres of greenery. The ultra-modern south campus is dominated by the Iowa State Center, Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field, and the

College of Veterinary Medicine.

The Iowa State Center, which boasts one of the nation's finest facilities of its kind, consists of the C.Y. Stephens Auditorium, the J.W. Fisher Theater, the Scheman Continuing Education Center, and the James H.

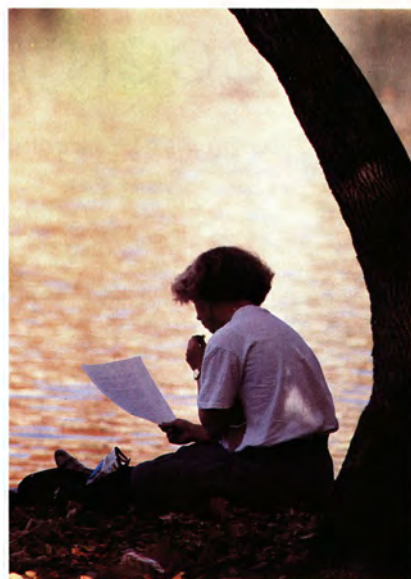
Hilton Coliseum. Concert facilities draw some of the top names in entertainment. Bruce Springsteen, Tina Turner, Bill Cosby, the Rolling Stones, Paul McCartney, and the Broadway hit "Cats" have been featured on campus.

One of the highlights of the year occurs in spring as the campus blooms with tulips and apple blossoms just in time for the Veishea celebration. "Veishea" is ISU's annual open house and the largest student-run festival in the nation, complete with parade, exhibits and thousands of alumni. The campus is also a breathtaking sight in the fall, when autumn colors and leaves make it a cardinal and gold show place.

Sports are a vital part of the life at Iowa State, as the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 21 men's and women's sports and the extensive intramural program boasts one of the highest student participation rates in the country. A number of Cyclone intercollegiate teams have been nationally ranked in recent years and several have brought home national titles. Iowa State has also produced 24 Olympians, three of whom captured gold medals. While athletics remain in the spotlight, the academic side shares equal time.

The opportunities that Iowa State offers stretch beyond the lengths of academics and athletics. There are ample opportunities for students to participate in theater, music, dance and intramural sports, as well as numerous academic and campus organizations. The Greek system is strong, as are the residence halls. Both have been nationally recognized, along with the top-notch academic advising program.

Iowa State University is an institution founded on a commitment to academic challenge, achievement and excellence. Iowa State reaches beyond this by offering its students some of the most advanced athletic, cultural and social opportunities in the Midwest.



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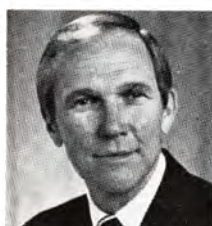
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SU PRESIDENT — GORDON EATON

Gordon P. Eaton, Iowa State's 12th president, came to the position as an acclaimed and well established scholar, administrator and scientist. To this list should be added the further accolades of distinguished researcher, public speaker, author, editor and teacher. Since taking office on July 1, 1986, Eaton has provided leadership that has made an impact on every department and segment of the campus community as Iowa State University continues to improve its facilities, academic programs and student services.

During Eaton's four years at Iowa State, faculty salaries have increased by 46 percent and sponsored funding for research and education has increased from \$51 million to \$113.6 million. In addition, agricultural research funding has increased significantly and the university has developed on-going strategic planning.

Several major national research centers have been created and funded and nine major campus buildings have been constructed. Also, formal agreements with the U.S.S.R. have been developed, a faculty senate was created and a faculty committee, appointed by the president, made recommendations on the status of student-athletes.

Under Eaton, there have been 32 administrative appointments, significantly enhancing the gender, racial and geographic diversity of the ISU administration.

Eaton leaves ISU in October to take the position of director of the Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory of Columbia University.

Eaton was born March 9, 1929, in Dayton, Ohio. He received a B.A. in geology and mathematics "With High Honors and High Distinction" in 1951 from Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn., a Master's in geology in 1953 and a Ph.D. in geology and geophysics in 1957 from the California Institute of Technology.

He served on the faculty of Wesleyan University from 1955 to 1959, and on the University of California, Riverside faculty from 1959 to 1963. He was on academic leave from the University of California from 1963 to 1965 to serve as project chief for the U.S. Geological Survey in Denver, Colo., for geological investigations of bentonite deposits and ground water resources. He returned to the University of California, Riverside, in 1965 as associate professor and chairperson of the department of geological sciences.

From 1967 to 1981 Eaton was with the U.S. Geological Survey, serving in a number of administrative and scientific positions, including: project chief for the Southwestern Geophysics Project, Regional Geophysics Branch, for the study of mineral and ground water resources in Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado; deputy chief of the Office of Geochemistry and Geophysics, Washington, D.C.; project chief for geothermal geophysics, Branch of Theoretical and Applied Geophysics; scientist-in-charge of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory; and associate chief geologist, Geologic Division, at the national headquarters in Reston, Va.

In 1981 he was appointed dean of the College of Geosciences at Texas A & M, which includes the



departments of geology, geophysics, oceanography, meteorology and geography. In 1983 he was named provost and vice president for academic affairs.

An established scholar and scientist in regional geology and geophysical synthesis and interpretation, Eaton is the author or co-author of publications on such subjects as the mineral resources in numerous regions of the Western United States; geophysical observations of Kilauea Volcano, Hawaii; regional gravity and tectonic patterns; ground water investigations and resources; volcanic ash deposits; petroleum potential of the U.S. Atlantic Coastal Plain and mining geophysics in the Soviet Union.

He has taught physical geology, mineralogy, structural geology, petrology and introductory geophysics, all at the undergraduate level, and exploration geophysics, fundamental geology and research courses at the graduate level.

Awards he has received include: Best Paper of the Colorado Scientific Society in 1975 and 1976, U.S. Government Senior Executive Performance Award in 1980 and Wesleyan University Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1981. He was chairman of the Geophysics Division of the Geological Society of America during 1978-79 and has been an invited speaker to universities in seven states and Iceland, and to eight major geoscience association assemblies in this country and abroad. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa honor society, Sigma Xi research honor society, and is a member and fellow of the Geological Society of America. He is also a member of the American Council on Education, the American Association for Higher Education, American Geophysical Union, and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Eaton and his wife Virginia have two grown children.

IOWA STATE HEAD COACH — JIM WALDEN

Nearly four years ago, Iowa State University began the search for a football coach. The Cyclones were looking for a new direction, a new personality and a new attitude for the Iowa State program. ISU found all of those ingredients in Jim Walden, and on December 16, 1986, the former Washington State mentor became Iowa State's 28th head football coach.

The personable native of Aberdeen, Mississippi arrived at ISU with "no magic formulas," just a promise to "come in here and do the best I can and to work as hard as I know how." Walden proved to be a man of his word, bringing greater success both on and off the field to each of his Cyclone squads.

His first ISU team finished 3-8-0 and demonstrated consistent improvement throughout the season. The Cyclone offense gained almost 4,000 yards and the ISU attack featured several trick plays.

His 1988 team improved to 5-6-0 and challenged for a winning season. The team finished fifth in the Big Eight Conference and took a 5-5-0 mark into the final game against Oklahoma State.

The third time proved to be the charm, as Walden's 1989 squad went 6-5-0 for the school's first winning season under his direction, posting ISU's best road record since 1978 with a 4-1 mark. Along the way, the Cyclones set a team record for rushing touchdowns (30), while taking over the No. 2 slot on the season chart for passing yardage (2,297). Both Iowa State's rushing offense and total offense ended the year ranked in the top 25 nationally. Following the regular season, Walden was tabbed as an assistant coach for the East-West Shrine Game.

