Re: Carrie Chapman Catt Hall

President Jischke has asked the Diversity Steering Committee to ^{sponsor} support a series of meetings in the Summer and Fall 1996 semesters to study the proposal which has been made by graduate student, Uche Nnadi, to address campus community concerns regarding the naming of Carrie Chapman Catt Hall. The proposal is that a permanent plaque be mounted in a prominent place in Catt Hall with a quotation from an African-American suffrage activist such as Ida B. Wells and the following text:

Iowa State University recognizes that many prominent leaders of the women's suffrage movement, including Carrie Chapman Catt, used country of origin, class, ethnicity, race and religion to exploit ignorance in their quest to ratify the woman's right to vote. This is a painful fact of history.

Political strategies that manipulate our fears continue today. For Tomorrow, let us dedicate ourselves to combat the political rhetoric that manipulates us through our fears of those different from ourselves.
