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It is now after 8 O'clock
P.M. I did not get supper until after candle
light, & then we sat quite a long time at
the table (after we ^{had} done eating) talking, so
before I got the dishes washed it was about 8.
It has been a cold rainy day, & this evening
we are getting a few snow squalls from the
N.W. which you know are not very warm.

the season. Yesterday was a warm day although

forenoon & staid until about 4 O'clock P.M.

She has a very bad cough & is quite hoarse.