His 1989 team featured the 1-2 punch of junior running-back Blaise Bryant and senior quarterback Bret Oberg. Bryant led all Big Eight players in rushing, scoring, and all-purpose running, while Oberg led the league in pass completion percentage and total offense, in addition to ranking among the nation's top 10 in passing efficiency. Both athletes set numerous ISU records, while Oberg smashed the Big Eight Conference career passing completion percentage record. Bryant and tight end Mike Busch were selected to All-America teams.

As the head coach at Washington State for nine years, Walden compiled a 44-52-4 record against tough Pacific 10 Conference competition. During that time, Walden guided the team to three winning seasons and four first-division finishes in the conference. He was one of only two WSU coaches to record more than one winning campaign, and ranks second among all-time Cougar coaches for both wins and longevity.

Walden's Washington State teams became known for the upset victory. No opponent took a WSU team lightly, as the Cougars upset Pac-10 Conference powerhouses USC, UCLA and Washington during his years at the school. In fact, Washington State had great success against intra state rival Washington, knocking the Huskies off in three of Walden's last five years in Pullman, Wash.

Offense was another trademark of Walden-coached teams at WSU, and his exciting, wide-open option attack had the Cougar offense ranked at the top of the conference. Washington State won three team rushing titles in Walden's last five years, along with two consecutive total offense titles in 1984 and 1985. The Cougar defense also showed improvement under Walden, rising from the lower echelons of the league to as high as third in 1981.

The 52-year-old Walden was actually at Washington State for 10 years, first serving as an assistant to Warren Powers. When Powers left WSU following the 1977 season, Cougar officials tabbed Walden as his replacement and Walden began building the Washington State program. The culmination of a four-year plan came when Walden took the Cougars to the 1981 Holiday Bowl, WSU's first bowl appearance since the 1931 Rose Bowl. WSU finished the season with an 8-3-1 mark, needing only a win in the regular-season finale to go to the Rose Bowl. In 1983, the Cougars were also within one game, a mid-season loss to UCLA, of winning the Pac-10 title and earning the Rose Bowl berth.

Walden's success did not go unnoticed by his peers. He earned Pac-10 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1981 and 1983. In 1981, he was the UPI West Coast and AFCA/Kodak District IX Coach-of-the-Year. Following the 1981 season, he was asked to be an assistant coach for the West squad in the

Japan Bowl and at the East-West Shrine Game that year. He was the head coach of the victorious West squad in the 1985 East-West Shrine Game, and was an assistant at the 1986 Hula Bowl.

Walden also brought stability to the WSU program. One of the keys to his success at Washington State was continuity on his staff over the years. Prior to the start of the 1986 season, all of his assistant coaches had remained with him for at least five years, and several had been on the job since he became head coach at Washington State in 1977. When he accepted the job at Iowa State, Walden invited all nine of his assistant coaches to join him and seven of them did.

Despite spending 10 years in the Pac-10, Walden came to ISU familiar with Big Eight Conference football. He started his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at Nebraska under his former college coach, Bob Devaney. For the next four seasons, Walden was a defensive coach for the Cornhuskers. During those years Nebraska won two national championships.

From Nebraska, Walden moved to Miami (Fla.) in 1973 as an offensive backfield coach for Pete Elliott, and was later named defensive coordinator under Carl Selmer. Walden

joined Warren Powers' Washington State staff as backfield coach for the 1977 season, and took over the head coaching job in 1978.

As a college quarterback at Wyoming, Walden guided the Cowboys to a pair of Skyline Conference titles. He was named both the conference and team Most Valuable Player in 1959, and played in the 1960 East-West Shrine Game. Following his college career, Walden signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League and played two seasons each with the Lions and Calgary. He coached Amory High School in his native Mississippi for five years before taking his first college job at Nebraska.

An excellent speaker, Walden is in demand for outside engagements. The NCAA has selected him twice as a guest speaker at its annual College Football Preview, in 1983 and 1985. Since coming to ISU, he's become a popular figure with both students and fans in appearances across the state. Since the day he was hired, Jim Walden has proven that he is the "right person" to bring a new direction, new attitude, and new personality to the Iowa State football program.



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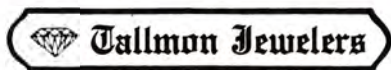
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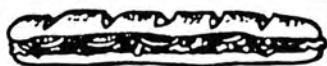
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First Aid Station

Emergency medical treatment is available for spectators in special first aid quarters located under both the east and west stands. Contact the nearest usher to request medical assistance.

Ambulance Service

An ambulance is parked at the first aid quarters on the west side of the stadium.

Pass Out Checks

Persons leaving the stadium will be stamped for re-admission to the stadium. In addition, they must have a ticket stub for re-admission. No pass outs will be allowed between 12:30 and 1 p.m. or ½ hour before kickoff.

Service for Physicians

Doctors anticipating calls during the game are urged to register at the first aid quarters under the west stands, leaving their exact seat location. The management will see that all calls are delivered without delay.

Lost and Found

A lost and found service is maintained in the Athletic Ticket Office in the Olsen Building at the north end of the stadium. Articles found should be turned over to an usher or left at the Athletic Ticket Office.

Public Telephone

Pay telephones are located behind the east and west stands.

Refreshments

Refreshments are served in the stands and at locations around the stadium.

Iowa State Souvenirs

An attractive array of Iowa State souvenirs is available at conveniently located novelty sales booths throughout the stadium and from vendors in the parking areas.

Radios, Stadium Chairs, Umbrellas

As a courtesy to neighboring ticket holders, spectators are asked not to bring radios, stadium chairs, and umbrellas into the stands.

Rest Rooms

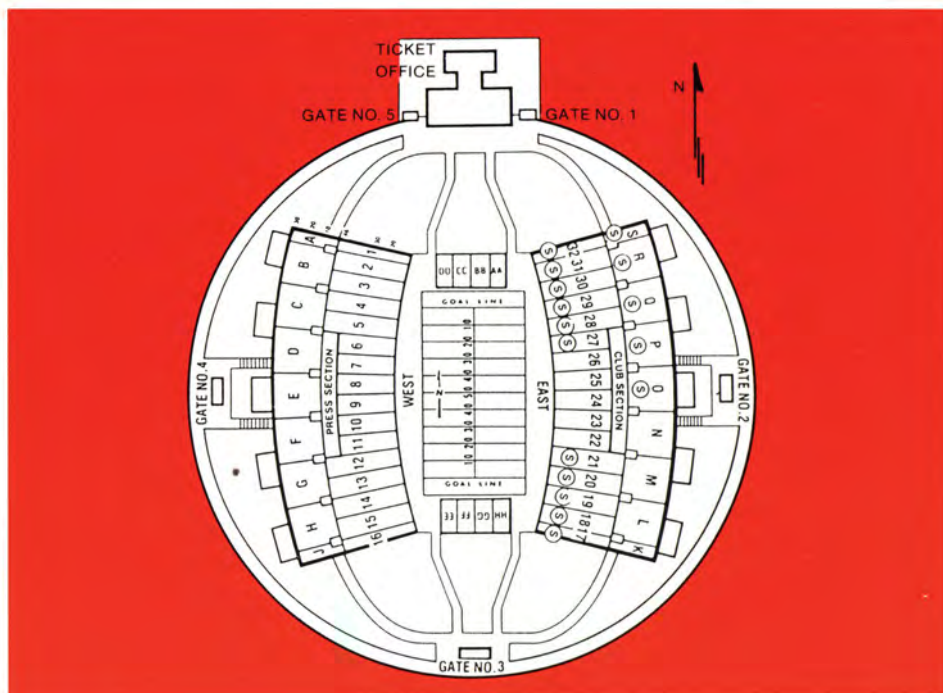
Rest rooms are located throughout the stadium behind each concession stand.

