GREGORY L. GEOFFROY

IN BECOMING IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY'S FOURTEENTH PRESIDENT on July 1, 2001, Gregory L. Geoffroy brought more than twenty-five years of experience as a teacher, researcher and administrator at two of the nation's leading land-grant institutions to Iowa State's ambitious quest to become the nation's best land-grant university

Dr. Geoffroy received a B.S. with honors in chemistry from the University of Louisville in 1968 and then earned a Ph.D. in chemistry from the California Institute of Technology in 1974. He began his academic career in 1974 at The Pennsylvania State University as an assistant professor, advancing to associate professor in 1978 and professor in 1982. In 1988 he was named head of Penn State's Department of Chemistry, and the next year he was appointed dean of Penn State's Eberly College of Science.

As provost and senior vice president for academic affairs at the University of Maryland, College Park, for four years beginning in 1997, Geoffroy was responsible for the academic development of this campus of 32,800 students and 11,300 faculty and staff, with budgetary responsibility for all academic and related programs. In addition, during 1998, Geoffroy served as interim president of the university, providing additional leadership in overall campus development, fundraising, and government and other external relations.



The second of Iowa State's fourteen presidents to come from a chemistry background, Geoffroy is a nationally acclaimed researcher in organometallic chemistry. He has published more than two hundred research articles in refereed journals; presented more than two hundred invited lectures; co-authored the book *Organometallic Photochemistry*; and directed the work of nearly sixty M.S., Ph.D. and post-doctoral students.

Geoffroy's teaching and research have earned him fellowships from the Alfred P. Sloan and John Simon Guggenheim Foundations, visiting professorships to major universities in Germany and France, the Dreyfus Foundation Teacher-Scholar Award, and, in 1991, election as a Fellow in the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He has served in various leadership capacities in the Association for Universities for Research in Astronomy, and in the American Chemical Society's Division of Inorganic Chemistry.

CEREMONIAL PROGRAM NOTES

GRAHAM B. SPANIER

An Iowa State University alumnus, Graham Spanier is a national leader in higher education. Currently the president of The Pennsylvania State University, he has been the chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, provost and vice president for academic affairs at Oregon State University and vice provost for undergraduate studies at the State University of New York at Stony Brook. Spanier chaired the Kellogg Commission on the Future of State and Land-Grant Universities and is chair of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges Council of Presidents and chair of the NCAA Division I Board of Directors. He graduated from Iowa State University with bachelor's and master's degrees in sociology. The friendship between Graham Spanier and Gregory Geoffroy began when both were faculty on the campus of Penn State, and deepened during the years they worked together at Penn State as administrators.

SIMON ESTES

In the opera world, the name Simon Estes is synonymous with success. He has performed with every major international opera company as well as performing as a recitalist and orchestral bass-baritone. Currently an adjunct professor and distinguished artist-in-residence at Iowa State University, Estes was born in Centerville, Iowa, is a graduate of The University of Iowa and has taught at The Julliard School. As an involved citizen and leader, he is promoting peace through international and intercultural understanding and respect. He has established numerous scholarship organizations to ease the financial burden for students, and in 1993 created the Simon Estes International Foundation for Children to provide financial assistance to underprivileged children around the world. In 1997, Iowa State honored his professional and humanitarian efforts by conferring upon him an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

CEREMONIAL PROGRAM NOTES

JONATHAN A. SAGGAU

Recognized for his superior creative talent at such a young age, Jonathan Saggau has a bright future as a composer. A native of Ankeny, Iowa, and a 2001 graduate of Iowa State University with a bachelor's degree in music, he was named one of nine winners in the prestigious 2001 BMI Student Composer Awards competition this past spring. More than 450 manuscripts were submitted by student composers aged 15 to 26 from around the world. Saggau is currently enrolled in Boston's New England Conservatory of Music where he is studying for his M.M. degree in composition.