Public Address System

No appeals will be made over the public address system except under exceptional circumstances. The public is asked not to request this service.

Wheelchairs

Special areas in sections 18 and 19 are available for spectators in wheelchairs. In addition, wheelchair seating is available on the field level behind the goal posts.



No coolers of any size will be permitted in the stadium.

Carry-in Packages & Articles

Please do not bring into the stadium any bottles, cans, apples, oranges, toilet tissue, etc. Items thrown onto the field can result in a penalty for the home team.

The State of Iowa code prohibits the use of alcohol in the Stadium. The Athletic Department asks our patrons to behave responsibly and in compliance with the State code.

Parking Lot Facilities

The ISU Athletic Department provides portable toilets for its patrons in the parking lots. These are located in strategic spots throughout the stadium parking area.

Stadium Sign Policy

Iowa State promotes and encourages the display of signs. All signs must be in good taste and supportive of Iowa State University. Signs are to be displayed on the south end of the Olsen Building and on the walls of the stands, both upper and lower decks. In no case may the sign obstruct vision or endanger fans. Signs must be stationary. All signs must be approved by Iowa State's athletic department. For sign approval, see Jim Overturf, Room 137 Olsen Building, before noon on Friday prior to home games. The athletic department

reserves the right to move or remove any signs not meeting these specifications.

Emergency Road Service

Iowa State University and Iowa AAA Motor Club will provide an Emergency Road Service for persons attending home football games. This service will be in effect during and within two hours after the game throughout the season. The phone number for the service is 292-2303. Proof of game attendance (i.e.; ticket stub) may be requested.

Distractions

We want to make football Saturday a totally enjoyable experience and want to encourage you to be respectful of those around you in the stadium. This attitude of cooperation can help to insure a pleasant enthusiastic game atmosphere. In the event you feel there is unreasonable distraction in your seating area, we ask you to take the following steps to help us control undesirable behavior:

- Note the seating section, row and seat number(s), and inform the usher in your section of the disturbance. The usher will observe the conduct and request it to stop, if appropriate.

- If the conduct continues, the usher will get assistance from a uniformed police officer to request improvement of behavior or to remove the fan(s) from the stadium.

- An additional occurrence is cause for removal from the stadium and could be grounds for relocation in next season's ticket assignment.

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ISU Capital Campaign Launched: Dubbed 'Most Important Initiative of Century'

History was written right here at Iowa State University when President Gordon Eaton and national campaign chair Owen Newlin publicly announced and kicked off the largest fund-raising initiative in the university's history, the Partnership for Prominence campaign.

"Partnership for Prominence will prove to be Iowa State's most important initiative during this century," Eaton said. "We now have the opportunity to move Iowa State to a place of prominence in our future."

Volunteers have been planning and plotting for more than two years now to ensure the campaign's success, said ISU graduate Newlin, who is senior vice president and director of Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc., Des Moines.

"We've set out to secure a future of prestige for Iowa State and to make this university the finest land-grant institution in the nation," Newlin said. "Our campaign team well knows that success doesn't come easily. But, after all the hard work we have already put into this campaign, you can be sure we'll hang in there and continue to do our best."

The campaign is off to an impressive start: Iowa State alumni and friends have already, during the campaign's non-public advance phase, committed approximately \$70 million. However, the Partnership for Prominence campaign goal is \$150 million with a deadline of June 30, 1993.

"Thus far, response has most encouraging," Newlin said. "Supporters of Iowa State from all over the nation are showing their support, but we still have a long way to go."

University staff and faculty members have also involved in the pre-campaign planning. The University Community Campaign, which is a vital part of the overall campaign, seeks the wide participation of university faculty and staff members. The campaign is chaired by Virgil Lagomarcino, dean emeritus of the College of Education, who says he is "pleased as can be" these days.

"Advance stage support from Iowa State staff and faculty members has been outstanding," he said. "Support from within the university builds so much momentum. We're off to a great start here. I'm so glad the university people are really behind this important venture."

The "venture" Lagomarcino speaks of, seeks funds to improve the quality of education on campus. Some funds will go toward creating chairs and professorships for faculty, increasing faculty exchange programs and enhancing scholarships and fellowships. Other funds will be used to increase student financial aid, improve and renovate campus facilities and much, much more.

No one has been working harder laying the groundwork for this campaign than Iowa State graduate and Des Moines attorney Steven Zumbach, the national campaign deputy chair.

"The campaign cabinet that chair Newlin recruited includes some of the most talented people I've met," Zumbach said. "I've been able to work with great people, and that's what this campaign is all about. It truly is a partnership—a real team."

Campaign cabinet members were brought together during the initial stages of the campaign to provide leadership and direction.

"Few people realize just how influential and successful many Iowa State grads have been," Zumbach said. "These people volunteer their time because they really believe in the promise of Iowa State's future. They want to make sure Iowa State continues to improve its standing in the academic world."



Zumbach is a case in point. He came to Iowa State with dreams of returning to the family farm. After becoming the national Future Farmers of America president, the president of the ISU Student Body and receiving his undergraduate degree, the academic bug set in: he went on to earn his master's, doctoral and law degrees, as well as to become a certified public accountant.

"The people at Iowa State really helped guide and motivate me. Their support has been invaluable," he said. "This campaign is designed to guarantee the future of Iowa State University—not to provide only immediate and temporary program relief."

Partnership for Prominence funds are designated as follows:

- \$33 million is slated for faculty enrichment (chairs, professorships, visiting faculty and faculty exchange programs, start-up grants for new faculty and innovation in teaching, research and extension grants)
- \$4 million will go toward Parks Library acquisitions
- \$2 million will be used to build the Center for Teaching Excellence
- \$15 million is slated for scholarships and fellowships
- \$16 million will be used to create and enhance academic programs
- \$11 million will be used for the construction of Durham Center and the Recreation/Athletic facility
- \$9.5 million will be used to preserve and modernize Carrie Chapmann Catt Hall, Morrill Hall and the Memorial Union
- \$17.5 million will go toward the purchase and improvement of equipment across campus
- \$15 million will be used for student financial aid
- \$2 million is slated for the improvement of international programs
- \$25 million will be used in the University Fund for Excellence

The Partnership for Prominence campaign is led by hundreds of volunteers throughout the nation. The campaign reaches out to Iowa State alumni and friends around the world for their participation and support.

SCOUTING REPORT



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The Series: Iowa State leads the series 12-1-3. The series was resumed in 1987 after a 37-year hiatus. That game featured one of the greatest comebacks in ISU history as the Cyclones erased a 17-point deficit in the game's final eight minutes en route to a 39-38 win in Ames. One year later, Iowa State prevailed 20-17 as quarterback Bret Oberg hit Dennis Ross with a 21-yard scoring strike with just 1:03 remaining. The Cyclones have won eight straight against Northern Iowa. UNI's only win was a 5-0 decision in 1900.

Last Weekend: Quarterback Jay Johnson completed 12 of 26 passes for 397 yards and three touchdowns as Northern Iowa knocked off Southern Illinois, 30-9, in the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls. Johnson's three touchdown passes, a 62-yarder to tight end Chris Nuss, a 71-yarder to split end Rich Wellbrock and a 56-yarder to fullback Mike Schulte, accounted for most of Northern Iowa's aerial yards. The win marked Northern Iowa's first season-opening victory since 1987. The Panthers had four turnovers but gained 525 yards. Southern Illinois picked up 331 yards, 236 through the air on quarterback Brian Downey's 21-for-38 performance.

Offensively: After missing on his first six pass attempts, Johnson settled down and had a good game. Schulte led the Panthers with three receptions for 122 yards and the touchdown. Nuss finished with three catches for 102 yards and speedster Kenny Shedd made three catches for 70 yards. Northern Iowa gained 128 yards rushing on 36 carries. Junior runningback Charles Lister paced the Panthers with 47 yards on 10 carries.

Defensively: Northern Iowa bent but did not break against the Salukis. Southern Illinois had the ball inside UNI's 20-yard line five times but was unable to score a touchdown. SIU was held to 95 yards rushing on 36 carries. Senior linebacker Matt Brinkman led UNI with 11 tackles. Strong safety Duane Petersen had 10 tackles. Southern Illinois runningback Yonel Jourdain was held to 46 yards on 17 carries.

Kicking: UNI placekicker Brian Mitchell hit on field-goal attempts of 35, 43, and 22 yards last weekend. He was also perfect on all three point-after-touchdown efforts. Mitchell was successful in all 30 extra-point attempts last season and made 14 of 19 field goals with a long of 48 yards. Punter Dan Rush averaged 39.3 yards on three kicks last Saturday.

The Coach: Northern Iowa head coach Terry Allen is in his second season after an initial 8-3 campaign last year. He is in his 16th year of service to Northern Iowa, having played quarterback for the Panthers in the mid-seventies. Over the past 11 seasons, he has gone from being a graduate assistant in 1979 under Stan Sheriff, to a full-time aide under Sheriff, Darrell Mudra and Earle Bruce, to head coach in January 1989.

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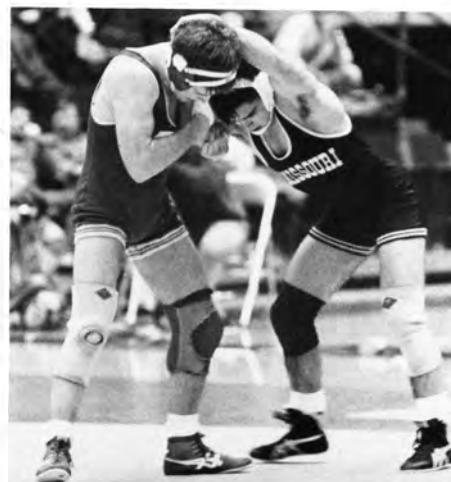
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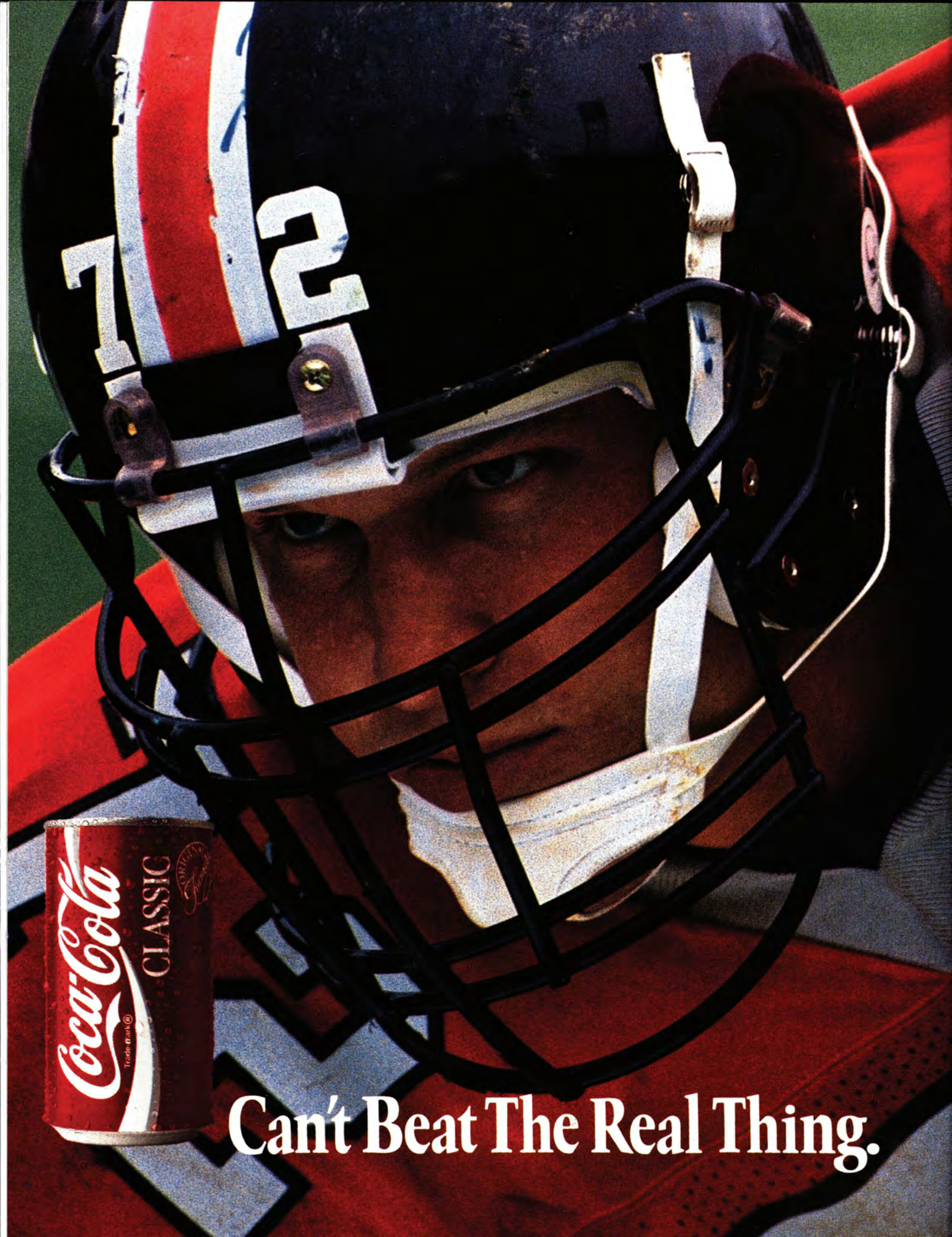

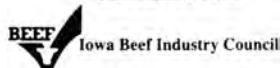

CYCLONE STADIUM/JACK TRICE FIELD



Without a doubt, the most beautiful and convenient football facility in the Big Eight Conference is the 50,000-seat Cyclone Stadium-Jack Trice Field. Located on a 30-acre tract, the stadium is part of the ISU Center on the southeast corner of the Ames campus.

In December of 1983, the Iowa State University football facility was officially named. The name of the stadium itself is Cyclone Stadium, with the field now named for and dedicated to Jack Trice, Iowa State's first black athlete, who died from injuries he received in his first major college football game in October 1923.

The stadium offers an unobstructed view of the playing field, as well as remarkably easy access from all parts of the state. The ISU Center includes the stadium, James H. Hilton Coliseum, C. Y. Stephens Auditorium, J. W. Fisher Theater, and the Carl Scheman Continuing Education Building, while providing lighted parking for 4,000 vehicles.

The stadium was completed in less than two years, from the ground breaking on October 26, 1973, to the first game, a victory over Air Force on September 20, 1975.

In late 1973 and early '74, heavy earth-moving equipment sculpted the embankments. A huge, moveable form shaped the lower decks with thousands of cubic yards of concrete.

Originally, the stadium had a capacity of 42,500, all on the sidelines. In 1976, end-zone bleachers were constructed to bring the capacity to more than 48,000. Standing room tickets, sold for each game, bring the capacity to more than 50,000.

The record crowd was 54,458 for the 1989 Iowa State-Iowa game.

The press box is located between the upper and lower decks. There is seating for 123 sports reporters, as well as eight radio broadcast teams, and three television crews. A

cafeteria serving area and two photographic dark rooms complete the media facility. The press box is structured so that the media representatives can enter using ramps from either end of the stadium, eliminating the need for an elevator. There is also an enclosed camera deck atop the west stands.