ISU WIND ENSEMBLE

The ISU Wind Ensemble features sixty of the finest student wind and percussion players on campus. Its repertory includes challenging music from the sixteenth to the twentieth centuries, from small chamber groups to the full ensemble. The ensemble has commissioned and premiered numerous works. In addition to tours and numerous on-campus performances, the ensemble has performed repeatedly at the Iowa Bandmasters Association convention and the College Band Directors National Association North Central convention.

IOWA STATE SINGERS

The Iowa State Singers is Iowa State's most select student choral ensemble and is made up of our finest singing musicians. Music of all styles is performed with an emphasis on the great *a cappella* works. Performances include numerous on-campus performances such as the Holiday Choral Concert and the Masterworks Concert with orchestra. The singers also stage a full-scale Madrigal Dinner and tour each year.

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I O W A S T A T E U N I V E R S I T Y ' S H E R I T A G E

FROM THE TIME IT OPENED IN 1868 as the Iowa Agricultural College and Model Farm, Iowa State University of Science and Technology has been a leader in the development of a new kind of higher education institution in the United States—the land-grant university.

Born of the soil and rooted in the fields of agriculture and engineering, these institutions were created to extend the opportunities of higher education to people of the working classes. Today, the land-grant institutions are still the “people’s colleges,” whose programs address the issues and problems affecting the people of the states they serve.

Land-grant institutions further revolutionized higher education in this country by introducing the concept of direct service to the people. Today, the land-grant institutions have a three-part mission: teaching, research and service. And it was at Iowa State University where the programs were conceived and molded to carry out this new service mission.

The Iowa Agricultural College was chartered by the Iowa General Assembly in 1858, but it would not open for another ten years. In 1862, Iowa became the first state in the nation to formally adopt the Morrill Act that established the land-grant colleges and universities. In 1864, the yet-to-be-opened Iowa Agricultural College was designated as Iowa’s land-grant institution.

Iowa State University embodied then and embodies today the land-grant concept of higher education. As early as 1870, Iowa State faculty and staff were involved in extending the benefits of the institution’s research to the people of the state through Farmers’ Institutes. These were the forerunners of the modern Cooperative Extension Service. Iowa State faculty and staff also wrote and worked for the passage of legislation that established the nationwide Agricultural Experiment Station system.

Likewise, Iowa State University has been a pioneer in the development of academic and research programs to serve the land-grant mission. Iowa State was the first public institution to establish a school of veterinary medicine. It was the first institution to offer college courses in home economics, forestry, agricultural studies, and teacher education. It was at Iowa State where the electronic digital computer (described as the

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most important technological development of the twentieth century) was invented, and where the corn hybrids responsible for nearly half of all varieties grown in this country were developed.

Today, Iowa State University has little resemblance to the small agricultural college that emerged from the Iowa prairie.

Its more than 170 major buildings spread across 1,770 acres form one of the most beautiful campuses in the nation. Inside these buildings are people who are just as dedicated to the land-grant mission as were the academic pioneers of the nineteenth century. And behind the scenes is an electronic communications and computer network that makes Iowa State University one of the most technologically advanced institutions in the nation.

The modern Iowa State University is dedicated to revitalizing the land-grant mission. With the same spirit of innovation that led to the development of the Cooperative Extension Service and the Agricultural Experiment Station system Iowa State faculty and staff are developing research and technology transfer programs that will serve Iowa and the nation well into the future.

Iowa State University is taking a leading role in such critical areas as plant sciences, agricultural biotechnology, information sciences, materials science, agricultural production and product development, food and nutrition sciences, protection of the environment, and many other areas. At the same time, it is an institution with sensitivity for the need to provide a well-rounded and broad-based academic program for all its students.

Iowa State's programs are designed to prepare graduates for leadership roles in an increasingly global community, with emphases on effective communications skills and knowledge of other nations' peoples and cultures.

More than ever, Iowa State University is a university with its roots planted firmly in the rich Iowa soil and its eyes focused clearly on the future. Its aspiration is to be the nation's premier land-grant university.

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