Opposite the press box on the east side is a modern club section, with theater seats. Included in the club section is a lounge, as well as rest room facilities.

The stadium contains 16,000 tons of reinforced concrete, 1,000 tons of structural steel, and has a four-inch-thick asphalt base under an All-Pro Turf playing field. The All-Pro Turf, replaced in the summer of 1985, stretches from the edge of the stands on each side and 20 yards beyond each end zone. This allows for maximum practice space.

There are fully electronic scoreboards at each end of the stadium, while the north end area features the ISU Victory Bell, and a statue of Cy the Cardinal.

The Ralph A. Olsen Building is adjacent to the north end of the stadium. The Olsen Building, named in honor of the prominent Ellsworth farmer and alumnus, houses the athletic administration facilities.

Included in the Olsen Building are locker rooms, team meeting rooms, football coaching offices and staff rooms, the sports medicine clinic, Cyclone Club offices, athletic ticket offices and maintenance facilities.

The total cost of the stadium was \$7.6 million. It was paid for through contributions of alumni, friends and businesses to the Iowa State Foundation, as well as through athletic receipts. More than 15,000 contributors have participated in ISU Foundation projects.

Shudak Adds Kick To 1990 Cyclones

For three years now, Iowa State placekicker Jeff Shudak has given the Cyclones a leg to stand on.

But as several thousand fans found out two weeks ago, he not only can kick 'em; he can pick 'em, too.

At this year's Cyclone Football Preview, Shudak accompanied ISU offensive lineman Chris Mussman on guitar, strumming out the Stray Cats' classic *Stray Cat Strut*, and The Who's *Pinball Wizard*.

"I'm a big Bruce Springsteen fan," Shudak said. "I've always wanted to play just like the Boss."

So with the help of his sister's friend, who gave him some song books, and his brother's friend, who gave him an old guitar, Shudak sat down and taught himself to play.

And along the way, he found some similarities with being a placekicker.

"You've got to practice a lot at both to be any good," Shudak said. "It's a continuous process, so you can stay consistent."

Still, it's easier for him, he said, to kick in front of 50,000 fans a week than to play guitar in front of 3,000.

"Kicking is easier by far," he said. "Playing guitar is like giving a speech—I don't do it very often. But football is something I've geared myself to all my life. It's what I'm good at."

That's putting it mildly.

As a redshirt freshman, Shudak received first-team all-Big Eight honors, setting a school record for field goals in a season, hitting on 20-of-25 attempts. He also kicked at least one three-pointer in every game that year, setting the ISU record for most consecutive games with a field goal. He led the team with 77 points scored, and ranked third in the nation among placekickers.

The following year, Shudak was an honorable mention All-America selection, leading the Big Eight Conference for the second consecutive season with an average of 1.09 field goals per game.

But last year, as Iowa State's offense began to surge, Shudak saw his playing time become limited. He finished the year with seven field goals, and was 29-of-30 in extra point attempts. His 50 points scored was second on the team to runningback Blaise Bryant's 120. He again was recognized for his efforts, receiving honorable mention all-Big Eight honors.

Although the role was a difficult one, Shudak admits it can be a good position to be in.

"It can be frustrating—not kicking a lot," he said. "But I like to see the team score. I want to go to a bowl game as bad as everybody else. Sure, I want to get out there. All kickers must want to kick or they shouldn't be kickers."

This year, Shudak hopes to see his wants turn into the team's needs.

"We're so close to being a very good team," the Council Bluffs native said. "I think that there may be a close game or two where I may be needed in the final minutes. I'm preparing for that. I didn't work this summer so I could stay here to work out. I'm ready to give it my best shot."

Shudak's summer regimen included a combination of running stadium steps and running hills backwards four or five days each week to build leg strength. Five times per day he practiced kicking. He started slow, getting in 30-35 kicks per day. By the end of July, he was up to 75 kicks.

"I hope to have a good year," Shudak said. "Most importantly I want to go to a bowl, and then hopefully get a tryout in the pros. If I make it—great; if not, I want to get a good job, because I'm definitely going to graduate."

Just the right attitude for a guy who plays a position often reserved for a "special" breed.

"Hey, he's a bull, boy," Iowa State head coach Jim Walden once said of Shudak. "I just love him. He's all business. He looks at it as a job, and he has a tremendous work ethic."

For Shudak, that work ethic requires a tough mental outlook.

"You've got to be able to handle the pressure," he said. "It's just like they say: If you make it, you're the hero. If you miss it, you're the goat, and they call those guys 'flakes'."

Flakiness has never been a Shudak trait, not even as a second-grade soccer player. It was during his soccer career that he and a friend took to a neighborhood field to kick. By the eighth grade, Shudak thought he was on to something. A year later, he knew it.

"I made a 51-yarder in the ninth grade," he said. "It was then that I figured that this might be able to get me somewhere."

But that "somewhere" was not necessarily putting out the welcome mat. Iowa and Nebraska showed some interest in him, but were looking for him to walk on.

Still, Shudak was not surprised, or discouraged.

"I was very inaccurate in high school," the St. Albert High grad said. "I was only 17-of-38 in my career. I guess the scouts' attraction was in my strong leg. At most big schools, the kickers walk on, and then whoever becomes first string gets the scholarship."

But Iowa State was different. The Cyclones offered Shudak a scholarship, and after a redshirt season, the job was his.

Over the years, his approach to that job has changed, Shudak said, mostly due to maturity, and the continued development of his talent.

"I'm a lot more self-disciplined and confident," he said. "My work habits are a lot better. I do the same things I did four years ago, but they are more detailed and more specific."

And that, in turn, has resulted in a stronger mental game.

"At first, I used to think a lot about it the night before," he said. "I still get nervous, but it's never as bad as I ever think it's going to be. I'm used to it."

However, Shudak does submit to the idea that his job requires a little something different than the roles his teammates play.

"There is more mental pressure than in other positions," he said. "You just can't get into a groove. It's not like practice where you hit 20 field goals. In a game, you get one chance to either make it or miss it."

Shudak has definitely seen his stamina tested over the years. During his previous three seasons with the Cyclones, he has been successful on 10-of-12 field goal attempts from 40-49 yards-out, and four-of-10 from 50 yards or more. His career best, a 55-yarder vs. Northern Iowa in 1988, was the difference in Iowa State's 20-17 victory.

And he wouldn't have it any other way.

"It's got to be something you like to do," he said. "If you want to be in the pros, you have to hit at least 50 percent from outside of 50 yards. Besides, everyone remembers you for kicking a long field goal than for kicking three field goals in a game."

Never short for a challenge, Shudak has his goals for the 1990 season firmly in place.

"I want to go a year without missing a field goal," he said. "I know I can do it."

He'll even give you the perfect setup to keep his goal alive.

"I'd like to be tied with Nebraska with about two seconds left, and kick a 52-yarder to win it."

Yes, Shudak sure can pick 'em.

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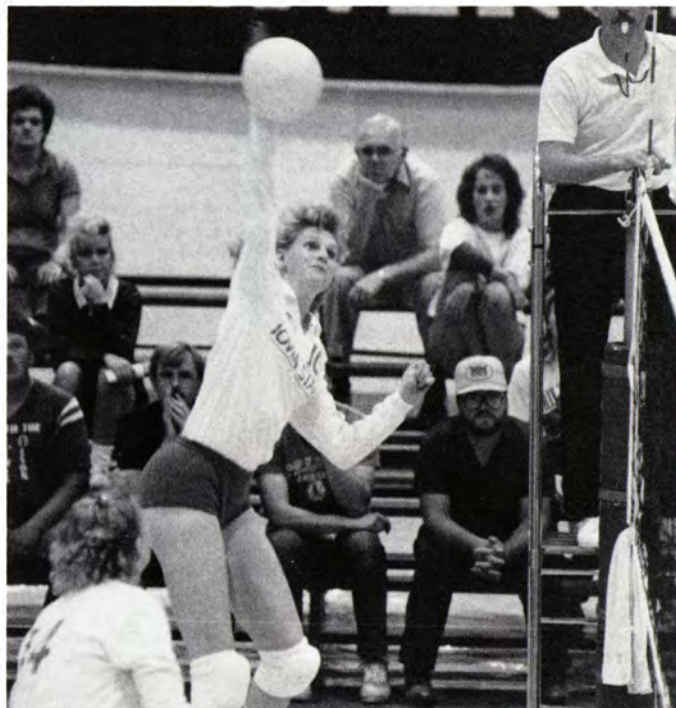

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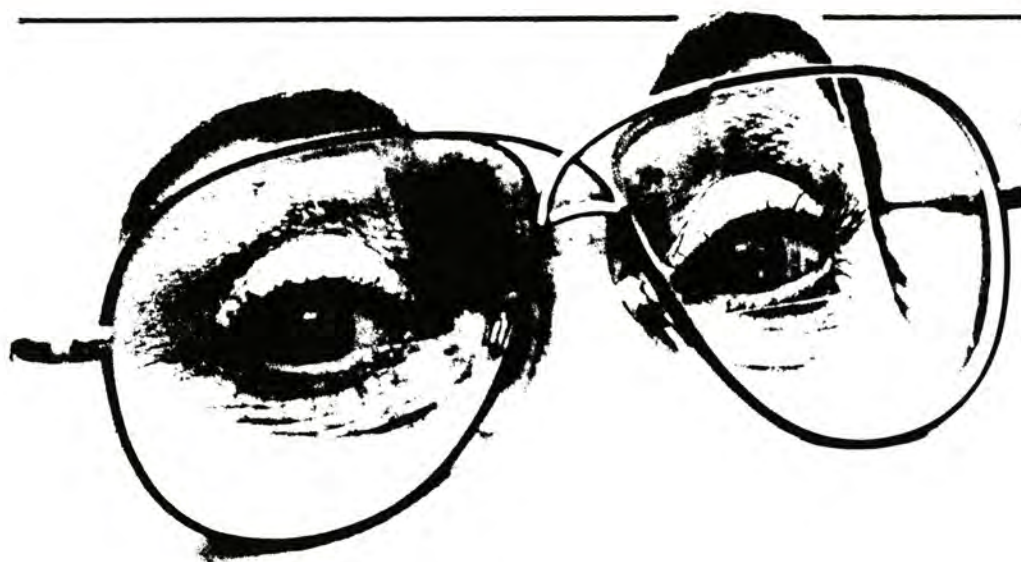


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STRENGTH & CONDITIONING PROGRAM

One of the most integral aspects of any intercollegiate athletic program is a sound strength and conditioning program. Iowa State recognizes this area as a crucial ingredient to the overall success of all 21 men's and women's intercollegiate sports offered at the university. Under the supervision of eight-year strength and conditioning director Tom Wilson and his assistant, Steve Ballenger, Iowa State's student-athletes have made tremendous strides.

The overall goal of Iowa State's program is to keep athletes healthy and prepared for competition by reducing their susceptibility to injury. This is accomplished by a computer-analyzed combination of a strict strength and conditioning program, a good diet and sufficient rest.

"Iowa State offers all athletes proven strength and conditioning programs," said Wilson, who previously served four years in the nationally acclaimed program at the University of Nebraska. "ISU has excellent facilities designed to enhance the athletes' performances and help them realize their maximum potential. We work with everyone from the 'blue-chip' athlete to the unknown walk-on—our program is intended to help everyone. And utilizing such a strictly supervised strength and conditioning program not only produces great physical results, but also increases the athletes' confidence when they become stronger, faster and more disciplined than their opponents."

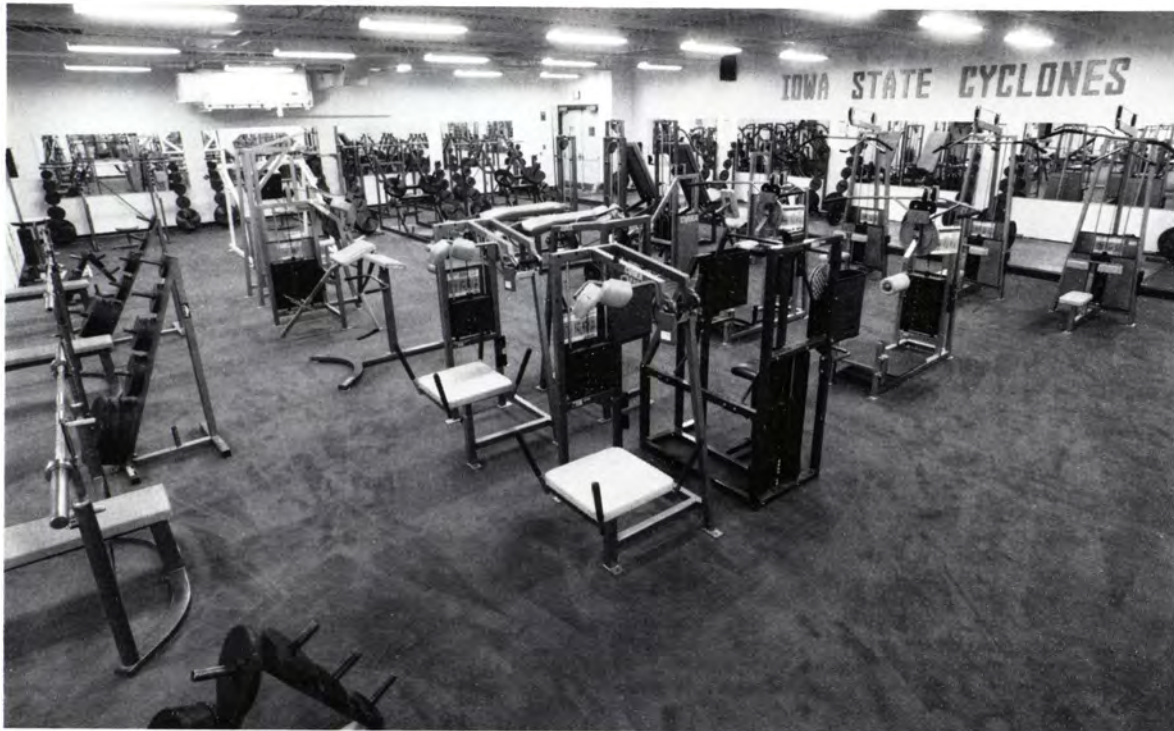
Iowa State's strength and conditioning program is conducted throughout the calendar year. During the summer and winter months, athletes go through

conditioning and strength training four times per week. The four aerobic workouts consist of concentrating on speed drills and plyometrics two days per week, with the other two spent on conditioning and agility drills. Strength training is also very rigid, with the athlete working a minimum of 1½ hours per workout, and alternating three body parts per day.

During the fall season and spring workouts, maintaining strength and the level of conditioning obtained during the winter and summer months is the primary objective. The goal is for athletes to be as strong for the season finale as they were for the season opener. This is accomplished by following a four-day per week workout schedule, with each player lifting and stretching for approximately 20-30 minutes per day.

Prior to the implementation of a strength and conditioning program, every player is evaluated in six areas. Each athlete is tested on upper and lower body strength, flexibility, agility, power, speed (40-yard dash and 10-yard splits), and cardiovascular endurance. The testing results are then entered into the program's computer and analyzed to illustrate strengths and weaknesses. Each athlete meets individually with the strength and conditioning director to evaluate the results and establish appropriate goals.

"Our program is set up to meet the needs of the individual athlete according to the testing evaluation and the athlete's goal," said Wilson. "We also take into consideration the needs and demands of the sport. All training done is very sport specific."

ATHLETIC SPORTS MEDICINE

Men's Athletic Trainer Frank Randall, his assistant Steve Stricker, and Women's Athletic Trainer Alice McLaine direct Iowa State's sports medicine programs. The men's and women's athletic training staffs work closely with each of Iowa State's teams and, along with the team physician, apply the most recent techniques in the field of sports medicine.

The training staffs are headquartered in four locations on the ISU campus - the Olsen Building, James H. Hilton Coliseum, Beyer Hall, and the Physical Education Building. The staffs also work closely with the team physician, Dr. Alan Philippi, and orthopedic surgeons at McFarland Clinic.

The athletic training rooms, equipment room, and weight room comprise the conditioning component of the athletic program. In the training room, athletic trainers deal with the prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. Each trainer must have working knowledge of the other two areas, however, to properly care for athletes.

Prevention includes taping and padding different areas of the body. Each football player gets both ankles taped prior to every workout and game. All players, except wide receivers and defensive backs, also are equipped with lightweight protective knee braces for each practice and game. Randall played an integral part in the development of the knee brace, which is now being marketed nationwide.

Treatment of athletic injuries is another valuable aspect of the sports medicine program. Treatment methods can be as simple as applying a bag of ice to the injured area, or as complex as utilizing electrical muscle stimulation. Each injured athlete receives at least three treatments per day during the season. Most of the treatment units are portable



and give the athletes the advantage of treatment at home or on the road.

Rehabilitation is necessary following an injury or surgery. Along with receiving treatment, the athlete is tested with various flexibility and strength exercises. All athletes are supervised by a member of the training staff from the first day of rehabilitation until it is completed.

ATHLETIC ACADEMIC SERVICES

At Iowa State University, the word "student" comes first in the term "student-athlete" for a very good reason: being a student **must** come first to keep the privilege of competing in intercollegiate athletics. More than 430 student-athletes in 21 team sports budget their time and energy to practice, travel, and compete while enrolled as full-time students. The Athletic Academic Services staff, which includes director Steve McDonnell and counselors Kathy Lyons and Ed Banach, helps ISU student-athletes become the most successful students they can be through an individualized blend of programs.

New Student-Athlete Orientation

An orientation session is held each semester to welcome all new student-athletes to ISU. The athletic academic counselors provide information about university procedures such as registration, fee payment, and residence hall living. They also explain eligibility requirements, academic support services, and athletic department rules. The counselors help the new student-athletes become familiar with the campus layout and generally assist in their transition to college life at ISU.

Student-Athlete Handbook

ISU student-athletes are given a practical handbook full of up-to-date information about NCAA, Big Eight, and university regulations, plus a list of commonly used local phone numbers. The calendar portion of the handbook can be used for reminders of important dates and for time management purposes.

Study Tables

Regularly scheduled study tables are sponsored for all ISU athletic teams, giving student-athletes a consistent time and place for studying and for meeting with tutors. In addition, the athletic academic counselors instruct student-athletes in study skills and time management techniques.

Tutoring Services

Tutors are available for ISU student-athletes to learn more rapidly, to prepare more thoroughly for classes and tests, and to develop more effective study habits. As a result, student-athletes generally experience reduced test anxiety and improved grades.

The Write Place

This service provides tutoring help when student-athletes write papers for any course at ISU. The staff works individually with student-athletes on whatever skills they need to improve, including punctuation, spelling, expression, formatting, and proofreading. The student-athletes become independent writers as they learn writing skills that will transfer to on-the-job situations and improve their course grades.

Educational Programs

The staff of the Athletic Academic Services unit presents instructional programs on study skills, time management, and stress management to groups of student-athletes, especially in study table settings.

Career Exploration

Student-athletes need preparation for their lives after college. The athletic academic counselors, in conjunction with on-campus resource people, help student-athletes identify their interests and aptitudes, explore college degree programs and related careers, and learn how to write resumes and application letters.

Monitoring of Academic Progress

The main duty of the athletic academic counselors is to identify problems early in each semester and assist in resolving them. They maintain frequent contact with the academic advisers in each college to stay informed about student-athletes' academic status and satisfactory progress within their degree programs. The counselors also send out academic progress report forms to instructors so that they can check the student-athletes' class standings, be alerted to possible tutoring needs, and encourage improved performances.



Intervention/Referral

The athletic academic counselors work with the Student Counseling Service and the Dean of Students Office in diagnosing and resolving the problems faced by student-athletes. Such problems might be personal (coping with a parent's illness, for example) or academic (dealing with a learning disability in the college classroom).

Advocacy

The staff of Athletic Academic Services acts on behalf of student-athletes in negotiating the university system. Student-athletes can receive help in dealing with instructors and administrators to achieve better working relationships within the classroom and the university.

Athletic Academic Recognition Dinner

Those student-athletes who have performed well in the classroom are recognized at a special banquet held in their honor every spring. Invited are those who have achieved a grade point average of at least a 3.00 within the previous two semesters, as are those who have significantly improved their academic performances. Also in attendance are university administrators, faculty members, and athletic department personnel.

Graduation Reception

Each spring, the athletic department sponsors a celebration of graduation for student-athletes, their families, and their friends in the company of department members.

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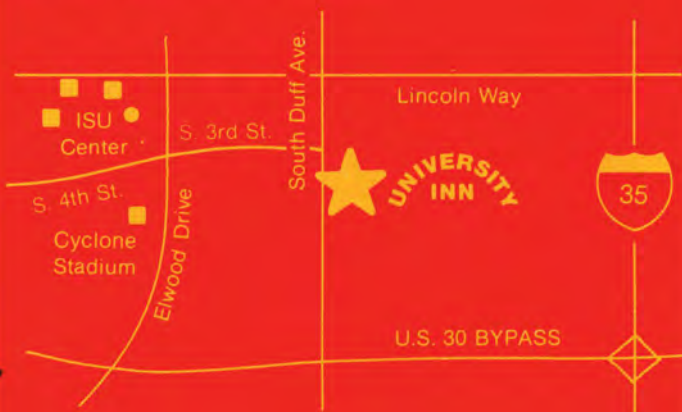

COACHING STAFF

Norm Andersen

Runningbacks

Andersen joined Jim Walden's staff in March of 1987 after nine seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA. For five seasons (1982-86), the former Bruin wide receiver coached and developed some of the nation's top runningbacks at his alma mater, including Gaston Green and Eric Ball. At Iowa State, Andersen guided runningback Joe Henderson to the third spot on the Cyclone career rushing chart, and is now directing All-American Big Eight sensation Blaise Bryant, a pre-season Heisman candidate.

A three-year starter at UCLA (1973-75), Andersen still ranks ninth in career yards per reception, averaging 17.3 yards per catch. He led the Bruins in receiving as a sophomore and a junior, catching 19 passes in 1973 and 27 the following year. An all-Pacific 8 first-team selection in 1974, he was chosen in the 11th round of the 1976 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears.

He is married to the former Heidi Julich, and the couple has a one-year-old daughter, Paris.



Jimmy Burrow

Defensive Backs

Jimmy Burrow came to Iowa State in January of 1987 with head coach Jim Walden, after five seasons at Washington State. He served as the Cougars' tight end coach in 1982, but spent his last four years at WSU coaching the secondary.

Burrow's association with Walden dates back to his high school days in Amory, Miss. Walden was Burrow's coach in ninth and 10th grade football and baseball. Following his prep career, Burrow attended the University of Mississippi for one season, and then transferred to Nebraska, where he was reunited with Walden. As a Cornhusker, Burrow earned second-team all-Big Eight honors his senior season. He was a member of the 1972 Orange Bowl, 1973 Cotton Bowl, 1974 Sugar Bowl and 1975 Fiesta Bowl teams.

An eighth-round pick in the 1976 NFL draft, Burrow played nine games with the Green Bay Packers, and went on to play five years in the Canadian Football League.

He earned his bachelor's degree in education from Nebraska, and his master's in education administration from Washington State.

Jimmy has two children, Jamie (11) and Danny (9).



Tim Bald

Program Coordinator

Tim Bald is in his fifth season as Iowa State's program coordinator, organizing the recruiting and administrative responsibilities in the Cyclone football program.

The Freeport, Ill., native came to the Cyclones from the Washington Redskins of the National Football League. He served as the Redskins' administrative intern in charge of player personnel. From 1981-83, Bald was an assistant coach at Aquin Central Catholic in Freeport.

A 1980 graduate of Loras College, Bald earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He received his master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1985.

Bald is single.



Craig Boller

Defensive Ends

The 1990 season is Craig Boller's fourth as an assistant coach at Iowa State. The Belmont native is no stranger to Ames, however, where he lettered three times as an ISU defensive tackle under Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors (1967-69).

Boller came to Iowa State in January of 1987 after serving seven years as the defensive line coach at Oregon State. He was an assistant coach at Memphis State for two seasons (1978-79) after working one year as a part-time assistant coach at Tennessee.

Boller spent three seasons (1974-76) building the William Penn (Iowa) College football program, leading it to the Iowa Conference title in his final season at the helm. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Knoxville High School from 1971-73.

Dave Elliott

Wide Receivers

The 1990 season marks Dave Elliott's 16th campaign as an assistant coach, and his 12th season as an assistant to Jim Walden. At Washington State, Elliott tutored the inside linebackers from 1979-86. All-Big Eight wide receiver Dennis Ross is among Elliott's former ISU pupils.

The Champaign, Ill., native worked with the defensive backs at Miami (Fla.) in 1975. A year later, he worked with the linebackers at Michigan. During the 1977-78 seasons, he served as defensive backfield coach at Toledo before joining Walden's staff at Washington State.

Elliott was a three-time letterwinner at defensive back for the Michigan Wolverines. He played in the 1972 Rose Bowl and 1975 Hula Bowl, and was invited to play in the 1975 American Bowl.

Jon Fabris

Outside Linebackers

Jon Fabris, who coached the tight ends under Jim Walden at Washington State (1983-86), will again coach the Cyclone outside linebackers and kickoff team, as he has done since his arrival at Iowa State in 1987. In addition, Fabris will also coach the Cyclone punt block and punt return units this season.

A native of Starkville, Miss., Fabris first joined Walden's WSU staff in 1982, when he assisted with the defensive backfield, coached the offensive scout team and scouted the opposition's kicking game.

Fabris coached the junior varsity defensive backfield and



defensive scout team at Georgia Tech in 1980, before working for an oil company in 1981. He ranked third in Southeastern Conference punt returns in 1977 and graduated fifth in career punt returns at Ole Miss. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies in 1980.

Lindsay Hughes

Tight Ends

Cyclone tight end coach Lindsay Hughes marks his 23rd season in the collegiate coaching ranks this year, and his 13th under head coach Jim Walden. As a member of Walden's Washington State staff he tutored the outside linebackers. At Iowa State, Hughes coached NFL draft choice Mike Busch.

Hughes started his coaching career as the freshman coach at San Jose State in 1967. A year later, he served as a graduate assistant in charge of the offensive scout team and assisted with linebackers at Florida State. In 1969, he worked with the Seminoles' secondary. He then moved to San Diego State, where he was an assistant coach in charge of linebackers from 1970-71. After a stint as an assistant coach at Los Amigos (Calif.) High, he spent three seasons (1975-77) at Cerritos College as an assistant coach, where again he was in charge of the linebackers.

A center for two years at San Jose State, Hughes earned a bachelor's degree in physical education, and in 1971 was awarded his master's degree from San Diego State.

As a sophomore at El Camino (Calif.) Junior College, Hughes earned All-America honors in 1964.

Steve Morton

Offensive Line

Steve Morton's fourth year at Iowa State is his 16th in collegiate coaching and his 13th under head coach Jim Walden. The Chehalis, Wash., native coaches the offensive line — the same position he held at Washington State for five seasons.

Morton directed the Cougar tight ends from 1978-81. He started his collegiate coaching career at WSU in 1975 as an offensive line assistant. He was a defensive line assistant in 1976 and junior varsity and assistant offensive line coach in 1977.

In 1972 and 1973, Morton played at Grays Harbor (Wash.) Junior College, receiving the Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award, while earning all-NWJC honors. He played guard and center at Washington State in 1973-74 before graduating with a bachelor's degree in physical education.

With Morton's offensive line paving the way, Iowa State posted the second-highest total-offense mark in school history in 1989. Among his ISU pupils was Keith Sims, now on the offensive line of the Miami Dolphins.

Robin Ross

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Tackles

Robin Ross is in his fifth season under Jim Walden. Prior to joining the Cyclone staff, he served as the defensive line coach at Washington State for the 1986 season.

Ross moved to Washington State after a two-year stint at Cincinnati. In 1984, he coached the defensive line and was strength and conditioning coordinator for the Bearcats. A year later, he served as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. From 1979-83, Ross coached the defensive line and was the recruiting coordinator at Long Beach State. He started with the 49ers as an assistant offensive line and tight end coach, a position he held during the 1977 and 1978 seasons.

A two-year starter (1974-75) at Washington State, Ross earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention All-America offensive tackle. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1977.

Ross was a first-team all-conference selection at offensive tackle in his second season at Rio Hondo (Calif.) College in 1973. He claimed second-team honors as a freshman.

A 10th-round choice of the San Francisco 49er's, Ross signed as a free agent with the Seattle Seahawks and played the 1976 exhibition season.

Ross is married to the former Jean Kwid.



Mel Sanders

Middle Linebackers

The 1990 season marks Mel Sanders' fourth at Iowa State, and his third coaching the middle linebackers. The Los Angeles native joined head coach Jim Walden's staff at Washington State in 1981, but he has been associated with Walden as a player and coach for the past 14 seasons.

After earning a bachelor's degree in fine arts, Sanders' first coaching assignment was assisting with the Cougars' outside linebackers in 1981. The following year, he tutored the WSU defensive line. Sanders assumed administrative and offensive line coaching duties in 1983 and continued the same duties in his first season at Iowa State. He co-coordinated the Freshman Athletic Scholastic Training (FAST) program at WSU and has been a key figure in the academic assistance programs at Iowa State.

A four-year starter at outside linebacker at Washington State, Sanders earned second-team freshman All-America honors from *Football News* in 1976. His career total of 241 tackles distinguished him as the sixth-leading tackler in WSU history.

Sanders is single.



Tom Wilson

Strength & Conditioning

Wilson came to Iowa State in May of 1983 from the University of Nebraska, where he was an assistant strength coach under Boyd Epley, who has served as president of the National Strength and Conditioning Association. Wilson is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist, and a consultant to the California Angels.

The Fall City, Neb. native assisted in the Huskers' strength and conditioning program as a student while earning a bachelor's degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

Wilson was a two-time all-conference runningback at Fall City High, where he was named Athlete of the Year in 1978.

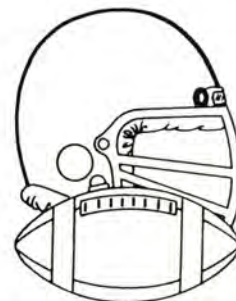

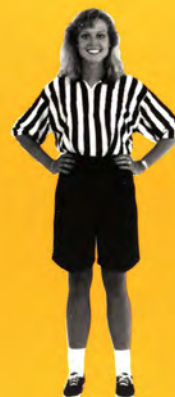
